Comments from Your City Administrator Jeana L. Woods, CPA, ICMA - CM

The health and safety of our community, visitors, and employees is a priority for the City of Osage Beach and we continue to respond to the rapidly changing COVID-19 pandemic. The City is working through these changes and will be phasing in contact with the public.

- City facilities are open to the public and public meetings have resumed with restrictions related to social distancing and screening. Employees continue to be screened upon arriving for work.
- Park facilities are open and many activities and sports programs have resumed, with restrictions. The status of three city events is yet to be determined, which are National Night Out, 20th Annual Fall Festival, and the Citywide Rummage Sale.

We continue to ask our community, visitors, and employees to be diligent and take precautions as recommended or instructed to do. We appreciate your patience as we manage this situation and know we are dedicated to being good stewards of our community and will continue to operate efficiently to deliver superior municipal services to our citizens and visitors.

COVID-19 Impacts on the FY2020 Budget:

As presented to the Mayor and Board of Aldermen at the May 7th Board of Aldermen meeting, an operational spending plan was outlined based on an estimated 15% decrease for FY2020 revenues, all sources. \$2 million in expenditure cuts were made and \$2.2 million in reserves were targeted to be used to meet the initial revenue decline estimates of \$4.2 million (15% overall estimated decline).

As we have moved through the past month, operational spending is being adjusted accordingly to reflect changes in estimated revenue due to the COVID-19 pandemic environment and our economy. The latest sales tax collection, other market indicators, as well as the overall pandemic situation, are reassuring in meeting our effort to be proactive to our financial environment. We are not 'out of the woods', but these indicators are leading towards less impact as originally planned for.

The City's top three overall revenue sources consist of Sales Tax, Service Fees, and Grants and other Reimbursements. Nearly two months ago I estimated overall City revenue (all sources) to decline aggregately as much as 15% due to COVID-19; as this is a fluid process and a lot has changed, factors led me to update that estimate closer to 8%-9% of decline due to COVID-19. This equates to an estimate of \$2.4 million in revenue decline city-wide.

Operational response to the adjusted estimates will include systematically addressing the furloughed and reduced hours of employees, assessing the hiring freezes that are in place, assessing many of the O&M expenditure and capital expenditure cuts. This will be done methodically with the appropriate departments, timely and accordingly to ensure we respond in the most conservative fashion to our changing financial situation.

COVID-19 GUIDELINES

OSAGE BEACH PARKS AND RECREATION

GENERAL PUBLIC

There are sanitizer dispensers throughout park. If you have been/feel sick or have recently traveled, please stay at home. Avoid touching face. Practice appropriate respiratory etiquette. Bleachers/picnic tables cleaned daily. No spitting of sunflower seeds, etc.

COACHES & PLAYERS

Try your best to keep players distant from one another in dugout. Avoid sharing equipment. Alternative pre/post game rituals....no handshakes, tip hat or air high fives at end of games. Soccer fields available for team meetings before/after games. Encourage proper COVID regulations.

GAME PLAY

Mound visits should consist of coach, pitcher, and catcher....keeping distance. Base coaches allowed. Coaches not permitted on field, may call umpire over during stoppage of game. Arguing balls/strikes not allowed.

FANS

Wear mask/gloves if desired. **Preferred....bring own seating**along side/outfield fence available to help with social distancing. Please do not hang around before/after games.

DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS

<u>Water Department</u> - We continue to flush the City's miles of water lines which, sometimes stirs up mineral sediments and shows itself as "dirty" water in your faucets. To ensure you're getting clean water, 1) check/replace your water softener filter, 2) run your COLD water faucets for five to ten minutes. These two things should help clear out minerals. If not, 3) call us anytime at 573-302-2020.

<u>Sewer Department</u> - Our department is in the process of replacing meter/disconnect posts as Ameren calls. They are being replaced with metal racks that will last much longer. They continue cleaning stations, performing preventative maintenance and running odor calls. If you see a flashing light on a sewer station, call the office at 302-2020.

Street Department - The department is knee-deep into the mowing season. If you have an intersection or right-of-way that needs attention, please call the office. Please be cautious of the road crews. They are doing concrete work and asphalt patching on some of the lake roads, to include the striping. Call if you have an area that might need a fix.

Engineering Department - Stockman Construction has started Phase 2A on the Mace Road Project. Swiss Village water tower just got an exterior cleaning and the waterline from the new well to the tower has been completed.
