

Department Comments and Recommendation:

This is a request for authorization to enter into a one year contract extension with Evoqua for the purchase of odor control chemicals, ongoing maintenance of our system, and to automate chemical feeding at three additional site that are currently manual feed site. This extension would start on April 1, 2021 and run through March 31, 2022.

This contract extension provides the City with:

- It provides for the purchase of odor control chemicals that are fed at Tan-Tar-A,
 KK 1-14, Dude Ranch Road, Passover Road and Sands Pump Station
- It provides for the on-going maintenance of chemical feeder units, pump housings, and storage tanks.
- It provides for the replacement of carbon media at various sites, as needed.
- It also includes monitoring technology at 5 different locations (KK1-14, LS 53-1, Sycamore Creek, Sands, Rockway, and 42 Campground) used for continuous monitoring of hydrogen sulfide gas.
- Adding automated chemical feeding a three sites that were previously on a manual feed system. Automating chemical feeding at these three sites (Tan Tar A/Dude Ranch/Passover) will provide use with the ability to remotely change chemical levels across our entire odor control system.
- We will also be using a new chemical, Alkagen 45, at the Sands lift station as we continue to try and improve odor control between Sands lift station and the Rockway lift station.
- Training for our staff.

This year it is especially important that we build in additional training because of the lack of experience that we have in the Sewer Department. To that end I asked Evoqua to include one full day of training in the contract at no additional cost.

There are certain fixed annual costs for this contract but there is not a total annual amount due to the variability of chemical feed rates and feed sites. We may have to feed chemicals earlier and later depending on potential odor issues. I have review all odor control chemical purchases for the last 3 years. Factoring in this information along with the cost of ongoing maintenance of our odor control system and automated chemical feeding at 3 additional sites, I estimate that we will need to spend at least \$135,000 on this contract.

That said, I am asking for a not to exceed amount of \$158,000 for this contract. With

such an inexperience crew I think it is in the City's best interest to have some room in this contract to allow for additional training or emergency service visits if necessary. There is no one currently working in your sewer department that has any previous experience operating a odor control system. Having this additional 26,000 in this ordinance will give us the ability to reach out to Evoqua for additional help if necessary.

The inexperience of your sewer staff is also the reason why we are asking to automate chemical feeding at Tan Tar A, Dude Ranch, Passover. Manually feeding these chemicals is a highly technical process that requires a lot of training. Odor control training is very important, but automating chemical feeders makes things a lot easier for our new sewer crew to handle on a daily and weekly basis. Moving to an all automated chemical feeding system will make the system easier to maintain and will allow us to focus on the new preventative maintenance processes for our sewer infrastructure that I have put in place.

The Alkagen chemical is a chemical that is widely used for odor control by many of Evoqua's customer during the warmer months of the year. I have spoken with 5 of their customers about the product and they all speak very highly of its use. We will be using this chemical between Sands and Rockway lift stations this summer, but we have the capability to go back to using Bioxide if we need to.

I recommend approval.

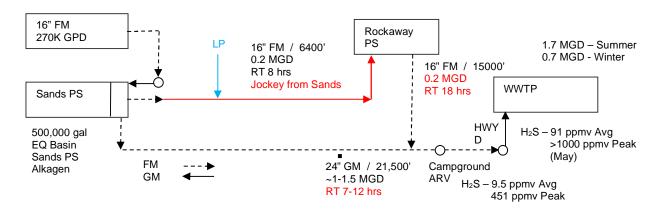


Figure 1 – Osage Beach Wastewater Block Diagram (Sands to WWTP)




Figure 2 – Hydrogen Sulfide pH Shift Equilibrium




Figure 3 - 2500 Gallon Alkagen® Storage and Feed System Plan View

SUPPLEMENTAL AGREEMENT #3 -

LUMP SUM PROPOSAL

February 12, 2021

This Supplemental Agreement is made part of the Contract dated November 7, 2019 between the **City of Osage Beach** and LOR Engineering, LLC dba **Cochran** for Professional Civil Engineering Services. The purpose for this Lump Sum Proposal is to provide engineering services for the **Industrial Drive Improvement Project**. In accordance with our previous discussions and City Council meeting last week, we offer the following professional services:

SCOPE OF SERVICES:

A. Topographic Survey Phase:

- 1. Topographic survey covering sufficient area to develop roadway plans for the project.
- 2. A survey baseline shall be established.
- 3. Roadway cross-sections shall be obtained at 50-foot intervals, a sufficient distance beyond the anticipated construction limits, to determine earthwork quantities and drainage patterns. All swales, ditches or other drainage courses shall be included with flow line elevations. Additional cross-sections as required for clarity shall be taken as needed.
- 4. Existing utilities shall be located and plotted.

B. Preliminary Design Phase:

- 1. Preliminary plans to include: field survey data, topographic information of the existing intersection and roadways, existing utilities, proposed improvements in accordance with the City of Desloge's streetscape specifications, preliminary roadway profile changes, and roadway cross-sections.
- 2. Submit preliminary roadway drawings to the City for review and comment.
- 3. Provide the City with preliminary estimate of construction cost.

C. Final Design Phase:

 Right-of-Way Document Preparation - after notification of approval of the preliminary plans from the City, Cochran shall prepare easement and/or rightof-way documents as needed.

- 2. The final roadway design shall include at a minimum the following information, and shall include the other actions as described:
 - Cover sheet with location map, sheet index, and legend of symbols.
 - Plan and profile sheet showing existing topography, the proposed improvements, existing utilities and relocations, if required, construction limits, profile grade line, and incorporate all review comments from the City.
 - Typical roadway cross sections.
 - Storm Sewer plans and specifications.
 - Final cross-sections of the proposed improvements at 50 foot intervals.
 - Traffic handling and detouring plan with signage.
 - A complete set of contract documents and technical specifications including tabulation of bid quantities and current prevailing wage rates.
- 3. Submit final plans and specifications to the City for review and approval.
- 4. Incorporate final comments from the City into the plans and specifications.
- 5. Utilities: we will contact all utilities that may be affected by this project and provide them with the roundabout and roadway improvement plans to help facilitate the utility relocations if needed.
- 6. Provide a final estimate of anticipated construction costs.

D. Bidding Phase:

- 1. Provide Project Manuals and Plans to the City for bidding purposes. Plans shall be half size (11" x 17").
- 2. Answer contractor's questions during bidding and issue addenda (if required).
- 3. Review shop drawings when submitted for compliance with the drawings and specifications.

E. Construction Phase:

- 1. Serve as the City's representative for administering the terms of the construction contract.
- 2. Attend a preconstruction conference to discuss project details with the successful contractor.
- 3. Provide on-site inspection services to inspect the Contractor's progress and quality of work and to determine if the work conforms to the contract documents.
- 4. Reject work not conforming to the project documents.
- 5. Prepare change orders for issuance by the City as necessary and assure that proper approvals are made prior to work being performed.
- 6. Measure and document quantities, and review monthly estimates for payments due the Contractor.

7. Inspect materials, review material certifications furnished by the Contractor, perform field testing, sample materials as required, and provide laboratory testing.

SERVICES NOT INCLUDED:

- 1. Right-of-Way and Easement Acquisition
- 2. Environmental reports
- 3. Construction Stakeout (Note: will be the responsibility of the Contractor)
