The City's current water treatment chemical contract has expired. Bids went out in May for these supplies. Three bids were received and the City Clerk opened them on 05/22/20. Brenntag Mid South was the low bidder at \$15,306.50. The City has been purchasing water treatment chemicals from Brenntag Mid South for several years with good results.

The attached contract is for one year with two optional renewal years. The contract allows the vendor to raise their prices by no more than 3% for each of the two optional renewal years, so staff is asking for a not to exceed amount of \$18,000 per year for the life of the contract.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF OSAGE BEACH, MISSOURI, AMENDING THE MEMBERSHIP OF THE CITIZENS ADVISORY COMMITTEE BY REPEALING AND REPLACING SECTIONS 111.030, 111.040, 111.050 OF THE MUNICIPAL CODE DEALING WITH THE MEMBERSHIP OF THE CITIZENS ADVISORY COMMITTEE.

WHEREAS, the Board of Aldermen desires to make efficient and direct use of the Citizens advisory committee and to improve its operation and effectiveness in advising the Board concerning issues of importance to the future of the city, and;

WHEREAS, the Board of Aldermen conclude that the changes set forth below will increased the effectiveness of the Citizens advisory committee:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE CITY OF OSAGE BEACH, MISSOURI AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1.</u> That Sections 111.030, 111.040, 111.050 of the Osage Beach Code of Ordinances be and are hereby repealed.

Section 2. That a new Section 111.030 of the Osage Beach Code of Ordinances be and is hereby enacted with new material set out in red and deleted material struck through to read as follows:

Section 111.030 Membership.

- A. The membership of the Osage Beach Citizen Advisory Committee shall consist of not less than nine (9) and not more than fifteen (15) members appointed pursuant to Section **111.040**. There shall be a minimum of three (3) members from each ward.
- B. Each member shall be a resident of the City of Osage Beach at the time of their appointment and maintain that residency during their service on the committee

<u>Section 3.</u> That a new Section 111.040 of the Osage Beach Code of Ordinances be and is hereby enacted with new material set out in red and deleted material struck through to read as follows:

Section 111.040 Terms and Appointments.

- A. Members shall serve a term of three (3) years. Membership shall be divided into three (3) classes of equal size. Terms shall expire June first (1st). All members currently serving on the Osage Beach Citizen Advisory Committee as of July 1, 2011 shall continue to serve until their terms expire. The Board of Aldermen shall specify the term expiration date at the time a member is appointed. The Mayor or a member of the Board of Aldermen may submit nominations for expired terms to the City Clerk by June first (1st) for appointments as aforesaid in this Chapter. The Board of Aldermen shall approve nominees for three (3) year terms on the Advisory Committee at their first (1st) meeting in June each year, or as soon thereafter as possible.
- B. Whenever a vacancy in membership occurs, the City Clerk shall notify the Board of Aldermen of said vacant position and said vacancy may be filled for the unexpired

term by appointment. The Board of Aldermen may remove any member by majority vote.

C. When there are more individual nominations than open positions on the Citizens Advisory Committee, the Board of Aldermen shall vote by paper ballot, in the following manner; each member of the Board shall cast one vote for one person for each open position. The City Clerk shall read the results of the ballots aloud as the votes are tabulated. A nominee must receive a majority of the votes to be selected to serve. If additional rounds of balloting are necessary to fill the available vacancies, the individual with the fewest votes on the most recent round of balloting shall be removed from consideration.

<u>Section 4.</u> That a new Section 111.050 of the Osage Beach Code of Ordinances be and is hereby enacted with new material set out in red and deleted material struck through to read as follows:

Section 111.050 Conduct of Meetings.

- **A.** The committee will be guided by Robert's Rules of Order, 10th Edition, as revised, and the Missouri Open Meetings and Records Law, as amended.
- **B.** Meetings may be called by the Mayor, a majority of the Board of Aldermen or the City Administrator.
- **C.** The agenda for meetings shall be established by the Mayor, a majority of the Board of Aldermen or the City Administrator.
- **D.** Six (6) of the members appointed to the Osage Beach Citizen Advisory Committee shall constitute a quorum. unless the number of active members is less than ten (10) members in which case a majority of the members shall constitute a quorum.
 - **E.** The City Administrator may assign staff members to attend meetings.
- **F.** Meetings of the Osage Beach Citizen Advisory Committee shall be noticed and conducted in accordance with Chapter 610, RSMo.

Section 5. Severability

The chapters, sections, paragraphs, sentences, clauses and phrases of this ordinance are severable, and if any phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph or section of this ordinance shall be declared unconstitutional or otherwise invalid by the valid judgment or degree of any Court of any competent jurisdiction, such unconstitutionality or invalidity shall not affect any of the remaining phrases, clauses, sentences, paragraphs, or sections of this ordinance since the same would have been enacted by the Board of Aldermen without the incorporation in this ordinance of any such unconstitutional or invalid phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph or section.

Section 6. Repeal of Ordinances not to affect liabilities, etc.

Whenever any part of this ordinance shall be repealed or modified, either expressly or by implication, by a subsequent ordinance, that part of the ordinance thus repealed or modified shall continue in force until the subsequent ordinance repealing or modifying the ordinance shall go

into effect unless therein otherwise expressly provided; but no suit, prosecution, proceeding, right, fine or penalty instituted, created, given, secured or accrued under this ordinance previous to its repeal shall not be affected, released or discharged but may be prosecuted, enjoined and recovered as fully as if this ordinance or provisions had continued in force, unless it shall be therein otherwise expressly provided.

<u>Section 7.</u> That this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after the date of passage and approval of the Mayor.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF OSAGE BEACH, MISSOURI, ESTABLISHING A PROCEDURE TO DISCLOSE POTENTIAL CONFLICTS OF INTEREST AND SUBSTANTIAL INTERESTS FOR CERTAIN MUNICIPAL OFFICIALS.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE CITY OF OSAGE BEACH, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Declaration of Policy. The proper operation of municipal government requires that public officials and employees be independent, impartial and responsible to the people; that government decisions and policies be made in the proper channels of the governmental structure; that public office not be used for personal gain; and that the public have confidence in the integrity of its government. In recognition of these goals, there is hereby established a procedure for disclosure by certain officials and employees of private financial or other interests in matters affecting the City.

Section 2. Conflicts of Interest.

- a. All elected and appointed officials as well as employees of a political subdivision must comply with Section 105.454 of the Missouri Revised Statutes on conflicts of interest as well as any other state law governing official conduct.
- b. Any member of the governing body of a political subdivision who has a "substantial or private interest" in any measure, bill, order or ordinance proposed or pending before such governing body must disclose that interest to the city clerk of such body and such disclosure shall be recorded in the appropriate journal of the governing body. Substantial or private interest is defined as ownership by the individual, his spouse, or his dependent children whether singularly or collectively, directly or indirectly of: (1) 10% or more of any business entity; or (2) an interest having a value of \$10,000 or more; or (3) the receipt of a salary, gratuity, or other compensation or renumeration of \$5,000 or more, per year from any individual, partnership, organization, or association within any calendar year.
- <u>Section 3.</u> <u>Disclosure Reports.</u> Each elected official, candidate for elective office, the chief administrative officer, the chief purchasing officer and the full-time general counsel shall disclose the following information by May 1, or the appropriate deadline as referenced in Section 105.487, RSMo. if any such transactions occurred during the previous calendar year:
- a. For such person, and all persons within the first degree of consanguinity or affinity of such person, the date and the identities of the parties to each transaction with a total value in excess of five hundred dollars, if any, that such person had with the political subdivision, other than compensation received as an employee or payment of any tax, fee or penalty due to the political subdivision, and other than transfers for no consideration to the political subdivision; and
- b. The date and the identities of the parties to each transaction known to the person with a total value in excess of five hundred dollars, if any, that any business entity in which such person had a substantial interest, had with the political subdivision, other than payment of any tax, fee or penalty due to the political subdivision or transactions involving payment for providing utility service to the political subdivision, and other than transfers for no consideration to the political subdivision.
- c. The chief administrative officer, the chief purchasing officer, and candidates for either of these positions also shall disclose by May 1, or the appropriate deadline as referenced in Section 105.487, RSMo, the following information for the previous calendar year:

- 1. The name and address of each of the employers of such person from whom income of one thousand dollars or more was received during the year covered by the statement;
- 2. The name and address of each sole proprietorship that he owned; the name, address and the general nature of the business conducted of each general partnership and joint venture in which he was a partner or participant; the name and address of each partner or coparticipant for each partnership or joint venture with the Secretary of State; the name, address and general nature of the business conducted of any closely held corporation or limited partnership in which the person owned ten percent or more of any class of the outstanding stock or limited partnership units; and the name of any publicly traded corporation or limited partnership that is listed on a regulated stock exchange or automated quotation system in which the person owned two percent or more of any class of outstanding stock, limited partnership units or other equity interests;
- 3. The name and address of each corporation for which such person served in the capacity of a director, officer or receiver.

Section 4. Filing of Reports.

- a. The financial interest statements shall be filed at the following times, but no person is required to file more than one financial interest statement in any calendar year:
 - 1. Every person required to file a financial interest statement shall file the statement annually not later than May 1 and the statement shall cover the calendar year ending the immediately preceding December 31; provided that any member of the Board of Aldermen may supplement the financial interest statement to report additional interests acquired after December 31 of the covered year until the date of filing of the financial interest statement.
 - 2. Each person appointed to office shall file the statement within thirty days of such appointment or employment covering the calendar year ending the previous December 31.
 - 3. Every candidate required to file a personal financial disclosure statement shall file no later than fourteen days after the close of filing at which the candidate seeks nomination or election or nomination by caucus. The time period of this statement shall cover the twelve months prior to the closing date of filing for candidacy.
- b. Financial disclosure reports giving the financial information required in Section 3 shall be filed with the city clerk and with the Missouri Ethics Commission. The reports shall be available for public inspection and copying during normal business hours.
- <u>Section 5</u>. <u>Filing of Ordinance</u>. The city clerk shall send a certified copy of this ordinance, adopted prior to September 15th, to the Missouri Ethics Commission within ten days of its adoption.
- <u>Section 6</u>. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after the date of its passage and approval and shall remain in effect for two years from the date of passage.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF OSAGE BEACH, MISSOURI REGULATING THE OPERATION OF GOLF CARTS AND OTHER UTILITY VEHICLES ON THE CITY STREETS BY CREATING CHAPTER 390 OF THE OF MUNICIPAL CODE PROVIDING FOR THE CONTROL THEREOF AND PROVIDING FOR A PENALTY FOR THE FAILURE TO COMPLY WITH THIS ORDINANCE.

WHEREAS, the Board of Aldermen have received inquiries concerning the operation of Golf Carts and other utility vehicles upon city streets; and,

WHEREAS, the Board of Aldermen conclude that the operation of golf carts and other utility vehicles upon some city streets is reasonable, can enhance our citizens and visitors' experiences while in the city and can be accomplished safely:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE CITY OF OSAGE BEACH, MISSOURI AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1.</u> That a new Chapter 390 titled Golf Carts and Utility Vehicles of the Osage Beach Code of Ordinances be and is hereby enacted as follows:

Chapter 390 Golf Carts and Utility Vehicles

Section 390.010: Definitions –

A. "Golf Cart" means a motor vehicle that is designed and manufactured for operation on a golf course for sporting or recreational purposes and that is not capable of exceeding speeds of twenty miles per hour. 304.034 RSMo.

Golf carts operated on city streets shall conform to the safety standards outlined in 49 C.F.R. 571.500 including:

- i. Headlamps,
- ii. Front and rear turn signal lamps,
- iii. Taillamps,
- iv. Stop lamps,
- v. Reflex reflectors: one red on each side as far to the rear as practicable, and one red on the rear,
- vi. An exterior mirror mounted on the driver's side of the vehicle and either an exterior mirror mounted on the passenger's side of the vehicle or an interior mirror.
- vii. A parking brake,
- viii. A horn or alert sound mechanism.

B. "Utility Vehicle" shall mean any All-Terrain Vehicle, Recreational off-highway vehicle, and any other "Off-road vehicle", designed for or capable of cross-country travel on or immediately over land, water, ice, snow, marsh, swampland, or other natural terrain without benefit of a road or trail. By way of illustration this includes without limitation, the following: multi-wheel drive or low-pressure tire vehicles, vehicles using an endless belt, or tread or treads, or a combination of tread and low-pressure tires, trail bikes, minibikes. Excluded from this definition are any military, fire or law enforcement vehicle, Farm-type tractors and other self-propelled equipment for harvesting farm or forest products, earth moving, or construction equipment and self-propelled lawnmowers.

Utility Vehicles operated on city streets shall conform to the safety standards outlined in 49 C.F.R. 571.500 including:

- i. Headlamps,
- ii. Front and rear turn signal lamps,
- iii. Taillamps,
- iv. Stop lamps,
- v. Reflex reflectors: one red on each side as far to the rear as practicable, and one red on the rear,
- vi. An exterior mirror mounted on the driver's side of the vehicle and either an exterior mirror mounted on the passenger's side of the vehicle or an interior mirror.
- vii. A parking brake,
- viii. A horn or alert sound mechanism.

Section 390.020: Requirements for operating Golf carts on City streets, roads or alleyways within the City.

- A. No person shall operate a Golf Cart upon any city street unless all the following criteria are met:
 - 1. The golf cart shall be properly equipped pursuant to City ordinance, section 390.010.
 - 2. Any individual operating a golf cart shall have a valid operator's or chauffeur's license,
 - 3. Any individual operating a golf cart shall be at least sixteen (16) years old.
 - 4. The golf cart shall be operated at a speed of equal to or less than 20 miles per hour.
 - 5. The Golf Cart is equipped with turn signals.
- B. No person shall operate a golf cart on City streets during any period when his or her operator's license is suspended or revoked.

Section 390.030: Prohibited operation of a Golf Cart

No individual operating a Golf Cart shall:

a. Operate any Golf Cart on any roadway with a speed limit posted above 25 mph.

- b. Operate the golf cart in a careless or imprudent manner so as to endanger any person or property of any person.
- c. Operate the golf cart while under the influence of alcohol or controlled substance.
- d. Operate the golf cart on any federal, state or county highways, except to cross.
- e. No golf cart shall cross any federal or state highway at an intersection where the highway being crossed has a posted speed limit of more than forty -five (45) miles per hour.

Section 390.040: Requirements for operating a Utility Vehicle on City streets, roads or alleyways within the City.

- A. No person shall operate a Utility Vehicle upon any city street unless all the following criteria are met:
 - 1. The Utility Vehicle shall be properly equipped pursuant to City ordinance Section 390.010.
 - 2. Any individual operating a Utility Vehicle shall have a valid operator's or chauffeur's license,
 - 3. Any individual operating a Utility Vehicle shall be at least eighteen (16) years old.
 - 4. The Utility Vehicle shall be operated at a speed of equal to or less than 20 miles per hour.
 - 5. The Utility Vehicle is equipped with turn signals, unless the operator uses hand signals when executing turns.
- B. No person shall operate a Utility Vehicle on City streets during any period when his or her operator's license is suspended or revoked.

Section 390.070: Prohibited operation in a Utility Vehicle

No individual operating a Utility Vehicle shall:

- 1. Operate any Utility Vehicle on any roadway with a speed limit posted above 25 mph.
- 2. Operate the Utility Vehicle in a careless or imprudent manner so as to endanger any person or property of any person.
- 3. Operate the Utility Vehicle while under the influence of alcohol or controlled substance.
- 4. Operate the Utility Vehicle between the hours of sunset and sunrise, unless the Utility Vehicle is properly equipped with headlights, taillights, brake lights and turn signals.
- 5. Operate the golf cart on any federal, state or county highways, except to cross. Utility Vehicle
- 6. No Utility Vehicle shall cross any federal or state highway at an intersection where the highway being crossed has a posted speed limit of more than forty -five (45) miles per hour

Section 390.090: Penalty

a. Any person who violates any provisions of this Chapter shall be punishable under Section 100.190 of the Municipal Code of the City of Osage Beach, Missouri.

Section 2. Severability

The chapters, sections, paragraphs, sentences, clauses and phrases of this ordinance are severable, and if any phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph or section of this ordinance shall be declared unconstitutional or otherwise invalid by the valid judgment or degree of any Court of any competent jurisdiction, such unconstitutionality or invalidity shall not affect any of the remaining phrases, clauses, sentences, paragraphs, or sections of this ordinance since the same would have been enacted by the Board of Aldermen without the incorporation in this ordinance of any such unconstitutional or invalid phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph or section.

<u>Section 3</u>. Repeal of Ordinances not to affect liabilities, etc.

Whenever any part of this ordinance shall be repealed or modified, either expressly or by implication, by a subsequent ordinance, that part of the ordinance thus repealed or modified shall continue in force until the subsequent ordinance repealing or modifying the ordinance shall go into effect unless therein otherwise expressly provided; but no suit, prosecution, proceeding, right, fine or penalty instituted, created, given, secured or accrued under this ordinance previous to its repeal shall not be affected, released or discharged but may be prosecuted, enjoined and recovered as fully as if this ordinance or provisions had continued in force, unless it shall be therein otherwise expressly provided.

Section 4. Codification

It is the intention of the Board of Aldermen and it is hereby provided, that the provisions of this ordinance shall become and be made a part of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Osage Beach, Missouri; that the sections of this ordinance may be renumbered or re-lettered to accomplish such intention; and the words "ordinance" may be changed to "section," "article" or other appropriate designation.

<u>Section 5</u>. That this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after the date of passage and approval of the Mayor.

Analysis:

- 1. The applicants are the owners of the 10.5 acres in question. The property is currently zoned C-1 (General Commercial) as it was zoned in the original zoning of the community.
- 2. The applicant is requesting a rezoning to C-1 and C-1b with a PUD 1 overlay which will allow the development of condominiums, a hotel, and a restaurant on the subject property. The PUD assures the uses within the development providing resort residential and commercial uses within the development that complement each other and will provide protection for the buyers of the condo units themselves. The PUD will also allow the three uses in the development to share the parking amenities for the overall development which provide the necessary number of spaces for each of the uses.
- 3. As you can see on the site development plan, the C-1b (condo development) portion of the development is comprised of 8.2 acres while the C-1 (hotel, restaurant) area consists of the remaining 2.3 acres.
- 4. The existing entrance into the property will provide the access to the new development
- 5. The character of surrounding development is primarily commercial with the highway commercial corridor. Mcfield subdivision is located to the North, the proposed use should provide them with a less intense use than what has taken place on the subject property in the past.
- 6. The development will be required to meet the zoning code requirements of the specific zones that each use falls in unless otherwise listed with the PUD permitted uses. All construction is required to meet all of the Building Codes that have been adopted at the time of Building Permit issuance for each specific building. The Osage Beach Design Guidelines will be followed in the design and construction of the developmental services (sewer, water, streets, etc.).

Department Comments and Recommendations:

The PUD is a zoning tool to offer flexibility within the rigid zoning districts by allowing mixed-use developments that adhere to the goals and objectives of the Comprehensive Plan. In this situation we have an amazing piece of commercially zoned property that was once the home of the Topsider Lakefront Entertainment venue. The Topsider provided the City, its People, and visitors a place to enjoy each other and the activities that make this lake a destination for people from all over our country for nearly 40 years. This piece of property is one of two like it in our community. It has lake frontage, Osage Beach Parkway frontage, and direct access to the Highway 54 Interchange. Obviously, those aspects are hard to come by making this piece very valuable to both the owners and the community.

In 2006 the Planning Commission and The Board of Aldermen removed condominium development from the permitted uses in the C-1 zone. This was done to protect valuable lake front properties such as the subject property from being developed as condos without the City being able to review if that was the greatest and best use for the property. In this situation, the applicants came to me with the desire to put a condo development on the property. As we discussed it, I let them know that I would have difficulty recommending approval of such a request without assuring that at least a portion of the commercial potential of the property would be achieved. The applicant went to work and came up with a plan that works out well for all involved. Of course, the applicant gets to build and sell lake front condominiums while the restaurant and hotel provide for the commercial potential of the property. The three uses compliment each other and actually can be selling points for each other as accessory amenities.

Keep in mind that once this request is approved, the only development that can take place within the PUD District are those that conform to the permitted uses and regulations of the PUD itself. This includes everything from facility construction to infrastructure development.

Keeping in mind the existing conditions of the subject property, a recommendation of Heavy Traffic Commercial for the property by the Comprehensive Plan, I believe the proposed development will be a benefit to the community as requested; the Planning Department recommends approval of this request subject to the following provisions:

Permitted Uses:

The development as illustrated in the submitted site development plan:

- 1) 139 condominium units
- 2) Minimum 72-unit hotel facility
- 3) 250 seat restaurant facility

Construction of the hotel and restaurant facilities can vary from the illustrated site plan to accommodate varying design preferences of the ownership. This will include a combination restaurant/hotel facility as opposed to separate structures, provided the use requirements, parking requirements, and all other Building and Zoning Codes can be met.

Any other proposed use that deviates from the uses permitted in the above listed regulatory documents will require an amendment to the approved PUD.

Construction:

Construction shall be in accordance with the Building Codes as adopted by the City of Osage Beach at the time of Building Permit acquisition for each individual facility.

Bulk, Area, and Height Requirements:

Shall be in conformance with the Building Code, the final PUD document, and the Project Development Plan.

Public Facilities:

Engineering plans for water, streets, and sewer improvements will be submitted with the preliminary plat. These plans, including a drainage plan, must be submitted and approved prior to development. Coordination with the City Engineer is required to ensure that all public improvements are sized and designed to accommodate future phases of development and adjacent properties.

- 1. All required public improvements will be constructed by the applicants or subsequent owner(s). Financial assurances must be provided in conjunction with the preliminary and final plats.
- 2. Any infrastructure to be dedicated to the City of Osage Beach into any of the public systems must go through the required procedure for acceptance by the City.
- 3. Any existing Public Rights of Way to be vacated as part of this development must also go through the proper procedure as required by the City Code of Ordinances for the vacation of roads.

Access:

Access shall be derived from Osage Beach Parkway as illustrated in the PUD Site Plan. All street construction or improvements to the existing roads must conform to the city design guidelines.

Parking:

All development shall, at minimum, adhere to Osage Beach off-street parking requirements and the parking requirements as established in the final PUD Document at the time that it is constructed.

Buffering and Screening:

Buffering and screening shall be required as per the Osage Beach Zoning Code for the C-1 (General Commercial) and C-1b (Commercial Lodging) zones.

Exterior Lighting:

- 1. Exterior lighting shall be designed, located and constructed to eliminate or significantly reduce glare and/or a general increase in lighting intensity within the adjoining existing residential area(s). Additionally, all exterior lighting shall be so arranged and shielded so as to confine all direct light rays within the boundaries of this district.
- 2. All street lighting proposed shall meet the City's standards for street lighting for the specific designation for each roadway (thoroughfare, collector, local etc.). Applicants should coordinate with the City's Engineering Department on street lighting installations.

Signage:

All signage within the PUD District will be required to meet the city sign code and a permit must be acquired from the city prior to construction or placement of all signage whether it is a development wide or individual facility sign.

Maintenance of Open Space and Common Areas:

The maintenance of common area and facilities within the District shall remain the responsibility of the developer(s) or shall be assumed by a legally constituted property owners association that meets all the legal requirements prescribed by the City Attorney.

Platting:

All development within this PUD must be platted in accordance with Osage Beach Subdivision Regulations. The uses permitted and the intensity of development as prescribed by the approval of this PUD shall not be subject for review during the platting process.

Final Development Plan:

- 1. A final PUD development plan for the property has been submitted to the Planning Department and is enclosed in your packet. The submitted document is in line with the recommendations within this report and is ready for the Planning Commission to review and make a recommendation to the Board of Aldermen.
- 2. The preliminary plat and final plats will require complete review and approval as specified in the City of Osage Beach Subdivision Code.

The School of the Osage has requested exercise the option to renew the current contract for the 2020/2021 school year.

We feel this is a valuable partnership with the school district and recommend approval.

City Attorney Comments:

City Administrator Comments:

In July 2019 the Board of Aldermen approved the agreement with the School of the Osage to provide a School Resource Officer (SRO) and SRO services to the district, specifically for the campus location within the city limits during the regular school year. The agreement included partial funding of said position by the district. The city provided SRO service to the district from 1999 through 2017 and the service was reinitiated last year. The district has a similar agreement with the City of Lake Ozark for services at campuses within the City of Lake Ozarks.

The Board of Aldermen are asked to approve this request due to the original bill approved last year by the Board of Aldermen did not indicate City Administrator authority to extend as done with others.

<u>CITY OF OSAGE BEACH - SCHOOL OF THE OSAGE</u> SCHOOL RESOURCE OFFICER (SRO) PROGRAM AGREEMENT

WHEREAS, the DISTRICT desired the services of a School Resource Officer (SRO) in its schools; and

WHEREAS, the CITY desires to provide SRO services for the DISTRICT; and

WHEREAS, the Community in general benefits from programs that involve "law enforcement in schools"; and

WHEREAS, the DISTRICT and the CITY have a history of cooperation in providing quality service to the citizens of our communities;

WHEREAS, the DISTRICT and the CITY are committed to the SRO PROGRAM:

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS AGREED BY AND BETWEEN THE SCHOOL DISTRICT AND THE COUNTY AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. The objective of the SRO PROGRAM is to assist the DISTRICT in providing a safe environment for the students, staff and citizens who interact with the DISTRICT. The SCHOOL RESOURCE OFFICER will respond to the needs of the various DISTRICT schools and will regularly make contact with and assist the staff and students. The functions of the SRO will include, but not be limited to:
 - a. serving as a problem-solving resource for the students, faculty and staff.
 - b. supporting enforcement of DISTRICT policies and guidelines related to security and safety issues.
 - c. providing assistance to the DISTRICT in dealing with individuals and/or conditions which may pose a threat to DISTRICT personnel, students and/or property.
 - d. providing patrol activities and performing other duties that are requested by the District and deemed appropriate by the OSAGE BEACH POLICE DEPARTMENT.
 - e. coordinating law enforcement functions with support units of the OSAGE BEACH POLICE DEPARTMENT.
 - f. providing a liaison among the CITY and other community agencies to offer assistance to the school community, such as guest speakers, special presentations, etc.
- 2. The DISTRICT and POLICE DEPARTMENT will work collaboratively to evaluate the SRO job description, qualifications, and criteria for evaluating the SRO assigned by the DISTRICT.

- 3. The POLICE DEPARTMENT shall have one uniformed officer assigned to the DISTRICT where he/she functions as the "School Resource Officer". The officer assigned to the program shall be selected jointly by the DISTRICT and the POLICE DEPARTMENT.
 - a. The officer performing these services shall be considered an employee of the CITY and said officer shall follow the policies and procedures of the CITY. The SRO shall report to the Sergeant that is assigned as the liaison between the CITY and the DISTRICT. The District shall designate an individual staff member as the SRO's primary point of contact between the District and the SRO. The District shall inform the SRO of any temporary substitutes when the primary point of contact is unavailable.
 - b. The POLICE CHIEF shall designate a supervisor of the rank of sergeant or above who shall function as a liaison between the DISTRICT and the DEPARTMENT. This liaison will work with the individuals designated by the DISTRICT to develop specific operational procedures to facilitate the goals of the program. The DEPARTMENT liaison and the DISTRICT representative will meet regularly to monitor and evaluate the progress of the program. The DEPARTMENT liaison will not be assigned to the DISTRICT.
 - c. The DISTRICT shall have primary services of the SRO throughout the regular school year, with the understanding that the assigned officer performs other SRO/Juvenile Officer functions "as needed" by the POLICE DEPARTMENT.
 - d. The SRO's work hours shall be forty-two hours per week, 7:15 a.m. to 3:45 p.m., Monday through Thursday, and 7:15 a.m. to 2:45 p.m. on Friday. Duty hours may be modified based upon need, and agreeable to both the DISTRICT and POLICE DEPARTMENT.
 - e. The POLICE DEPARTMENT reserves the right to call the SRO into service during any emergency or disaster.
- 4. This agreement shall be for one (1) year, commencing on August 1, 2019 and ending on July 31, 2020, with option to renew annually for up to two (2) years. The SRO assigned to duty on the District premises shall be present for the fall and spring semesters and other school events as agreed.
- 5. The DISTRICT shall pay the CITY \$36,744 (Thirty-Six Thousand, Seven Hundred and Forty-Four Dollars) annually on or before August 1 as reimbursement for the SRO services contemplated herein for this agreement. The parties shall set the payment due for any renewal of the Agreement based on the figure determined by a calculation of 75% of a three-year police officer's salary and benefits for that renewal term.
- 6. The CITY will maintain that the SRO is a duly licensed authorized law enforcement official under the laws of the State of Missouri.
- 7. Either party may terminate this agreement by giving a thirty (30) day written notice to the individuals signing said agreement.

- 8. This agreement acknowledges that this is a general outline of resources the CITY will provide but is not intended to create any liability or duty on part of the CITY to provide law enforcement protection beyond its normal duties.
- 9. It is acknowledged that both the CITY and the DISTRICT are insured for the purposes of general liability and professional liability.
- 10. The City should provide the District with a clear criminal and child abuse check prior to assuming his/her duties.
- 11. The City and the District are independent contractors under proposal.
