It is census time and our community is depending on you!

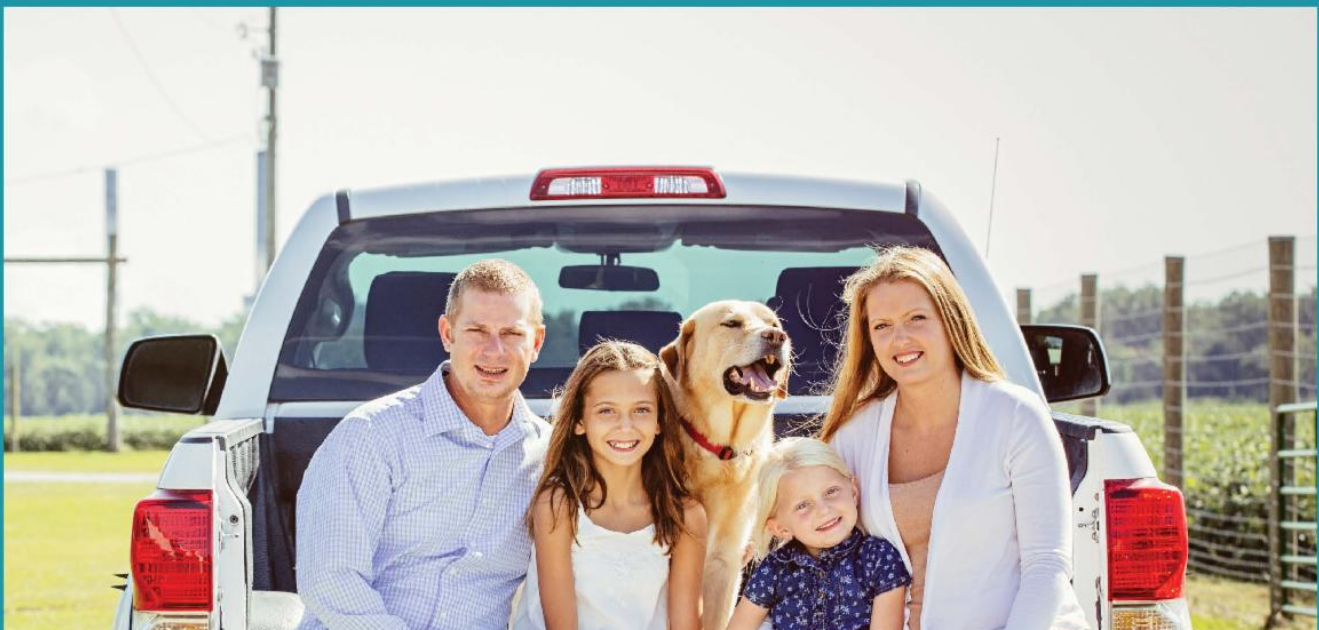

2. Submit your receipt(s) to the City with your utility bill by mail, email, or in the drop-box in front of City Hall (receipts must be dated between 5/8/20--7/31/20 and must be received by 8/31/20)

The \$15 rebate will be applied to your
Osage Beach water/sewer account!

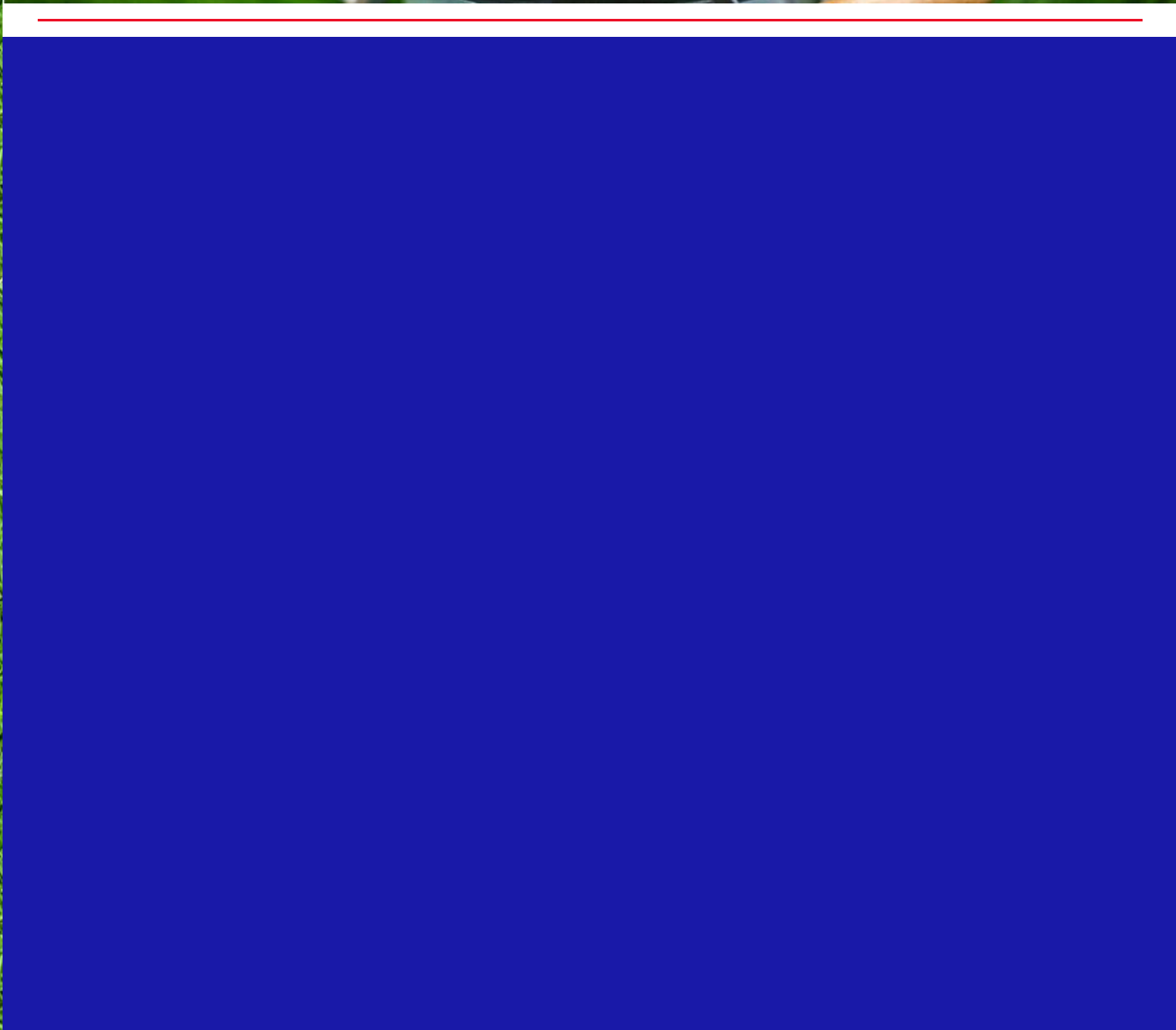

GRILLING SAFETY MESSAGE FROM YOUR BUILDING DEPARTMENT

Grilling on or near combustible areas can be a fire hazard. It not only puts your family and visitors at risk, but, especially in condos and apartment buildings, can put your neighbors in danger as well. The most common grilling hazards are open flames and heat generated in the grill base that can be transferred to the wood of a balcony or the home's siding, causing a fire. When grilling, follow these safety tips:

- Place the grill away from siding, deck railings and out from under eaves and overhanging branches
- Periodically remove grease or fat buildup
- Use only proper starter fluid and store the can away from heat sources
- Check propane cylinder hoses for leaks before use
- Do not move hot grills
- Dispose of charcoal properly, keeping ash containers outside and away from combustible construction
- Check with your local building or fire department to see what is required by code where you live

The International Fire Code prohibits the use of charcoal and gas grills and other open burning devices on combustible balconies or within 10 feet of combustible construction. There are exceptions for certain homes and where buildings, balconies and decks are protected by an automatic sprinkler system.





COVID-19 GUIDELINES

OSAGE BEACH PARKS AND RECREATION

GENERAL PUBLIC

There are sanitizer dispensers throughout park. If you have been/feel sick or have recently traveled, please stay at home. Avoid touching face. Practice appropriate respiratory etiquette. Bleachers/picnic tables cleaned daily. No spitting of sunflower seeds, etc.

COACHES & PLAYERS

Try your best to keep players distant from one another in dugout. Avoid sharing equipment. Alternative pre/post game rituals....no handshakes, tip hat or air high fives at end of games. Soccer fields available for team meetings before/after games. Encourage proper COVID regulations.

GAME PLAY

Mound visits should consist of coach, pitcher, and catcher....keeping distance. Base coaches allowed. Coaches not permitted on field, may call umpire over during stoppage of game. Arguing balls/strikes not allowed.

FANS

Wear mask/gloves if desired. **Preferred....bring own seating**....along side/outfield fence available to help with social distancing. Please do not hang around before/after games.

Department of Public Works

Water Department - Engaged in end of month meter reading. We have small water leaks being fixed on schedule. Unusual puddling of water is a good sign of a water leak or an underground spring surfacing. Please call us if you notice either of these happening near you. If you have questions on your water bill, or an address change, please call the Billing Dept. at 302-2000, ext. 1034.

Sewer Department - We continue our preventative maintenance program, lift station and grinder pump cleaning and grease maintenance. If you see a flashing light on a sewer station, or encounter a bad odor, please call our office at 302-2020. You are our best defense at keeping the City's sewer system productive. And, we thank you.

Street Department - We're in the process of mowing the lake roads. If you have a dangerous intersection or right-of-way that needs trimming before we make it to your road, please call us. We have a schedule for some patching: upcoming are College Blvd, Carrie Ln and Sunset. Also, there will be repair work done on Rockwood Ct. New signage will be installed across the City, including new posts as needed.

Engineering Department - Progress continues on Phase 2A with the Mace Rd project. Also, the west side well project water lines have been installed and the pump is set. Both endeavors are on schedule. Other minor projects are in the works and information will come at a later date.

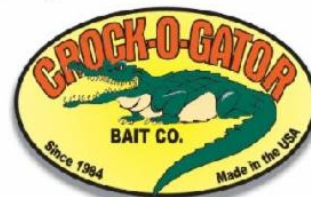
