Department Comments and Recommendation:

The bid for this project was advertised in late October and the bids were opened on November 30th. The City received 2 bids and the low bid was from Four Season Plumbing. The bid tab and Four Season Plumbing bid documents are attached. The City has a good relationship with this vendor and we are comfortable with them doing this work. I did check the references for Four Season Plumbing and found no problems.

This project was originally budgeted in 2023, but was carried forward to the proposed 2024 Budget. Both of these stations are suffering from corrosion and pipe degradation issues. This project will replace all the valves, pumps and plumbing in the station. All of this work will take place in 2024.

Station 24-1 Improvements (Osage Beach Rd.) \$180,210 Total Budget = 274,620 Four Season Bid = 224,080

City Administrator Comments:

In June 2018, the Board of Aldermen executed an agreement with St. Louis
County to participate in St. Louis County PDMP Program, operated by the St.
Louis County Department of public Health (DPH), and created a new section in
our City Code adopting a PDMP program in the City, authorizing the City

Administrator to administer the program. This agreement and PDMP program in the City authorized the St. Louis County Department of Public Health to monitor the prescribing and dispensing of all Schedule II, III, and IV controlled substances by professionals licensed to prescribe or dispense such substances in Osage Beach.

- In June 2020, the Board of Aldermen executed a renewal to said agreement, which expired in October 2021.
- In May 2021, Missouri legislation was passed (SB 63) enacting a statewide PDMP program (Missouri PDMP) (RSMo 195.600) establishing the Joint Oversight Task Force (JOTF) for the Prescription Drug Monitoring under the Missouri Office of Administration (OA).
- In February 2022, the Board of Aldermen repealed the City code section adopted in 2018 ending the program in the City due to Missouri enacting a statewide PDMP program.

The Missouri PDMP is an expansion of the STL PDMP and encompasses the entire state. Transitioning to the statewide program is underway and this renewal agreement is being requested for the purpose of allowing the data collected within our program, collected and monitored by the St. Louis County PDMP program 2018-2021 per our agreements at the time, to be shared with the JOTF. Missouri DPH does not have the authority to share participating counties/cities data without authorization, which this agreement gives if approved by the Board of Aldermen.

I recommend approval based on the prior decisions by the Board of Aldermen to participate in and past creation of a PDMP program.

RENEWAL-PDMP USER AGREEMENT

This renewal agreement ("Renewal") is by and between <u>The City of Osage Beach, MO</u> ("Subscriber") and St. Louis County, Missouri, a charter county organized under the laws of the State of Missouri, on behalf of its Department of Public Health, with an address at 6121 North Hanley Road, Berkeley, MO 63134 ("County").

WHEREAS, **Subscriber** and **County** are parties to an agreement dated _____("Agreement"); and

WHEREAS, the **County** has a contract with Bamboo Health, Inc., formerly Appriss Inc. ("Bamboo") for operation of County's Prescription Drug Monitoring Program ("County PDMP"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 195.600 R.S.Mo., the State of Missouri plans to implement a statewide Prescription Drug Monitoring Program ("State PDMP");

WHEREAS, as part of the transition to the State PDMP, County intends to transfer the County PDMP data to the State, and such data transfer, authorized by 602.806 SLCRO, will include data collected and maintained through the Agreement; and

WHEREAS, County and Subscriber desire to renew the Agreement in order to effectuate the transfer of Subscriber PDMP data to the State PDMP;

WHEREAS, Subscriber is authorized to enter into this Renewal by Ordinance #_____; and

WHEREAS, Ordinance 28,779 authorizes the County Executive to execute this Renewal for the purposes stated herein;

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the premises and promises hereinafter, the parties agree as follows:

- 1. The term for this **Renewal** shall begin upon full execution and continue for one year.
- 2. Subscriber authorizes County to transfer all Subscriber PDMP Data obtained pursuant to the Agreement with Subscriber to the State of Missouri's Office of Administration for the purposes of transition to the State PDMP. PDMP Data includes but is not limited to prescription dispensation data collected from Subscriber's admittance to the PDMP to the date at which State PDMP is operational. St. Louis County Department of Public Health (DPH) will facilitate this data transfer in collaboration with Bamboo Health, Inc.
- 3. All other terms and conditions of the Agreement shall remain in full force and effect.

Statewide Missouri PDMP Update for Counties

The Missouri Prescription Drug Monitoring Program is an initiative that will continue to improve the way healthcare providers across Missouri access & utilize controlled substance prescription information in our state. With the Statewide PDMP, counties that have previously participated in the <u>St. Louis County (STL) PDMP</u> can expect a seamless transition helping to shape the future of patient care & prescribing practices.

What is the PDMP?

St. Louis County Department of Public Health (DPH) launched a Prescription Drug Monitoring Program (STL PDMP) in April 2017. Currently, 75 jurisdictions (cities & counties) across the state of Missouri participate in the STL PDMP. Each participating jurisdiction has passed their own local ordinance to authorize the PDMP & executed a User Agreement with St. Louis County. St. Louis County operates the PDMP on behalf of all participating jurisdictions.

Healthcare providers across the state can utilize the STL PDMP to review their patient's controlled substance prescription history before writing a new prescription. The STL PDMP improves clinical care & informs clinical decision making. Providers can use the PDMP to review a patient's prescription history, be alerted to dangerous drug combinations, & identify patients with concerning prescription patterns that may benefit from early intervention.

What's changing with the PDMP?

On May 12, 2021, the Missouri Legislature passed SB 63 which authorizes a statewide PDMP. The Missouri PDMP is authorized by <u>Section 195.600</u>, <u>RSMo</u>. & establishes the Joint Oversight Task Force (JOTF) for Prescription Drug Monitoring under the Missouri Office of Administration (OA).

The Missouri PDMP is an expansion of the STL PDMP as it will encompass the entire state. DPH will coordinate with JOTF to transition the STL PDMP to the Missouri PDMP. There will be various communications sent to all stakeholders as the transition proceeds; healthcare providers, pharmacies, local public health agencies, & city/county officials will be notified of the transition date & necessary action, if any. Transitioning to a Statewide PDMP will continue to improve the way healthcare providers across Missouri access & utilize controlled substance prescription data in our state.

The STL PDMP has continued to operate through this process & will continue to operate until the Missouri PDMP is fully functional. The St. Louis County Department of Public Health is committed to continuing this much needed service while JOTF stands up their program.

How does this impact my county?

JOTF & DPH are committed to making the transition from the STL PDMP to the Missouri PDMP as seamless as possible. Counties who are already participating in & reporting to the STL PDMP should expect minimal effort to fold into the Missouri PDMP. Counties who are not currently participating in the STL PDMP should be expecting communications from JOTF & the PDMP vendor, Bamboo Health, with information on the onboarding process.

What action(s) does my county need to take?

JOTF has requested historical data from the STL PDMP in order to have as comprehensive a program as possible upon statewide transition. DPH does not have the authority to share participating counties data without completion of a contract (User Agreement).

Participating jurisdictions will need to decide whether they agree to share their jurisdiction's historical PDMP data with JOTF for use by healthcare providers in their program. To authorize sharing of your jurisdiction's data with JOTF, a contract will need to be signed with DPH to facilitate this data transfer. DPH has drafted up User Agreements for each jurisdiction. A template User Agreement is also included with this communication. After signing the User Agreement, participating jurisdictions will not need to do anything further concerning data transfer – DPH will coordinate with the PDMP vendor, Bamboo Health, to take care of this.

Why is sharing historical prescription data with JOTF important?

When a county opts to include historical data within the state PDMP, healthcare providers benefit from uninterrupted visibility into their patient's controlled substance prescription history. For providers who rely on the STL PDMP today, this continuity of information will be beneficial in the patient care, especially for established patients. For example, a provider in a county that chooses not to provide historical data will question why certain controlled substances they prescribed in the past are not showing up in the patient's history. By allowing historical data to be included, we avoid unnecessary gaps that could impact a patient's care & potentially lead to confusion among the provider community.

A complete controlled substance prescription history serves as the cornerstone for consistent & well-informed prescribing practices. It equips healthcare providers with the necessary information to make confident prescribing decisions, ensuring patient safety & improving overall care. By participating with the Statewide Missouri PDMP & retaining historical dispensation data, we empower healthcare providers to prevent substance misuse & arm them with a critical tool needed in our collective battle against the opioid epidemic.

How will data be secured & protected?

Your county's data will continue to receive the same care & security as it does today through the St. Louis County PDMP. The Statewide PDMP will utilize the same vendor as the STL PDMP & ensures that all data security measures & technical oversight remain unchanged. The JOTF emphasizes the critical importance of maintaining the confidentiality & integrity of patient information, & remains steadfast in their commitment to upholding the same or higher standards as what is currently in place through the STL PDMP.

To further ensure data security & protect patient privacy, section 195.600, RSMo. requires that all individual's dispensation data older than 3 years be deleted from the program.

The enclosures are from MML (Missouri Municipal League) that were created to assist cities in educating and enacting local Use Tax, and were used by many Missouri cities in their successful election campaigns in recent years.

The City of Osage Beach does not collect a Use Tax as the voters of Osage Beach have not authorized said tax. This discussion is for the purpose of giving the Mayor and Board of Aldermen an opportunity to understand Use Tax and how it may be beneficial for Osage Beach.

Summary:

- What is a Local Use Tax The local Use Tax is applied to purchases made online from an out-of-state vendor and shipped to a location in Osage Beach at the same rate as Sales Tax, which is collected and remitted in the same fashion as Sales Tax. Use Tax mirrors Sales Tax and is NOT a double tax. If you pay Sales Tax on a purchase, you do NOT pay a Use Tax on the same purchase. For example, the online catalog vendor will collect the local Use Taxe and remit to the Missouri Department of Revenue (MoDOR); MoDOR will remit to cities as Sales Taxes are remitted. Over one-half of Missouri municipalities with a population of 2,000 or more have enacted a local Use Tax. This includes many of our surrounding cities as well as Camden County.
- Levels the Playing Field A purchase made on an item at a retail store in Osage Beach, City sales tax is paid. WITH an enacted local Use Tax, a purchase made via the internet or by catalog from an out-of-state vendor and shipped to Osage Beach, City local Use Tax would be paid; without a local Use Tax it would NOT be paid. Osage Beach businesses are at a competitive disadvantage to out-of-state vendors who don't charge our Sales Tax on the purchases shipped to individuals in Osage Beach. By having a Use Tax for Osage Beach, this levels the playing field between the local retailers and the out-of-state vendors.
- Generates Local Revenue WITHOUT approved Use Tax by the voters, as internet purchases increase, local revenues decrease which are used to pay for vital municipal services. Q2-2023, e-commerce sales reached the highest level in history, second only to Q2-2020. E-commerce penetration continues to increase, surpassing 15% share of total sales in the past two quarters (source-US Census Bureau, Forrester Analysis). Online store sales are expected to reach 22% of global retail sales in 2023, compared to 2019, and Amazon accounted for nearly 40% of all US retail e-commerce sales in 2022 (source eMarketer, 2022).
- How much revenue would the Use Tax generate for Osage Beach? This is
 difficult to estimate without historical data specific to our City. Based on past
 estimates with the assistance of MML, annual minimum estimate is in the vicinity
 of \$325,000.
- <u>Ballot considerations</u> Ballot deadline for the April 2024 Osage Beach General Municipal Election is January 23, 2024. It will be feasible for the Board of Aldermen to consider an ordinance at the second meeting in January to meet said deadline. Giving the Osage Beach voters an opportunity to consider a local Use Tax, the voters have the opportunity to vote on a local Use Tax that would ensure purchases placed online from vendors located outside the state are subject to the same local tax rates as those purchases made from Osage Beach vendors. The enclosed sample ordinance is for guidance purposes from MML.

Revenue generated by a local Use Tax would go to the City's General Fund which supports general government services including police, parks, and ambulance service subsidy. It is strongly recommended for the Board of Aldermen to consider stating what use the tax revenues would be used for, similar to how other tax revenues have been directed through Board legislative action.

FAQ: Local Use Tax (Proposition U)

What is a use tax?

A use tax is a tax on the purchase of goods by Missouri residents from out-of-state vendors. Products exempt from the sales tax would be exempt from the use tax.

What is the rate of the local use Tax?

The local use tax rate is the same rate as the total local sales tax rate. If the local sales tax is reduced or raised by voter approval, the local use tax shall also be reduced or raised by the same action.

When must the local use be passed?

There is no deadline for the passage of the local use tax. However, cities that did not receive voter approval for continuation of the local sales tax on motor vehicles, trailers and outboard motors will lose this revenue November of 2022 unless the city passes a local use tax.

Is the Missouri Department of Revenue currently collecting the local use tax and holding those funds for cities?

The local use tax is only imposed upon voter approval. The Missouri Department of Revenue (MoDOR) will not collect a local use tax until citizen's approval of the tax locally. Additionally, MoDOR is not holding any fund for cities to be turned over upon passage of the use tax.

What if the city's voters turn down the use tax?

If the voters of the city do not authorize a local sales tax, the legislative body of the city may submit the sales tax proposal again at a later election. There is no limitation as to how many times the local sales tax proposal may be submitted to the electorate.

When does a city use tax ordinance take effect?

If the city voters approve the local use tax, then the tax becomes effective on the first day of the calendar quarter which begins at least forty-five days after the Missouri Director of Revenue receives notice of adoption of the local use tax.

How is the tax collected?

The online or catalog vendor will collect the local use tax, along with the state use tax, and remit both to the Missouri Department of Revenue (MoDOR).



What does the state charge for the collection of the city use tax and how is the city tax accounted for?

The director of revenue is required to deposit all city use taxes collected in a special City Use Tax Trust Fund, less 1% for the cost of collection. The 1% deducted, less the cost of premiums on surety bonds, is deposited in the State General Revenue Fund. The director of revenue of the state is to keep an accurate record of the amount of money collected from each city.

How much will my city receive from a local use tax?

It is difficult to accurately estimate the prospective revenue from a local use tax. A rough estimate of prior gross sales recorded as a use tax transaction per city can be found at https://dor.mo.gov/public-reports/#pubtax.

What changes did the legislature make in the 2021 "Wayfair" legislation (SB 153)?

The major modifications the legislation made to Missouri's use tax law was to require all online and catalog vendors to collect and remit the local and state use tax, including those vendors that do not have a physical presence in the state. Also, online vendors who facilitate transaction for a third-party vendor must collect and remit local and state use taxes on those facilitated transactions. Essentially, the new law makes the collection and remittance of the use tax similar to the way the sales tax is collected and remitted to the Missouri Department of Revenue.

MML and the Municipal League of Metro St. Louis have collaborated on Use Tax *educational materials* for you to use in your city, and a separate *advocacy kit* for campaign committees.



- Funds generated will help pay for public safety, roads, sidewalks, parks, and emergency vehicles/ equipment.

Funds Community Services • Generates Local Revenue NOT A Double Tax!

What is a local Use Tax?

A Use Tax is a tax on the purchase of goods by Missouri residents from out-of-state vendors. Products exempt from the sales tax would be exempt from the Use Tax.

I already pay sales tax. Is this the same thing?

No. The sales tax applies to purchases made at local retailers within Missouri, while the Use Tax applies to purchases made from out-of-state vendors. Purchases cannot fall into both groups and cannot be taxed twice.

How can a Use Tax benefit my community?

As internet purchases increase, local revenues decrease. Funds generated from the Use Tax can be used to pay for vital municipal services including: public safety, additional sidewalks and parks, and emergency equipment.

What is the rate of the Use Tax?

The local Use Tax rate is the same rate as the local sales tax rate. If the local Sales Tax is reduced or raised by voter approval, the local Use Tax shall also be reduced or raised by the same action.

An ordinance of the City of, Missouri, imposing a use tax for general revenue purposes at the rate equal to the total local sales taxes in effect for the privilege of storing, using or consuming within the City any article of tangible personal property pursuant to the authority granted by and subject to the provisions of Sections 144.600 through 144.761 RSMo; providing for the use tax to be repealed, reduced or raised in the same amount as any city sales tax is repealed, reduced or raised; and providing for submission of the proposal to the qualified voters of the City for their approval at the (Special) (General) (Primary) election called and to be held in the City on , (Day), (Month), 20
WHEREAS, the City has imposed total local sales taxes, as defined in Section 32.085 RSMo, a the total rate of%; and
WHEREAS, the City is authorized, under Section 144.757 RSMo, to impose a local use tax at a rate equal to the rate of the total local sales taxes in effect in the City; and
WHEREAS, the proposed City use tax cannot become effective until approved by the voters at a municipal, county or state general, primary, or special election;
NOW, THEREFORE, be it ordained by the (City Council) (Board of Aldermen) (Board of Trustees) of (City), as follows:
Section 1. Pursuant to the authority granted by, and subject to, the provisions of Sections 144.600 through 144.761 RSMo, a use tax for general revenue purposes is imposed for the privilege of storing using or consuming within the City any article of tangible personal property. This tax does not apply with respect to the storage, use or consumption of any article of tangible personal property purchased produced or manufactured outside this state until the transportation of the article has finally come to reswithin this City or until the article has become commingled with the general mass of property of this City.

Section 2. The rate of the tax shall be equal to the total local sales tax in effect. If any city sales

tax is repealed or the rate thereof is reduced or raised by voter approval, the city use tax rate also shall be
deemed to be repealed, reduced or raised by the same action repealing, reducing or raising the city sales
tax.

boundaries thereof.

Section 390.010. Definitions. [Ord. No. 20.42, 8-20-2020]

As used in this Chapter, the following terms shall have the meanings indicated:

GOLF CART —

- 1. A motor vehicle that is designed and manufactured for operation on a golf course for sporting or recreational purposes and that is not capable of exceeding speeds of twenty (20) miles per hour. (304.034, RSMo.)
- 2. Golf carts operated on City streets shall conform to the following safety standards:
 - a. Headlamps when operating between sunset and sunrise.
 - b. Taillamps when operating between sunset and sunrise.
 - c. Reflex reflectors: one (1) red on each side as far to the rear as practicable, and one (1) red on the rear.
 - d. An exterior mirror mounted on the driver's side of the vehicle or an interior mirror.
 - e. A parking brake.
 - f. A horn or alert sound mechanism.
 - g. A bicycle safety flag, which extends not less than seven (7) feet above the ground, attached to the rear of the vehicle. The bicycle safety flag shall be triangular in shape with an area of not less than thirty (30) square inches and shall be day glow in color.

UTILITY VEHICLE —

1. Any motorized vehicle manufactured and used exclusively for off-highway use which is more than fifty (50) inches but no more than sixty-seven (67) inches in width, with an

unladen dry weight of two thousand (2,000) pounds or less, traveling on four (4) or six (6) wheels, to be used primarly for landscaping, lawn care, or maintenance purposes.

- 2. Utility vehicles operated on City streets shall conform to the following safety standards:
 - a. Headlamps when operating between sunset and sunrise.
 - b. Taillamps when operating between sunset and sunrise.
 - c. Reflex reflectors: one (1) red on each side as far to the rear as practicable, and one (1) red on the rear.
 - d. An exterior mirror mounted on the driver's side of the vehicle or an interior mirror.
 - e. A parking brake.
 - f. A horn or alert sound mechanism.
 - g. A bicycle safety flag, which extends not less than seven (7) feet above the ground, attached to the rear of the vehicle. The bicycle safety flag shall be triangular in shape with an area of not less than thirty (30) square inches and shall be dayglow in color.

Section 390.020. Requirements For Operating Golf Carts On City Streets, Roads Or Alleyways Within The City. [Ord. No. 20.42, 8-20-2020]

- A. No person shall operate a golf cart upon any City street unless all the following criteria are met:
 - 1. The golf cart shall be properly equipped pursuant to City ordinance, Section 390.010.
 - 2. Any individual operating a golf cart shall have a valid operator's or chauffeur's license.
 - 3. The golf cart shall be operated at a speed of no more than twenty (20) miles per hour.
 - 4. The operator of the golf cart shall use hand signals when executing turns/stops, unless the golf cart is equipped with turn signals and stop lamps.
 - 5. Every operator of a golf cart shall maintain financial responsibility on such golf cart as required by Chapter 303, RSMo., if the golf cart is operated on City Streets.
- B. No person shall operate a golf cart on City streets during any period when his or her operator's license is suspended or revoked.
- C. No person shall operate a golf cart on City streets between sunset and sunrise unless the golf cart is equipped with headlamps and taillamps.

Section 390.030. Prohibited Operation Of A Golf Cart. [Ord. No. 20.42, 8-20-2020]

- A. No individual operating a golf cart shall:
 - 1. Operate any golf cart on any roadway with a speed limit posted above thirty (30) miles per hour.
 - 2. Operate the golf cart in a careless or imprudent manner so as to endanger any person

or property of any person.

- 3. Operate the golf cart while under the influence of alcohol or a controlled substance.
- 4. Operate the golf cart on any Federal, State or county highways, except to cross.
- 5. No golf cart shall cross any Federal, State highway, or City street at an intersection where the highway being crossed has a posted speed limit of more than forty-five (45) miles per hour.
- B. Golf carts are prohibited on the following City streets:
 - 1. Nichols Road between Osage Beach Parkway and Dude Ranch Road.
 - 2. Passover Road between Osage Beach Parkway and Parkwood Circle.
 - 3. Bluff Drive between Osage Beach Parkway and Sunset Drive.

Section 390.040. Requirements For Operating A Utility Vehicle On City Streets, Roads Or Alleyways Within The City. [Ord. No. 20.42, 8-20-2020]

- A. No person shall operate a utility vehicle upon any City street unless all the following criteria are met:
 - 1. The utility vehicle shall be properly equipped pursuant to City Ordinance Section 390.010.
 - 2. Any individual operating a utility vehicle shall have a valid operator's or chauffeur's license.
 - 3. The utility vehicle shall be operated at a speed of equal to or less than the posted speed limit
 - 4. The operator of the utility vehicle shall use hand signals when executing turns/stops, unless the utility vehicle is equipped with turn signals and stop lamps.
 - 5. Every operator of a utility vehicle shall maintain financial responsibility on such utility vehicle as required by Chapter 303, RSMo., if the utility vehicle is operated on City streets.
- B. No person shall operate a utility vehicle on City streets during any period when his or her operator's license is suspended or revoked.
- C. No person shall operate a utility vehicle on City streets between sunset and sunrise unless the utility vehicle is equipped with headlamps and taillamps.

Section 390.050. through Section 390.060. (Reserved)

Section 390.070. Prohibited Operation In A Utility Vehicle. [Ord. No. 20.42, 8-20-2020]

- A. No individual operating a utility vehicle shall:
 - 1. Operate any utility vehicle on any roadway with a speed limit posted above thirty (30) miles per hour.

 - 2. Passover Road between Osage Beach Parkway and Parkwood Circle.
 - 3. Bluff Drive between Osage Beach Parkway and Sunset Drive.

Any person who violates any provisions of this Chapter shall be punishable under Section 100.190 of the Municipal Code of the City of Osage Beach, Missouri.
