The Board of Aldermen of the City of Osage Beach, Missouri, conduct a Special Meeting on Tuesday, June 6, 2023, at 6:00 p.m. The following were present in person: Mayor Michael Harmison, Alderman Tyler Hoffman, Alderman Phyllis Marose, Alderman Richard Ross, Alderman Kevin Rucker. NEW BUSINESS

Department Managers will briefly give an overview of the activities in their respective areas of responsibility. A city-wide overview is as follow:

Successes/Strengths/Opportunities:

- Private/developer interest and investment continues at a fast pace; grows our economic wealth and quality of life; increases revenues to enhance or add services for our community. Constructed value, permits, and licenses continue to outpace previous year.
- Increase in revenues and use of grant funds in 2023 are being utilized to complete nearly 150% more investment of needed capital purchases and expansion projects for our community compared to 2022 (nearly 200% over 2021); many of which are in progress.
- City reserves for most funds continue to meet policy requirements.
- Several Master Plans and assessments are in process to aid in the City's effective planning of
 internal needs and services for our residents and visitors; areas of study include sidewalks, private
 roads, public works operations, airport expansion, parks, 911 communication expansion,
 economic incentives, and employee compensation and benefits.
- Voters approved the additional Marijuana Tax, specific to Parks & Recreation and Public Safety, which includes Police, 911 Communication, and Ambulance services.
- Current bonded debt related to utility service (Water and Sewer Bonds) will be paid off at various dates through FY2027.

Struggles/Weaknesses/Threats:

- Supply-chain issues are affecting completion dates of purchases and projects, some improvement over previous year.
- Continued effects of inflation on supply costs.
- Personnel costs are expected to continue to increase, not only affecting the current budget, but
 expected to continue into next year; compete labor markets continue locally and nationally;
 applicant pool struggles remain consistent in various areas.
- Continued attention to forecasted cash flow and various expenditures categories outpacing applicable revenue sources for appropriate timing of operational and capital needs.
- Overall growth of the area and increases in private/developer investment (also a strength and opportunity for the City) increases the need for City resources and services, both current needs and in planning for growth, i.e. staff/admin/internal resources, internal and external risk

- management, utility maintenance/expansion, public safety, Parks & Recreation, etc.; current staff capacity is being challenged.
- Upkeep, planning, and attention to Utility (water and sewer systems) maintenance and infrastructure needs due to growth in demand and aging of current systems.
- Federal and State legislation activity continues to pose challenges in municipal operations and planning.

- A lot of pumps are backordered due to supply chain issues.
- Small pumper trucks have transmission issues and will be out of services for most of the summer.

- My capacity is maxed out and our engineer's capacity is being strained as well. This is an aggressive 2023 project list and I expect some projects will not get completed in 2023 and will have to be carried over. An in-house engineer to assist with project management would free up some capacity within my office for me to focus more on ordinance updates, leadership, and other administrative duties.
- The PW Operation assessment is out to bid. This will be an important process that will give us a road map for more improvements at PW.

Beginning on January 1, 2023, the State of Missouri, pursuant to RSMo 144.049, exempts all state and local sales or use taxes during the established Back-to-School Sales Tax Holiday, removing the option for local government opt-out; therefore,

previously approved ordinance (Bill 20.34) which enacted the most recent changes to City Code Section 140.050 needs repealed/removed.

The State of Missouri made legislative changes to the above stated sales tax holiday, in addition to the Show Me Green Sales Tax Holiday and other manufacturing exemptions; however, we do not have any applicable ordinances in conflict with the other changes recently made by the State. City Code Chapter 140 outlines collection and imposed taxation within the City as subject to taxation by the State of Missouri.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF OSAGE BEACH, MISSOURI, REPEALING SECTION 140.050 SALES TAX HOLIDAY AND REPEALING ORDINANCE 20.34 REFERRING THE DECISION CONCERNING OPTING OUT OF THE STATE IMPOSED "BACK TO SCHOOL" SALES TAX HOLIDAY TO THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN EACH YEAR.

WHEREAS, Ordinance 20.34 was adopted by the Board of Aldermen to reserve itself the duty to make the Back-to-School Sales Tax exemption decision on an annual basis,

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 144.049, RSMo, the Back-to-School Holiday was established for a three-day period beginning at 12:01 AM on the first Friday in August and ending at midnight on the following Sunday, exempting sales of certain clothing, personal computers, certain computer software, and school supplies,

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 144.049, RSMo, beginning January 1, 2023, State of Missouri exempts all state and local sales or use taxes during the Back-to-School Holiday, removing local option to opt out of said tax holiday.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE CITY OF OSAGE BEACH, AS FOLLOWS, TO WIT:

Section 1. The Board of Aldermen of the City of Osage Beach do hereby repeal Ordinance 20.34 enacted June 18, 2020.

<u>Section 2</u>. Section 140.050 of the Osage Beach Code of Ordinances is hereby repealed.

Section 140.050 Sales Tax Holiday.

Beginning in 2021 and every year thereafter, the City Clerk shall place upon the agenda of the Board of Aldermen an ordinance addressing the question of opting out of provisions of Section 144.049, RSMo., exempting sales of certain clothing, personal computers, certain computer software, and school supplies that occur within the boundaries of said City beginning at 12:01 A.M. on the first Friday in August and ending at 12:00 Midnight on the Sunday following from local sales taxes. Said ordinance shall appear on the agenda of the Board of Aldermen at the first meeting in May, for final action at the last meeting in May.

Section 3. Severability

The chapters, sections, paragraphs, sentences, clauses and phrases of this ordinance are severable, and if any phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph or section of this ordinance shall be declared unconstitutional or otherwise invalid by the valid judgment or degree of any Court of any competent jurisdiction, such unconstitutionality or invalidity shall not affect any of the remaining phrases, clauses, sentences, paragraphs, or sections of this ordinance since the same would have been enacted by the Board of Aldermen without the incorporation in this ordinance of any such unconstitutional or invalid phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph or section.

<u>Section 4</u>. Repeal of Ordinances not to affect liabilities, etc.

Whenever any part of this ordinance shall be repealed or modified, either expressly or by implication, by a subsequent ordinance, that part of the ordinance thus repealed or modified shall continue in force until the subsequent ordinance repealing or modifying the ordinance shall go into effect unless

therein otherwise expressly provided; but no suit, prosecution, proceeding, right, fine or penalty instituted, created, given, secured or accrued under this ordinance previous to its repeal shall not be affected, released or discharged but may be prosecuted, enjoined and recovered as fully as if this ordinance or provisions had continued in force, unless it shall be therein otherwise expressly provided.

Dear Political Subdivision,

This letter is to notify you of upcoming changes for the Show Me Green and Back-to-School Sales Tax Holidays, and the changes to the manufacturing exemption.

Each year, the state of Missouri provides two sales tax holidays, Back-to-School and Show Me Green, where qualifying items purchased during these holidays are exempt from state sales and use tax and some local sales and use taxes. During the 2021 legislative session, Section 144.049, RSMo and Section 144.526, RSMo, were amended to repeal the ability for political subdivisions to opt out of the sales tax holidays. This change is effective January 1, 2023. Sales of qualified items during eithe holiday will be exempt from state and local sales and use taxes.

For information on the sales tax holidays, please visit the Department's website at dor.mo.gov/taxation/business/tax-types/sales-use/holidays/.

Section 144.054, RSMo, was also amended to exempt the purchases of machinery, equipment, materials and chemicals used or consumed in manufacturing, processing, compounding, mining, or producing any product or used in research and development related to manufacturing, processing compounding, mining, or producing any product from state and local sales and use tax. This change is effective January 1, 2023. Previously, this exemption only applied to state sales and use tax and local use tax, but did not apply to local sales tax.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF OSAGE BEACH, MISSOURI, ADDING SECTION 140.015 SALES TAX IMPOSED ON RETAIL SALES OF ADULT-USE MARIJUANA, DIRECTING THE APPLICATION OF THE SALES TAX REVENUE TO BE COLLECTED FOR THE PURPOSE OF FUNDING PARKS AND RECREATION AND PUBLIC SAFETY SERVICES, SUCH SALES TAX TO BE AT THE RATE OF THREE PERCENT ON ALL RETAIL SALES OF ADULT USE MARIJUANA WITHIN THE CITY OF OSAGE BEACH, MISSOURI WHICH ARE SUBJECT TO TAXATION PURSUANT TO ARTICLE XIV, SECTION 2.36(5) OF THE MISSOURI CONSTITUTION.

WHEREAS, on November 8, 2022, the electors of the State of Missouri approved Amendment 3 to the Missouri Constitution enacting Section 2 of Article XIV of the Missouri Constitution effective December 8, 2022; and

All monies received by the City as a result of said tax shall be deposited by the City Treasurer, or other authorized City Officer, in the General Fund and shall be expended only for purpose of funding capital improvements and operation and maintenance for Parks and Recreation, and for capital improvements and operation of Public Safety Services, including Police, 911 Communication, and Ambulance services.
- C. Said sales tax shall become effective the 1st day of October, 2023, and shall be levied and collected in the manner provided by law.

Permitted Uses: The outdoor amusement park and entertainment venue that will include carnival type mechanical rides, arcades and games, food and concession facilities, outdoor restaurant and dining facilities, customary retail facilities, and other typical accessory uses such as bars, restrooms, souvenir shop, etc. The subject property will now be governed by the regulations pertaining to E-3 overlays as specified in the Land Use Chapter of the City of Osage Beach Municipal Code the submitted site development plan, and the following.

This facility will operate with the same time restraints and hours of operation as outlined in the code governing the E-3 overlays.

Construction Requirements: All construction will be in conformance with the codes that are adopted by the city at the time that a Building Permit is requested for any portion of the development that requires a permit.

Parking: Will be required to meet the City Code governing off street parking for such a use. The required spaces can be addressed by using onsite parking lots and parking garage facilities.

Facility access, ingress, and egress: Ingress and egress for the development will be attained via access points from Jeffries Road. These accesses will be approved by MoDOT and the City as part of the roadway improvement plans during the construction permit process.

Signage: Signage for the development will be in conformance with the City of Osage Beach Municipal Code that regulates signage. The applicant will be required to get a sign permit for any new signage.

Sound Control Requirements:

Unless otherwise defined herein, all terminology shall be in conformance with applicable publications of the American National Standards Institute, Incorporated (ANSI) or its successor body.

Instrumentation used in making sound level measurements shall meet the following requirements as specified in Section <u>220.040</u> of Chapter <u>220</u>.

Maximum permissible sound levels by receiving land use.

Maximum sustained sound. No person shall operate or cause to be operated any source of sound in such a manner as to create a sound level which exceeds the limits set forth for the receiving land use category in the table below:

Exemptions. The following activities or sources are exempt from these noise standards:

Activities covered by the following: Stationary, non-emergency signaling devices, emergency signaling devices, domestic power tools, air-conditioning and air-handling equipment for residential purposes, operating motor vehicles, refuse collection vehicles.

Construction or routine maintenance of public service utilities; and

The emission of sound for the purpose of alerting persons to the existence of an emergency, or the emission of sound in the performance of emergency work.

Exterior Lighting: Any lighting proposed as part of this development must be shielded to direct light inward and limit light intensity within adjoining properties or the Lake of the Ozarks.

Buffering and Landscaping: Buffering and sound mitigation will be required if noise or light becomes an issue for surrounding properties. A minimum of 5 percent of the areas devoted to parking must be left in open lawn or landscaped areas.

Final Development Plan: The site plan submitted with the application is sufficient for the final development plan, unless changes or additions are requested by the Board of Aldermen, as part of the approval of the request. In that case an amended site development plan will be submitted illustrating all the required changes.

Analysis:

- 1. The applicant is the owner of the 8.186-acre parcel in question. The applicant is requesting an E-3 overlay to develop and establish an outdoor amusement park entertainment venue and facility that will include carnival type mechanical rides, arcades and games, food and concession facilities, outdoor restaurant and dining facilities, customary retail facilities, and other typical accessory uses such as bars, restrooms, souvenir shop, etc. This use will be a full-time activity that is open year-round.
- 2. As is typical with the establishment of a use of high intensity like this, impact on the road system and traffic capacity is a situation that will need to be addressed. A Traffic Impact Study and Statement has been performed by consultants contracted by the applicants. A significant amount of discussion has been had between the consultants, MoDOT, and the City during the process of this analysis with the findings and recommendations to be delivered and reviewed by those parties soon. The findings and recommendations of this document will be reviewed by MoDOT and the City's Engineers to determine the necessary improvements that will be required to the road system. Those improvements will be required as part of the construction permit process and will be required to be completed prior to the approval of the final inspection and the issuance of a Certificate of Occupancy to open the park to the public.
- 3. I am sure you are aware that this project has been discussed in public settings over the past few months during the process by which the applicant has requested Tax Increment Financing, along with other financing and development and incentive programs, from the City of Osage Beach. Those processes are still ongoing and are being addressed by the appropriate Boards and Commissions. Those issues are not within the responsibilities of the Planning Commission and will not be addressed at this meeting.

Department Comments and Recommendation:

The primary intent of E-zones is to regulate outdoor activities that could adversely affect adjacent properties, both commercial and residential. The character of this corridor is high traffic commercial. With the subject property's location adjacent to Highway 54 and the Jeffries Road interchange, it lends itself favorably to the type of use being requested, provided that the intensity of the uses is mitigated as to not create an untenable impact on the area.

With the subject property's location in an intense use corridor being recommended for commercial use and development by the Comprehensive Plan, the Planning Department would recommend that this request be approved subject to the following provisions and conditions:

Permitted Uses: The outdoor amusement park and entertainment venue that will include carnival type mechanical rides, arcades and games, food and concession facilities, outdoor restaurant and dining facilities, customary retail facilities, and other typical accessory uses such as bars, restrooms, souvenir shop, etc. The subject property will now be governed by the regulations pertaining to E-3 overlays as specified in the Land Use Chapter of the City of Osage Beach Municipal Code the submitted site development plan, and the following.

This facility will operate with the same time restraints and hours of operation as outlined in the code governing the E-3 overlays.

Construction Requirements: All construction will be in conformance with the codes that are adopted by the city at the time that a Building Permit is requested for any portion of the development that requires a permit.

Parking: Will be required to meet the City Code governing off street parking for such a use. The required spaces can be addressed by using onsite parking lots and parking garage facilities.

Facility access, ingress, and egress: Ingress and egress for the development will be attained via access points from Jeffries Road. These accesses will be approved by MoDOT and the City as part of the roadway improvement plans during the construction permit process.

Signage: Signage for the development will be in conformance with the City of Osage Beach Municipal Code that regulates signage. The applicant will be required to get a sign permit for any new signage.

Sound Control Requirements:

Unless otherwise defined herein, all terminology shall be in conformance with applicable publications of the American National Standards Institute, Incorporated (ANSI) or its successor body.

Instrumentation used in making sound level measurements shall meet the following requirements as specified in Section 220.040 of Chapter 220.

Maximum permissible sound levels by receiving land use.

Maximum sustained sound. No person shall operate or cause to be operated any source of sound in such a manner as to create a sound level which exceeds the limits set forth for the receiving land use category in the table below:

Exemptions. The following activities or sources are exempt from these noise standards:

Activities covered by the following: Stationary, non-emergency signaling devices, emergency signaling devices, domestic power tools, air-conditioning and air-handling equipment for residential purposes, operating motor vehicles, refuse collection vehicles.

Construction or routine maintenance of public service utilities; and

The emission of sound for the purpose of alerting persons to the existence of an emergency, or the emission of sound in the performance of emergency work.

Exterior Lighting: Any lighting proposed as part of this development must be shielded to direct light inward and limit light intensity within adjoining properties or the Lake of the Ozarks.

Buffering and Landscaping: Buffering and sound mitigation will be required if noise or light becomes an issue for surrounding properties. A minimum of 5 percent of the areas devoted to parking must be left in open lawn or landscaped areas.

Final Development Plan: The site plan submitted with the application is sufficient for the final development plan, unless changes or additions are requested by the Board of Aldermen, as part of the approval of the request. In that case an amended site development plan will be submitted illustrating all the required changes.

On behalf of Lakeport Village LLC (the "Applicant"), please find enclosed with this letter, a rezoning application (the "Application") and a site plan for the parcels located in the general vicinity of Jeffries Road and Highway 54 (as further defined in the Application, the "Area"). The Application requests a rezone from the Area's current zoning classification of C-1 or General Commercial District to the proposed zoning classification of E-3 or Entertainment District 3.

The Applicant seeks to rezone the Area in anticipation of its development of an amusement park to be known as Oasis at Lakeport ("Oasis at Lakeport" or the "Project"), which will be a part of a larger development of a family friendly resort and entertainment district. The Area's current zoning classification will not allow the development of the Project because the Project is anticipated to include an outdoor area, amusement rides such as a Ferris wheel, an arcade, restaurants, and more. The current zoning classification of C-1 only allows for general commercial, and with the development of numerous outdoor entertainment activities such as a Ferris Wheel, the Project will require a E-3 classification in accordance with the municipal code of the City of Osage Beach, Missouri (the "City"). Without a rezoning of the Area, the Project's feasibility cannot occur.

The rezoning of the requested Area will bring numerous community and economic benefits to the City. The Project is expected to enhance the curb appeal and remediate the blighted conditions of the Area, increase tourism to the City, and generate additional tax revenues within the Area, which will greatly benefit the City. Furthermore, the development of the Project is anticipated to transform an underutilized area of the City suffering from blight into a premier tourist destination in the Midwest. The Project is expected to remove the deteriorated buildings, improve the structural support within the Area, and attract future economic development to the City. The Project will provide a range of opportunities, including but not limited to, new employment opportunities for residents, the creation of new commercial spaces for new businesses located in the City, and new tourist activities for visitors to the City. Furthermore, the Project is anticipated to attract thousands of guests each year, and this increased tourism is projected to provide a significant increase in sales tax revenues, which will greatly benefit the City.

Additionally, the Project is in furtherance of the City's comprehensive plan and is in accordance with the Future Land Use Map prepared by the City.

While the Project is anticipated to bring many community and economic benefits to the City, the Applicant has also taken steps to make sure the Project has properly addressed its impact on public facilities and adjacent property owners. The Applicant is working closely with the City's various internal departments, including the Department of Public Works, the City Engineering Department, and various City staff, including the Director of Planning, to ensure the City is actively involved in the planning and development of the Project, to make sure that all public facilities are properly protected, and any potential problems are mitigated. This review includes City officials reviewing site plans, engineering plans, and surveys for the Project. Furthermore, the Applicant is working with Missouri Department of Transportation and traffic consultants to address the concerns of the increased traffic on Highway 54 and Jeffries Road. The Applicant is also working with the City to address any additional site or pedestrian infrastructure needs that will be needed in connection with the Project.

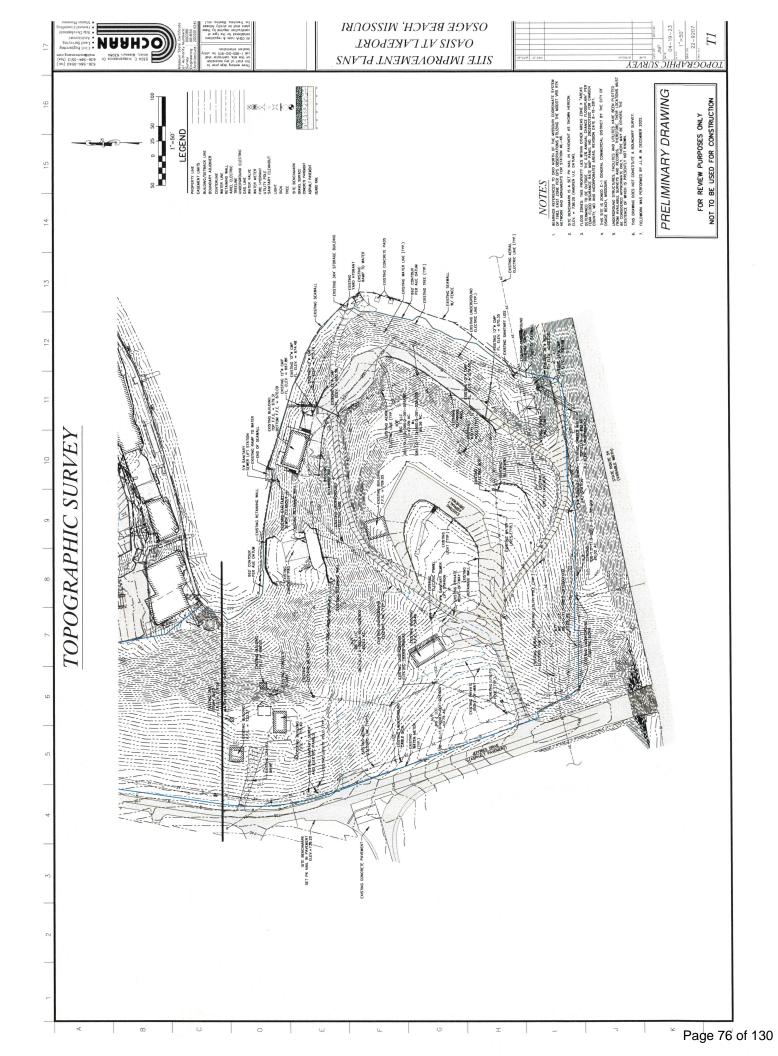

Palisades Boulevard was assumed to be accepted by the City some time in the mid to late 1980's and the City has been maintaining it since that time. Earlier this year, Mr. Duenke contacted me and let me know that the property that makes up the Right of Way for Palisades Boulevard was still listed under his ownership as private property. At that point I went back and tried to find a file or a decision made by the Board in the past showing the acceptance of the road, and found nothing. I then went through the minutes from every meeting from 1980 to 1995 and still found nothing.

So after a conversation with Mr. Duenke and the City Attorney, it was determined the best way to handle this was to present it to the Board so an official acceptance can be made. Mr. Duenke has provided a plat and a Quit Claim Deed for the property. Once approved, The Quit Claim Deed can be excuted and recorded so that the road and it's Right of Way will belong to the City.

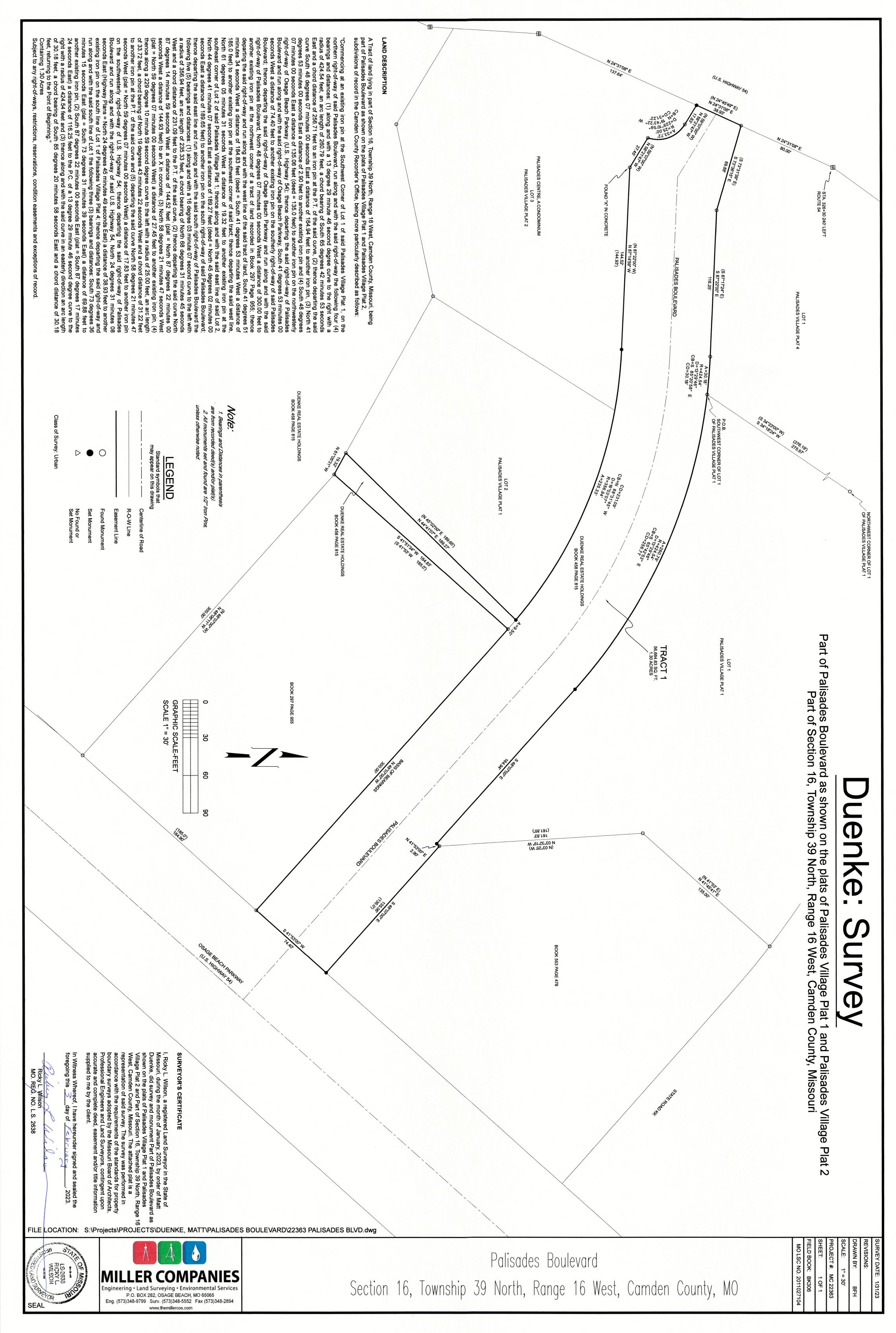

Department Comments and Recommendation:

We have struggled to get the Bluff Drive Shoulder Improvement Project off the ground due to land acquisition issues. We have finally come to an agreement with the land owner that owns property along bluff drive between Ski Drive and Hamrock. The shoulders along Bluff in this area are slowly sliding away from the road and the issue needs to be addressed before even more expensive road repairs become necessary.

Several years ago (2017), a previous Public Work Manager had informed this property

owner that they would accept the location of a new sewer station at this property owners home on Hamrock Lane. This Property Owner had the station installed at the location agreed upon. The station was installed about a foot and a half from the property owner's pool and there is not enough room for the City to get the easement needed to maintain the station. City inspectors would not accept the station into City inventory because of these issues. Currently, the property owner maintains his own station even though they were told that the City would take this station over. Once the property owner sells these two pieces of property to us, they intend to relocate the station and turn it over to the City. The attached waiver will need to be signed by the property owner.

The warranty deed transferring this property to the City is attached along with a waiver letter. The property owner will be required to sign both documents. The budget for this specific project is \$62,000, within line item 20-00-773155 Misc Streets and Roads. If the board approves this purchase, the project budget will need to be reevaluated and a budget amendment will be necessary once the project is bid out and the actual cost is identified.

I recommend approval.

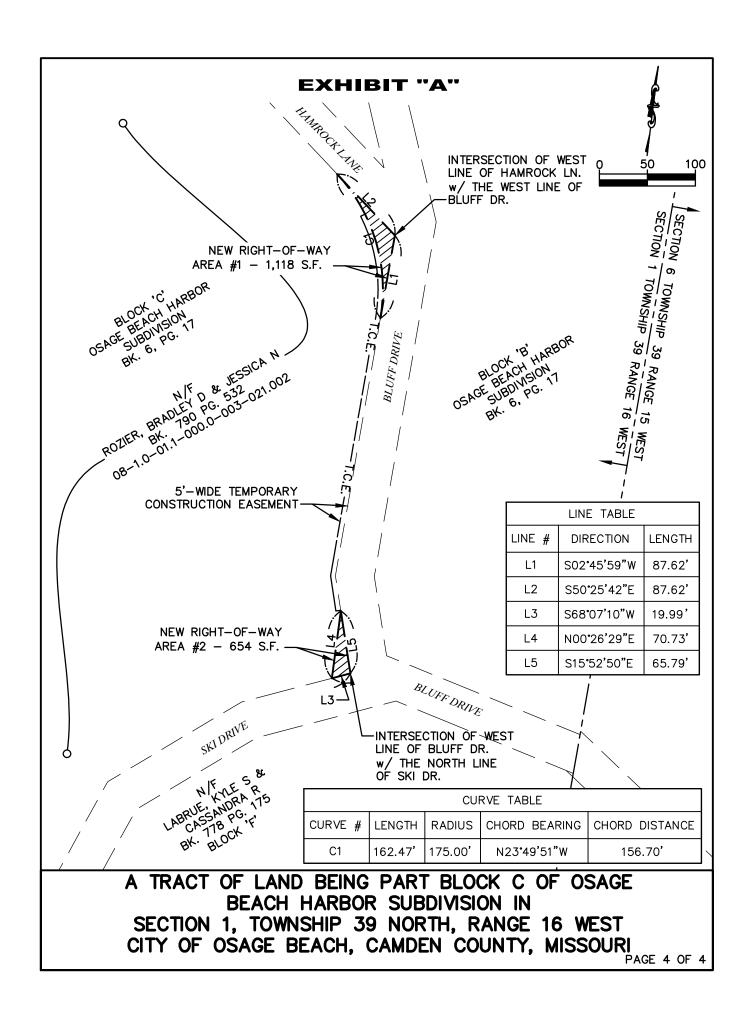

CITY OF OSAGE BEACH RIGHT OF WAY AND RELEASE AGREEMENT

THIS RIGHT OF WAY AND RELEASE AGREEMENT (the "Agreement") states the terms and conditions that govern the contractual relationship between the City of Osage Beach, Missouri ("City") and Bradley and Jessica Rozier ("Owners"), on the following terms.

WHEREAS City wishes to acquire and Owners wish to sell certain real property along Bluff Drive within the City, along with a 5-foot temporary construction easement (the "**Right of Way**"); and

WHEREAS Owners have previously asserted a claim against the City for permitting the installation of Owners' sewer system, especially their sewer can in close proximity to their pool, and City has declined to accept said sewer can due to such proximity; and

WHEREAS the parties wish to forever resolve both matters between them.

NOW THEREFORE the parties enter into the following agreements:

I. TERMS

- 1. **Payment.** City hereby agrees to pay Owners the sum of \$25,000.00 upon execution of this Agreement and delivery of the Easement.
- 2. **Right of Way.** In consideration thereof, Owners agree to convey to City the Right of Way using the Special Warranty Deed attached hereto.

3. Releases and Responsibilities.

a. Release. Owners do hereby release and forever discharge the City of Osage Beach and its employees, agents, successors, contractors, and assigns, and all other parties acting on its behalf (collectively the "Released Parties"), of and from any and all claims, damages, loss of service, expenses and compensation whatsoever, which the undersigned now has, may have, or which may hereafter accrue on account of or in any way growing out of any and all known and unknown, foreseen and unforeseen injuries and property damage and the consequences thereof resulting or to result from the City's permitting, instructions, and all other conduct related to Owners' sewer system at or near 1340 Castle Court, Osage Beach, Missouri 65065. It is understood and agreed

that this settlement is a compromise of disputed claims and the execution hereof shall not be construed as an admission of liability on the part of the City of Osage Beach or any Released Parties. Owners hereby declare and represent that the injuries and property damage sustained may be unknown or uncertain and indefinite, and in making this Release, it is understood and agreed that Owners rely solely upon their own judgment, belief and knowledge of the nature, extent, affect and duration of said injuries and liability thereof and is made without reliance upon any statement or representation of the City of Osage Beach or the Released Parties.

b. Future responsibilities. Owners further agree that they will be responsible for modifying their sewer system at their sole discretion and expense, and that any damage resulting from the sewer system in its present location will be their sole responsibility. Should Owners elect to move the sewer can, all work shall comply with the then-effective City ordinances, policies, and regulations.

4. City's Obligations.

- a. Permitting and Approvals. City will provide timely reviews, approvals, licenses, and permits from where it has jurisdiction over components or phases of any work performed by Owners related to Owners' sewer system. Such approvals are contingent upon Owners meeting the requirements therefor.
- b. Acceptance of modifications. Should Owners relocate their sewer can, City agrees to accept the relocated sewer can provided Owners meet the then-current requirements for such acceptance.
- c. Trees. City agrees to consult with Owners and make its best efforts to remove the minimum number of trees to the Right of Way necessary to accomplish its current road project. Such consultation shall be made by personal meeting with the Assistant City Administrator or his designee.

II. STANDARD CONDITIONS

Owners shall conform to all changes made to this Agreement as a result of any ordinance, law and/or directive issued by the Federal, State, or local authority having jurisdiction over this Agreement, Owners, or the City.
- 10. E-Verify. [intentionally omitted].
- 11. **Anti-Israel Discrimination.** Owners certifies it is not currently engaged in and shall not, for the duration of this Agreement, engage in a boycott of goods or services from the State of Israel companies doing business in or with Israel or authorized by, licensed by, or organized under the laws of the State of Israel; or persons or entities doing business in the State of Israel. *See* R.S.Mo. § 34.600.
- 12. **Indemnification by Owners.** [intentionally omitted].
- 13. **No Indemnification by City.** Nothing in this Agreement shall be construed to require the City to indemnify Owners. Such indemnification is illegal under Missouri law. *See* Mo. A.G. Opinion 138-87 (1987).
- 14. **Sunshine Law.** All material submitted to the City will likely become public record and will be subject to the Missouri Sunshine Law, R.S.Mo. Chapter 610. Any material requested to be treated as proprietary or confidential must be clearly identified and easily separable from other materials. Owners must include justification for the request. The City's obligation to comply with the Sunshine Law supersedes any request by Owners that material be treated as proprietary or confidential.
- 15. Ownership of Work Product. [intentionally omitted].
- 16. **Termination.** [intentionally omitted].
- 17. **Notices.** All formal notices or other documents required by this Agreement shall be in writing and delivered personally or mailed by certified mail, postage prepaid, addressed to the parties at:

- 19. **Entire Agreement.** This Agreement supersedes all agreements previously made between the parties relating to its subject matter. There are no other understandings or agreements between them.
- 20. **Non-Waiver.** No delay or failure by either party to exercise any right under this Agreement, and no partial or single exercise of that right, shall constitute a waiver of that or any other right unless otherwise expressly provided herein.
- 21. **Headings.** Headings in this Agreement are for convenience only and shall not be used to interpret or construe its provisions.
- 22. **Governing Law; Venue for Disputes.** This Agreement was made in the State of Missouri and shall be interpreted under and governed by the laws of the State of Missouri. Any action arising out of this Agreement or its subject matter shall be filed in the Circuit Court for Camden County, Missouri or the Associate Division thereof and the parties hereby consent and agree to the exclusive personal and subject-matter jurisdiction of that Court.
- 23. **WAIVER OF RIGHT TO JURY TRIAL.** THE PARTIES HEREBY KNOWINGLY, INTENTIONALLY, VOLUNTARILY AND IRREVOCABLY WAIVE ANY RIGHT TO A TRIAL BY JURY IN ANY ACTION ARISING OUT OF OR RELATING TO THIS AGREEMENT OR ANY OTHER DOCUMENT OR TRANSACTION CONTEMPLATED HEREBY OR THEREBY, WHETHER BASED ON CONTRACT, TORT OR ANY OTHER THEORY.
