AN ORDINANCE APPROVING A PETITION TO AMEND THE PETITION ESTABLISHING THE LAKEPORT VILLAGE COMMUNITY IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT.

WHEREAS, in accordance with Sections 67.1401 to 67.1571 of the Revised Statutes of Missouri (the "CID Act") and pursuant to Ordinance No. 23.76, the City of Osage Beach, Missouri (the "City"), previously established the Lakeport Village Community Improvement District (the "District"); and

WHEREAS, a Petition to Amend the Petition Establishing the District, and amendment thereto, copies of which is attached as <u>Exhibit A</u> hereto (collectively the "Amended Petition"), were submitted to the City requesting, among other things, that (1) the boundaries of the District be expanded to include additional property contiguous with the existing boundaries of the District (as further described in the Amended Petition, the "Additional Property"), (2) the existing special assessment be increased by amounts generated from certain additional methods of assessment (together, the "Special Assessment"), (3) the term of the sales and use tax currently imposed by the District (the "Sales Tax") be extended to December 31, 2051 and (4) the term of the District be extended to no later than March 20, 2052 to allow the District the opportunity to collect revenues of the Special Assessment and Sales Tax generated before December 31, 2051; and

WHEREAS, the City Clerk has verified that the Amended Petition is proper in that it meets all of the requirements of the CID Act; and

WHEREAS, on ______, 2025, the Board of Directors of the District adopted Resolution No. 25-_____ consenting to the addition of the Additional Property to the District; and

WHEREAS, on April 3, 2025, the Board of Aldermen held a duly-noticed public hearing at which all persons interested in the Amended Petition, including the proposed addition of the Additional Property to the District and the proposed extension of the term of the District, were allowed an opportunity to speak and at which time the Board of Aldermen heard all protests and received all endorsements; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Aldermen finds that notice of the Amended Petition, the proposed addition of the Additional Property to the District and the proposed extension of the term of the District, has been duly given in accordance with Sections 67.1431, 67.1441 and 67.1481.6 of the CID Act;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE CITY OF OSAGE BEACH, MISSOURI, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Approval of Amended Petition. The Amended Petition is hereby approved. The boundaries of the District are hereby amended to add the Additional Property to the District. Subject to further approvals by the District and its qualified voters, the District is authorized to extend the term of Sales Tax to December 31, 2051. Subject to further approvals by the District, the District is authorized to impose the Special Assessment at the rates and in the manner described in the Amended Petition. The District shall terminate no later than March 20, 2052.

- <u>Section 2</u>. <u>Notices by City Clerk</u>. The City Clerk is hereby directed to report to the Missouri Department of Economic Development and the State Auditor that the District has expanded its boundaries.
- Section 3. Further Authority. The officers, agents and employees of the City are hereby authorized and directed to execute all documents and take such actions as they may deem necessary or advisable to carry out and perform the purposes of this Ordinance. All actions taken to date by the officers of the City with respect to the Amended Petition, including, without limitation, the provision of notices for the public hearing regarding the Amended Petition, the addition of the Additional Property to the District and the extension of the term of the District, are hereby ratified.
- Section 4. Severability. The sections of this Ordinance shall be severable. If any section of this Ordinance is found by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, the remaining sections shall remain valid, unless the court finds that: (a) the valid sections are so essential to and inseparably connected with and dependent upon the void section that it cannot be presumed that the Board of Aldermen has or would have enacted the valid sections without the void one; and (b) the valid sections, standing alone, are incomplete and are incapable of being executed in accordance with the legislative intent.
- <u>Section 5.</u> <u>Effective Date.</u> This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after the date of passage and approval of the Mayor.

PETITION TO AMEND THE PETITION TO ESTABLISH THE LAKEPORT VILLAGE COMMUNITY IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT

Come now the undersigned property owners representing more than fifty percent (50%) by assessed value of all real property within the boundaries of the Lakeport Village Community Improvement District (the "District") and more than fifty percent (50%) per capita of all owners of real property within the boundaries of the District (the "Petitioner"), with the consent of the Board of Directors of the District, and by this Petition to Amend the Petition to Establish the Lakeport Village Community Improvement District (this "Amended Petition"), request the establishment of the District as set out in this Amended Petition and as allowed under the Community Improvement District Act, Sections 67.1401 to 67.1571 of the Revised Statutes of Missouri, as amended (the "Act").

The Petitioner requests that the City Clerk of the City of Osage Beach, Missouri (acting as the "municipal clerk" under the Act) review this Amended Petition (that amends that certain Petition to Establish the Lakeport Village Community Improvement District submitted to the City of Osage Beach, Missouri (the "City") on October 2, 2023 (the "Petition")) to certify that it complies with the requirements of Section 67.1441.2 of the Act and contains all required information. A copy of the Petition is attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference as Exhibit A. Capitalized terms not defined herein shall have the meanings set forth in the Petition.

The Petitioner requests that the governing body of the City (the "Board of Aldermen") hold a public hearing in accordance with Section 67.1431 of the Act to receive public comments concerning this Amended Petition, with notice of the hearing given in the same manner as required by Section 67.1431 of the Act.

The Petitioner requests that upon the conclusion of the required public hearing that an ordinance be adopted amending the District as requested and set out in this Amended Petition and in accordance with the Act.

1. DESCRIPTION OF THE DISTRICT

A. Creation and Establishment of the District

The District was created and established, pursuant to the terms set forth in the Petition and in accordance with the Act, by the Board of Aldermen's adoption of Ordinance Number 23.76 (the "Ordinance") on November 2, 2023. The District has, thereafter, continued in existence and operation, without interruption, and the Petition has not been previously amended or modified. A copy of the Ordinance is attached hereto as <u>Exhibit B</u> and incorporated herein by this reference.

A. Name of District

The name of the District is "Lakeport Village Community Improvement District" (the "District") and shall remain unchanged upon amendment by this Amended Petition.

B. <u>Legal Description</u>

The District, as approved by the Ordinance, includes all of the real property set forth in the legal description in <u>Exhibit C</u> of this Amended Petition labeled "Existing Land" (the "Existing Land") and, upon adoption of this Amended Petition, will also include certain real property to be added to the District set forth with particularity in the legal description in <u>Exhibit C</u> of this Amended Petition labeled "Added Property" (the "Added Property"). "District Property" as used in this Amended Petition, shall mean, collectively, the Existing Land and the Added Property of the District.

C. Boundary Map

A map illustrating the boundaries of the Added Property is attached hereto and made a part hereof as <u>Exhibit D</u>, and a map illustrating the amended boundaries of the District is attached hereto and made a part hereof as <u>Exhibit E</u>.

FIVE YEAR PLAN

A. Purpose of the District

The purposes of the District as set forth in the Petition shall remain unchanged upon adoption of this Amended Petition except that following adoption of the ordinance approving this Amended Petition, the District will be authorized to impose multiple special assessments in accordance with the Act and Section 5 hereof.

B. Services and Improvements

The Project, as defined, described and set forth in the Petition, shall remain unchanged upon adoption of this Amended Petition, except that a portion of the Project will be located on the Added Property.

The estimated costs of the Project to be incurred by or on behalf of the District within five (5) years from the date of adoption of an ordinance approving this Amended Petition are approximately Sixty One Million Seven Hundred Thirty One Thousand Nine Hundred Sixty Four and NO/100 Dollars (\$61,731,964.00), which excludes the cost of issuance related to the issuance of any District Obligations. CID Revenues may also be used to finance professional fees and expenses, underwriting, and issuance costs related to the District Obligations.

C. Budget

The budget of the District as set forth in the Petition, including the estimated costs, sources of such costs and terms of those sources, shall remain unchanged upon adoption of this Amended Petition, except that the District's sources of funds for reimbursement of the developer(s) shall include the Additional Special Assessments (defined below) in

addition to the Existing Special Assessment (defined below), the District may extend the District sales and use tax until December 31, 2051 as provided in Section 7 of this Amended Petition, and the estimated costs shall increase to the amount stated in Section 2.B of this Amended Petition.

D. Powers

The powers of the District as set forth in the Petition shall remain unchanged upon adoption of this Amended Petition.

3. GOVERNANCE OF THE DISTRICT

A. Type of District

The District shall remain a political subdivision and shall not operate as a not-for-profit corporation. The District shall continue to have all of the powers granted to and or exercisable by a Community Improvement District according to the Act except to the extent its powers are expressly limited by the Petition or this Amended Petition.

B. Board of Directors

1. Number

The number of members on the District's Board of Directors ("Board") as set forth in the Petition shall remain unchanged upon adoption of this Amended Petition.

2. Qualifications

The qualification requirements in the Petition for the District's five (5) member Board as set forth in the Petition shall remain unchanged upon adoption of this Amended Petition.

3. Board Representation

The Board representation requirements as set forth in the Petition shall remain unchanged upon adoption of this Amended Petition.

4. Terms of Initial Directors

The terms of initial directors as set forth in the Petition shall remain unchanged upon adoption of this Amended Petition.

5. Terms of Successor Directors

The terms of successor directors as set forth in the Petition shall remain unchanged upon adoption of this Amended Petition.

4. REAL PROPERTY TAXES

The District, following adoption of this Amended Petition, shall have no power to submit a real property tax to the qualified voters for approval; as such, the maximum rate of real property taxes imposed by the District on District Property is zero.

5. SPECIAL ASSESSMENTS

A. The District, in accordance with Section 67.1521 of the Act and pursuant to its Petition, has the power to impose a Special Assessment (the "Existing Special Assessment") upon all or a portion of the District Property as follows:

The maximum rate of the Existing Special Assessment and the respective method of assessment that may be proposed by a special assessment petition is \$5 per occupied Hotel room night on each tract, lot or parcel of real property containing a Hotel, such special assessment to be levied against each tract, lot or parcel of real property located within the District which receives special benefit as a result of such service and or projects. "Hotel" as used herein shall mean any hotel, hotel suite development, extended stay facility, motel, or inn, including but not limited to any facility which provides for the lodging of guests or invitees from the public, with or without meals being provided, and/or kept, used, maintained, advertised, or held out to the public as a place where sleeping accommodations are available for pay or compensation from transient guests.

- B. Following the adoption of the ordinance approving this Amended Petition, in accordance with Section 67.1521 of the Act and pursuant to this Amended Petition, the District shall have the power to increase the Existing Special Assessment by amounts generated from the following methods of assessment (the Existing Special Assessment, as modified to include the additional methods of assessment described below, is referred to herein as the "Special Assessment"):
 - a. A "Commercial Special Assessment" upon all or a portion of the District Property in the maximum rate of one dollar (\$1.00) for every one hundred dollars (\$100.00) of the assessed value determined by the Camden County Assessor for *ad valorem* tax purposes on each taxable tract, lot or parcel of real property containing a commercial use, such special assessment to be levied against each tract, lot or parcel of real property located within the District which receives special benefit as a result of such service and or projects. Notwithstanding the foregoing, the Commercial Special Assessment shall not be applicable to any tract, lot or parcel containing a publicly-owned parking garage.

- b. A "Hotel Special Assessment" in the maximum rate of 4% of the gross revenue generated from charges for Hotel rooms, on each tract, lot or parcel of real property containing a Hotel, such special assessment to be levied against each tract, lot or parcel of real property located within the District which receives special benefit as a result of such service and or projects. "Hotel" as used herein shall mean any hotel, hotel suite development, extended stay facility, motel, or inn, including but not limited to any facility which provides for the lodging of guests or invitees from the public, with or without meals being provided, and/or kept, used, maintained, advertised, or held out to the public as a place where sleeping accommodations are available for pay or compensation from transient guests.
- c. An "Amusement Park Tickets Special Assessment" in the maximum amount of 1.5% of the gross revenue generated from charges for tickets, passes, or wristbands permitting the use of a ride, water slide, water pool, or any combination thereof, located within an amusement park or water park, on each taxable tract, lot or parcel of real property containing an amusement park or water park, such special assessment to be levied against each taxable tract, lot or parcel of real property located within the District which receives special benefit as a result of such service and or projects.
- d. A "Minimum Assessed Value Special Assessment" in the maximum annual amounts for Class A, where the predominate use of the applicable taxable tract is a hotel, and the maximum annual amounts for Class B, where the predominate use of the applicable taxable tract is an amusement or a water park, shown on Schedule 1 attached hereto, on each taxable tract, lot or parcel of real property containing a commercial use, such special assessment to be levied against each taxable tract, lot or parcel of real property located within the District which receives special benefit as a result of such service and or Notwithstanding the foregoing, the Minimum Assessed Value Special Assessment shall not be applicable to any tract, lot or parcel containing a publicly-owned parking garage. Furthermore, the petition to impose the Special Assessment shall limit the imposition of the Minimum Assessed Value Special Assessment to the difference between the maximum annual amounts for Classes A and B stated above, and the sum of the amount of payments in lieu of taxes plus the Commercial Special Assessment due for the applicable assessed parcels by operation of Section 99.845, RSMo. and any ad valorem real property taxes due for the applicable assessed parcels.

The Special Assessment may be imposed in each year through calendar year 2051 unless otherwise limited in the petition to impose the Special Assessment.

6. ASSESSED VALUE

As of the date of this Amended Petition, the total assessed value of the Added Property is \$409,160, according to the records of the City of Camden County Collector's Office.

Upon approval of this Amended Petition, the total assessed value of all real property located within the District will be \$955,120.

7. SALES TAXES

The District, in accordance with Section 67.1545 of the Act and pursuant to its Petition, has the power to impose a District sales and use tax on all retail sales made within the District which are subject to taxation pursuant to Sections 144.010 to 144.525 of the Revised Statutes of Missouri (excepting such sales as set forth in the Act), at a rate not to exceed one percent (1%) in accordance with the Act and that shall remain unchanged upon adoption of this Amended Petition.

In accordance with the Act and Resolution 2023-11, the Board submitted to the qualified voters within the District a proposal to authorize a sales and use tax and a majority of the qualified voters within the District approved the imposition of the sales and use tax. Pursuant to Resolution 2023-11 the District currently imposes a 1% sales and use tax on all retail sales that is currently set to expire on June 30, 2051. Upon the extension of the District pursuant to the approval of this Amended Petition, the District may extend the District sales and use tax until December 31, 2051, subject to the approval of a majority of the qualified voters within the District.

8. LIFE OF DISTRICT

Pursuant to the Petition, the term of the District ends on October 19, 2050. The Petitioner proposes that the term of the District be extended to no later than March 20, 2052 to allow the District the opportunity to collect District taxes and assessments generated before December 31, 2051 and otherwise wind up its affairs.

9. BLIGHT DETERMINATION

This Amended Petition does not include a request for a determination of blight for any real property within the District.

10. NOTICE TO PETITIONERS

The signature of the undersigned may not be withdrawn later than seven (7) days after this Amended Petition is filed with the City Clerk of the City of Osage Beach, Missouri.

11. BORROWING CAPACITY AND REVENUE GENERATION

The District shall have all powers and authority to borrow money and generate revenue as set forth in the Petition, which shall remain unchanged upon adoption of this Amended Petition.

12. DISTRICT POWER

Except as limited by the Petition or this Amended Petition, there shall be no limitations on the District's powers, and the District shall have all powers granted under the Act.

13. SEVERABILITY

If any provision of this Amended Petition shall be held or determined to be invalid, inoperative or unenforceable as applied in any particular case, or in all cases, because it conflicts with any other provision or provisions of this Amended Petition or for any other reason, such circumstances shall not have the effect of rendering the provision in question inoperative or unenforceable in any other case or circumstance, or of rendering any other provision contained in this Amended Petition invalid, inoperative or unenforceable to any extent whatsoever.

Further, and without limiting the foregoing, if any component of the Special Assessment shall be held or determined to be invalid, inoperative or unenforceable as applied in any particular case, or in all cases, because it conflicts with any other provision or provisions of this Amended Petition or for any other reason, such circumstances shall not have the effect of rendering the component in question inoperative or unenforceable in any other case or circumstance, or of rendering any other component of the Special Assessment invalid, inoperative or unenforceable to any extent whatsoever.

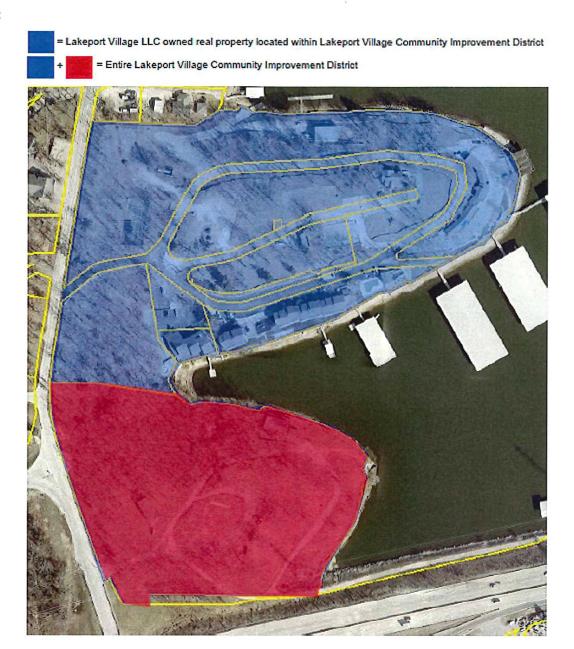

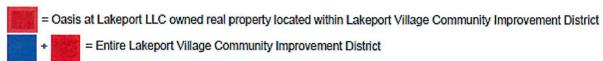

PETITION TO ESTABLISH LAKEPORT VILLAGE COMMUNITY IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT

This Petition ("Petition") to establish a Community Improvement District within a certain limited portion of the City of Osage Beach, Missouri (the "City"), is hereby submitted to the City in accordance with the Community Improvement District Act as set forth in Sections 67.1401 through 67.1571 of the Revised Statutes of Missouri, as amended (the "Act").

As set forth herein, LAKEPORT VILLAGE LLC (the "Petitioner") is signing this Petition in accordance with the Act to request that the governing body of the City (the "Board of Aldermen") hold a public hearing and approve the Petition and establish the Community Improvement District as described herein and in accordance with the Act.

1. DESCRIPTION OF THE DISTRICT

A. Name of District

The name of the district shall be the "Lakeport Village Community Improvement District" (the "District").

B. <u>Legal Description</u>

The District includes all of the real property (the "District Property") legally described on Exhibit A attached hereto and made a part hereof.

C. Boundary Map

A map illustrating the boundaries of the District is attached hereto and made a part hereof as Exhibit B (the "District Boundary Map").

2. PETITIONER

Based on the tax records of Camden County as of the date of filing this Petition, Petitioner:

- (a) owns more than fifty percent (50%) by assessed value of the District Property; and
- (b) represents more than fifty percent (50%) per capita of all owners of the District Property.

3. FIVE-YEAR PLAN

The five-year plan for the District shall include, but is not necessarily limited to, the following:

A. <u>Purposes of the District</u>

The primary purpose of the District is to provide a source of revenue to expend pursuant to one or more contracts with one or more developers (the "Developers") to undertake a project on behalf of the District (the "Project"), which Project is expected to include the demolition and removal of existing buildings or structures within the District, the construction and installation of public improvements, including, but not limited to, sidewalks, streets, alleys, ramps, traffic signs and signals, utilities, drainage, water, sanitary sewer systems, and other site improvements, parking lots, garages or other facilities, and any other useful, necessary, or desired public improvements within the District.

Additionally, the purposes of the District are to:

- (a) Pledge all or a portion of its revenues to one or more notes, bonds, or other obligations, which may be issued by the District or another public body (collectively, the "District Obligations") and are secured by the tax revenues and special assessments of the District (the "CID Revenues"), the proceeds of said District Obligations to be used toward the payment of costs and fees of the Project, the costs of issuing the District Obligations, and to refund prior District Obligations;
- (b) Enter into one or more contracts or agreements in order to complete or cause the completion of the Project and other purposes of the District;
- (c) Levy a retail sales and use tax in accordance with the Act (the "District Sales Tax");
- (d) Impose a special assessment in accordance with the Act (the "Special Assessment");
- (e) Use a portion of CID Revenues to pay the administrative costs of the District; and
- (f) Exercise any authorized purpose of the District pursuant to and in accordance with the Act.

The District may also acquire real and personal property within the District and lease or otherwise encumber or dispose of real and personal property within the District in accordance with the Act.

B. Estimate of Costs of Services and Improvements

The estimated costs of the Project to be incurred by or on behalf of the District within five (5) years from the date of adoption of an ordinance creating the District are approximately Nine Million Seventy-Two Thousand and Fifty Nine

Dollars (\$9,072,059.00), which excludes the cost of issuance related to the issuance of any District Obligations. CID Revenues may also be used to finance professional fees and expenses, underwriting, and issuance costs related to the District Obligations.

C. Anticipated Sources of Funds to Pay Costs and Anticipated Term of the Sources

The District intends to enter into an agreement among the District, the City and one or more developers of real property within the District, pursuant to which the developer(s) will advance the costs of the Project subject to reimbursement from revenues generated by the CID Sales Tax and Special Assessment or the proceeds of District Obligations. Such District Obligations will be repaid from CID Revenues. The anticipated sources of funds to pay the cost of the Project are the CID Revenues. The anticipated term of the CID Revenues is twenty-seven (27) years from the adoption of the ordinance establishing the District, unless extended.

D. Powers

The District shall have the powers provided for in the Act, subject to the limitations set forth herein.

E. Annual Benchmarks for the Five-Year Plan

The following annual benchmarks represent the anticipated schedule of the District and are subject to change.

2023

- Approval of ordinance establishing the District.
- Effective as of the date of the ordinance establishing the District, appointment of its Board (as hereinafter defined) and approval of District Sales Tax.
- Commence the Project.

2024

- Project continues.
- Implement and collect District Sales Tax.
- Implement and collect Special Assessment.

2025

- Project continues.
- Collect and administer District Sales Tax.
- Collect and administer Special Assessment.
- Issue District Obligations to the extent of completion of an applicable phase.

- Repay District Obligations, to the extent issued.
- To the extent necessary, provide support for the Project.

2026

- Project continues.
- Collect and administer District Sales Tax.
- Collect and administer Special Assessment.
- Issue District Obligations to the extent of completion of an applicable phase.
- Repay District Obligations, to the extent issued.
- To the extent necessary, provide support for the Project.

2027

- Completion of the Project.
- Collect and administer District Sales Tax.
- Collect and administer Special Assessment.
- Issue District Obligations to the extent of completion of an applicable phase.
- Repay District Obligations.

4. GOVERNANCE OF THE DISTRICT

A. Type of District

The District shall be a separate political subdivision governed by a board of directors (the "Board") and shall have all of the powers authorized and/or granted by the Act.

B. Board of Directors

1. Number

The District shall be governed by a Board consisting of five (5) directors (the "Directors" and each a "Director").

2. Qualifications

Each Director, during his or her term, shall meet the following requirements:

- (a) be a citizen of the United States of America;
- (b) be a Missouri resident for at least one year prior to appointment to the Board;
- (c) be at least 18 years of age; and

(d) be an owner of District Property ("Owner") or its legally authorized representative, provided that, if at the time of appointment of the initial Board or any submittal of a slate of successor Directors, any one Owner owns more than fifty percent (50%) of the District Property (the "Majority Owner") as calculated based on the acreage on record with the Camden County Assessor's Office (the "Assessor"), then any Directors appointed shall be legally authorized representatives of the Majority Owner.

3. Initial Board of Directors

The initial Directors shall be appointed by the Mayor of Osage Beach (the "Mayor") with the consent of the Board of Aldermen to serve the following staggered terms, all in accordance with Section 67.1451.5 of the Act:

Second	Four (4) Years	
Third	Two (2) Years	
Fourth	Two (2) Years	
Fifth	Two (2) Years	

Two of the initial Directors shall be representatives of the Petitioner. Upon expiration of the terms of the initial Directors, successive Directors shall, subject to Section 4 below, be appointed by the Mayor with the consent of the Board of Aldermen in accordance with the Act. Successor Directors shall serve four (4) year terms on the Board; provided, however, each Director shall serve until such Director's successor is appointed in the manner described below and qualified.

4. Board Representation

In addition to the foregoing qualifications set forth in this Section 4, in order to ensure fair representation of the District, the Board representation shall include three persons designated by the Mayor, at least one of which will satisfy the requirements of Section 67.1451.2(3) of the Act, and two persons designated by Petitioner so long as (i) Petitioner owns District Property or has a business operating within the District and (ii) District Obligations remain outstanding. In the event that either (i) or (ii) are not satisfied, then in such event the Majority Owner, if any, shall designated the two persons, and if there is not a Majority Owner, one person designated by each of the two largest owners of District Property according to the Assessor's records.

5. REAL PROPERTY TAXES

The District shall have no power to levy a real property tax upon District Property; as such, the maximum rate of real property taxes within the District is zero.

6. SPECIAL ASSESSMENTS

In accordance with Section 67.1521 of the Act, the proposed District shall have the power to levy a Special Assessment upon all or a portion of District Property as follows:

The maximum rate of the Special Assessment and the respective method of assessment that may be proposed by a special assessment petition is \$5 per occupied Hotel room night on each tract, lot or parcel of real property containing a Hotel, such special assessment to be levied against each tract, lot or parcel of real property located within the proposed District which receives special benefit as a result of such service and or projects. "Hotel" as used herein shall mean any hotel, hotel suite development, extended stay facility, motel, or inn, including but not limited to any facility which provides for the lodging of guests or invitees from the public, with or without meals being provided, and/or kept, used, maintained, advertised, or held out to the public as a place where sleeping accommodations are available for pay or compensation from transient guests.

7. ASSESSED VALUE

As of the date of this Petition, the total assessed value of the District Property is Five Hundred Forty-Six Thousand One Hundred Twenty Dollars (\$546,120.00) according to the most recent final (2022) assessed values located in the records of the Assessor, as set forth below.

8. SALES TAXES

Pursuant to Section 67.1545 of the Act, the District may, by resolution, impose a District sales and use tax on all retail sales made within the District which are subject to taxation

pursuant to Sections 144.010 to 144.525 of the Revised Statutes of Missouri (excepting such sales as set forth in the Act), at a rate not to exceed one percent (1%), subject to voter approval as set forth in Section 67.1545.

9. BLIGHT DETERMINATION

This Petition seeks a determination that all or a portion of the District Property is a blighted area, as defined in Section 67.1401.2(3) of the Act, as more fully described within that certain Lakeport Village Tax Increment Financing Redevelopment Plan, dated April 17, 2023.

10. LIFE OF DISTRICT

Petitioner requests that the proposed District exist for a maximum of twenty-seven (27) years from the effective date of the ordinance approving this Petition as provided in Section 67.1481.1 of the Act.

11. REQUEST TO ESTABLISH DISTRICT

By execution and submission of this Petition, the Petitioner requests that the Board of Aldermen hold a public hearing in accordance with Section 67.1421 of the Act and adopt an ordinance to establish the District as set out in this Petition and in accordance with the Act and this Petition.

12. NOTICE TO PETITIONER

The signature of the undersigned may not be withdrawn later than seven (7) days after this Petition is filed with the City Clerk.

13. BORROWING CAPACITY AND REVENUE GENERATION

The District shall have all powers and authority provided in the Act to borrow revenue in order to complete the Project and to provide services and complete such improvements as are necessary and desirable to the District. The District shall have the authority, as set forth above, to levy the District Sales Tax in accordance with the Act in order to generate revenue for the District. Petitioner does not seek to limit the borrowing capacity or revenue generation of the District and anticipates the pledge of CID Revenues to District Obligations issued to fund the Project or other purposes of the District as set forth in this Petition.

14. DISTRICT POWERS

There shall be no other limitations on the District's powers, and the District shall have all powers granted under the Act.

AN ORDINANCE APPROVING A PETITION TO ESTABLISH THE LAKEPORT VILLAGE COMMUNITY IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT AND AUTHORIZING AND DIRECTING FURTHER ACTIONS IN CONNECTION THEREWITH.

WHEREAS, Sections 67.1401 to 67.1571 of the Revised Statutes of Missouri (the "CID Act") authorize the governing body of any municipality, upon a proper petition requesting formation and after a public hearing, to adopt an ordinance establishing a community improvement district; and

WHEREAS, the City received a petition to establish the Lakeport Village Community Improvement District on May 5, 2023 and its Board of Aldermen held a first reading of Bill No. 23-45 approving said petition on May 18, 2023, which was unanimously approved; and

WHEREAS, the applicant for said petition thereafter indicated it wished to amend its petition and the city has taken on further action on Bill No. 23-45; and

WHEREAS, the City has received an updated Petition to Establish the Lakeport Village Community Improvement District attached hereto as <u>Exhibit A</u> (the "CID Petition"), which seeks to establish the Lakeport Village Community Improvement District (the "CID") on certain property located northeast of the Jefferies Road and U.S. Route 54 interchange; and

WHEREAS, the City Clerk has verified the CID Petition complies with the CID Act; and

WHEREAS, the City held a duly-noticed public hearing on October 19, 2023, at which all persons interested in the formation of the CID were allowed an opportunity to speak and the Board of Aldermen heard all protests and received all endorsements;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE CITY OF OSAGE BEACH, MISSOURI, AS FOLLOWS:

- Section 1. Creation of CID. The Lakeport Village Community Improvement District is hereby created within the City as a political subdivision of the State of Missouri having the powers and purposes set forth in the CID Petition. The CID shall include the contiguous tracts of real estate described in Exhibit A of the CID Petition. Subject to further approvals by the CID and its qualified voters, the CID is authorized to impose a sales tax, as described in the CID Petition. Subject to further approvals by the CID, the CID is also authorized to impose a special assessment, as described in the CID Petition.
- <u>Section 2</u>. <u>CID Term.</u> The term of the existence of the CID shall be 27 years beginning on the effective date of this Ordinance.
- Section 3. <u>CID Board of Directors</u>. The CID shall be governed by a board of directors consisting of five (5) members hereafter appointed by the Mayor with the consent of the Board of Aldermen in accordance with the CID Act, subject to the qualifications set forth in the CID Petition. The initial members of the CID's board of directors are hereby appointed as follows:

Fred M. Ross, Jr.	4 years
Michael Harmison	2 years
Jeana Woods	2 years
Richard Ross	2 years

Successor members of the CID's board of directors shall be appointed for four-year terms.

<u>Section 4.</u> <u>Notice to Department of Economic Development.</u> The City Clerk is hereby directed to prepare and file with the Missouri Department of Economic Development the report specified in Section 67.1421.6 of the CID Act.

Section 5. <u>Disapproval of Bill 23-45.</u> The Board of Aldermen hereby disapproves of Bill 23-45 approving the previous version of this Petition and such Bill shall have no force or effect because Bill 23-24 never became an ordinance.

Section 6. Further Authority. The officers of the City are hereby authorized and directed to execute all documents and take such actions as they may deem necessary or advisable to carry out and perform the purposes of this Ordinance and to make ministerial alterations, changes or additions to the documents herein approved, authorized and confirmed which they may approve, and the execution of such action shall be conclusive evidence of such necessity or advisability. All actions taken to date by the officers of the City with respect to the CID Petition and the CID, including, without limitation, the provision of notices for the public hearing regarding the creation of the CID, are hereby ratified.

Section 7. Severability. The sections of this Ordinance shall be severable. If any section of this Ordinance is found by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, the remaining sections shall remain valid, unless the court finds that: (a) the valid sections are so essential to and inseparably connected with and dependent upon the void section that it cannot be presumed that the Board of Aldermen has or would have enacted the valid sections without the void one; and (b) the valid sections, standing alone, are incomplete and are incapable of being executed in accordance with the legislative intent.

Section 8. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after the date of passage and approval of the Mayor.

PETITION TO ESTABLISH LAKEPORT VILLAGE COMMUNITY IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT

This Petition ("Petition") to establish a Community Improvement District within a certain limited portion of the City of Osage Beach, Missouri (the "City"), is hereby submitted to the City in accordance with the Community Improvement District Act as set forth in Sections 67.1401 through 67.1571 of the Revised Statutes of Missouri, as amended (the "Act").

As set forth herein, LAKEPORT VILLAGE LLC (the "Petitioner") is signing this Petition in accordance with the Act to request that the governing body of the City (the "Board of Aldermen") hold a public hearing and approve the Petition and establish the Community Improvement District as described herein and in accordance with the Act.

1. DESCRIPTION OF THE DISTRICT

A. Name of District

The name of the district shall be the "Lakeport Village Community Improvement District" (the "District").

B. <u>Legal Description</u>

The District includes all of the real property (the "District Property") legally described on Exhibit A attached hereto and made a part hereof.

C. Boundary Map

A map illustrating the boundaries of the District is attached hereto and made a part hereof as Exhibit B (the "District Boundary Map").

2. PETITIONER

Based on the tax records of Camden County as of the date of filing this Petition, Petitioner:

- (a) owns more than fifty percent (50%) by assessed value of the District Property;
- (b) represents more than fifty percent (50%) per capita of all owners of the District Property.

3. FIVE-YEAR PLAN

The five-year plan for the District shall include, but is not necessarily limited to, the following:

A. Purposes of the District

The primary purpose of the District is to provide a source of revenue to expend pursuant to one or more contracts with one or more developers (the "Developers") to undertake a project on behalf of the District (the "Project"), which Project is expected to include the demolition and removal of existing buildings or structures within the District, the construction and installation of public improvements, including, but not limited to, sidewalks, streets, alleys, ramps, traffic signs and signals, utilities, drainage, water, sanitary sewer systems, and other site improvements, parking lots, garages or other facilities, and any other useful, necessary, or desired public improvements within the District.

Additionally, the purposes of the District are to:

- (a) Pledge all or a portion of its revenues to one or more notes, bonds, or other obligations, which may be issued by the District or another public body (collectively, the "District Obligations") and are secured by the tax revenues and special assessments of the District (the "CID Revenues"), the proceeds of said District Obligations to be used toward the payment of costs and fees of the Project, the costs of issuing the District Obligations, and to refund prior District Obligations;
- (b) Enter into one or more contracts or agreements in order to complete or cause the completion of the Project and other purposes of the District;
- (c) Levy a retail sales and use tax in accordance with the Act (the "District Sales Tax");
- (d) Impose a special assessment in accordance with the Act (the "Special Assessment");
- (e) Use a portion of CID Revenues to pay the administrative costs of the District; and
- (f) Exercise any authorized purpose of the District pursuant to and in accordance with the Act.

The District may also acquire real and personal property within the District and lease or otherwise encumber or dispose of real and personal property within the District in accordance with the Act.

B. Estimate of Costs of Services and Improvements

The estimated costs of the Project to be incurred by or on behalf of the District within five (5) years from the date of adoption of an ordinance creating the District are approximately Nine Million Seventy-Two Thousand and Fifty Nine

Dollars (\$9,072,059.00), which excludes the cost of issuance related to the issuance of any District Obligations. CID Revenues may also be used to finance professional fees and expenses, underwriting, and issuance costs related to the District Obligations.

C. Anticipated Sources of Funds to Pay Costs and Anticipated Term of the Sources

The District intends to enter into an agreement among the District, the City and one or more developers of real property within the District, pursuant to which the developer(s) will advance the costs of the Project subject to reimbursement from revenues generated by the CID Sales Tax and Special Assessment or the proceeds of District Obligations. Such District Obligations will be repaid from CID Revenues. The anticipated sources of funds to pay the cost of the Project are the CID Revenues. The anticipated term of the CID Revenues is twenty-seven (27) years from the adoption of the ordinance establishing the District, unless extended.

D. Powers

The District shall have the powers provided for in the Act, subject to the limitations set forth herein.

E. Annual Benchmarks for the Five-Year Plan

The following annual benchmarks represent the anticipated schedule of the District and are subject to change.

2023

- Approval of ordinance establishing the District.
- Effective as of the date of the ordinance establishing the District, appointment of its Board (as hereinafter defined) and approval of District Sales Tax.
- Commence the Project.

2024

- Project continues.
- Implement and collect District Sales Tax.
- Implement and collect Special Assessment.

2025

- Project continues.
- Collect and administer District Sales Tax.
- Collect and administer Special Assessment.
- Issue District Obligations to the extent of completion of an applicable phase.

- Repay District Obligations, to the extent issued.
- To the extent necessary, provide support for the Project.

2026

- Project continues.
- Collect and administer District Sales Tax.
- Collect and administer Special Assessment.
- Issue District Obligations to the extent of completion of an applicable phase.
- Repay District Obligations, to the extent issued.
- To the extent necessary, provide support for the Project.

2027

- Completion of the Project.
- Collect and administer District Sales Tax.
- Collect and administer Special Assessment.
- Issue District Obligations to the extent of completion of an applicable phase.
- Repay District Obligations.

4. GOVERNANCE OF THE DISTRICT

A. Type of District

The District shall be a separate political subdivision governed by a board of directors (the "Board") and shall have all of the powers authorized and/or granted by the Act.

B. Board of Directors

1. Number

The District shall be governed by a Board consisting of five (5) directors (the "Directors" and each a "Director").

2. Qualifications

Each Director, during his or her term, shall meet the following requirements:

- (a) be a citizen of the United States of America;
- (b) be a Missouri resident for at least one year prior to appointment to the Board;
- (c) be at least 18 years of age; and

(d) be an owner of District Property ("Owner") or its legally authorized representative, provided that, if at the time of appointment of the initial Board or any submittal of a slate of successor Directors, any one Owner owns more than fifty percent (50%) of the District Property (the "Majority Owner") as calculated based on the acreage on record with the Camden County Assessor's Office (the "Assessor"), then any Directors appointed shall be legally authorized representatives of the Majority Owner.

3. <u>Initial Board of Directors</u>

The initial Directors shall be appointed by the Mayor of Osage Beach (the "Mayor") with the consent of the Board of Aldermen to serve the following staggered terms, all in accordance with Section 67.1451.5 of the Act:

Director:	Term:
First	Four (4) Years
Second	Four (4) Years
Third	Two (2) Years
Fourth	Two (2) Years
Fifth	Two (2) Years

Two of the initial Directors shall be representatives of the Petitioner. Upon expiration of the terms of the initial Directors, successive Directors shall, subject to Section 4 below, be appointed by the Mayor with the consent of the Board of Aldermen in accordance with the Act. Successor Directors shall serve four (4) year terms on the Board; provided, however, each Director shall serve until such Director's successor is appointed in the manner described below and qualified.

4. Board Representation

In addition to the foregoing qualifications set forth in this Section 4, in order to ensure fair representation of the District, the Board representation shall include three persons designated by the Mayor, at least one of which will satisfy the requirements of Section 67.1451.2(3) of the Act, and two persons designated by Petitioner so long as (i) Petitioner owns District Property or has a business operating within the District and (ii) District Obligations remain outstanding. In the event that either (i) or (ii) are not satisfied, then in such event the Majority Owner, if any, shall designated the two persons, and if there is not a Majority Owner, one person designated by each of the two largest owners of District Property according to the Assessor's records.

5. REAL PROPERTY TAXES

The District shall have no power to levy a real property tax upon District Property; as such, the maximum rate of real property taxes within the District is zero.

6. SPECIAL ASSESSMENTS

In accordance with Section 67.1521 of the Act, the proposed District shall have the power to levy a Special Assessment upon all or a portion of District Property as follows:

The maximum rate of the Special Assessment and the respective method of assessment that may be proposed by a special assessment petition is \$5 per occupied Hotel room night on each tract, lot or parcel of real property containing a Hotel, such special assessment to be levied against each tract, lot or parcel of real property located within the proposed District which receives special benefit as a result of such service and or projects. "Hotel" as used herein shall mean any hotel, hotel suite development, extended stay facility, motel, or inn, including but not limited to any facility which provides for the lodging of guests or invitees from the public, with or without meals being provided, and/or kept, used, maintained, advertised, or held out to the public as a place where sleeping accommodations are available for pay or compensation from transient guests.

7. ASSESSED VALUE

As of the date of this Petition, the total assessed value of the District Property is Five Hundred Forty-Six Thousand One Hundred Twenty Dollars (\$546,120.00) according to the most recent final (2022) assessed values located in the records of the Assessor. as set forth below.

8. SALES TAXES

Pursuant to Section 67.1545 of the Act, the District may, by resolution, impose a District sales and use tax on all retail sales made within the District which are subject to taxation

pursuant to Sections 144.010 to 144.525 of the Revised Statutes of Missouri (excepting such sales as set forth in the Act), at a rate not to exceed one percent (1%), subject to voter approval as set forth in Section 67.1545.

9. BLIGHT DETERMINATION

This Petition seeks a determination that all or a portion of the District Property is a blighted area, as defined in Section 67.1401.2(3) of the Act, as more fully described within that certain Lakeport Village Tax Increment Financing Redevelopment Plan, dated April 17, 2023.

10. LIFE OF DISTRICT

Petitioner requests that the proposed District exist for a maximum of twenty-seven (27) years from the effective date of the ordinance approving this Petition as provided in Section 67.1481.1 of the Act.

11. REQUEST TO ESTABLISH DISTRICT

By execution and submission of this Petition, the Petitioner requests that the Board of Aldermen hold a public hearing in accordance with Section 67.1421 of the Act and adopt an ordinance to establish the District as set out in this Petition and in accordance with the Act and this Petition.

12. NOTICE TO PETITIONER

The signature of the undersigned may not be withdrawn later than seven (7) days after this Petition is filed with the City Clerk.

13. BORROWING CAPACITY AND REVENUE GENERATION

The District shall have all powers and authority provided in the Act to borrow revenue in order to complete the Project and to provide services and complete such improvements as are necessary and desirable to the District. The District shall have the authority, as set forth above, to levy the District Sales Tax in accordance with the Act in order to generate revenue for the District. Petitioner does not seek to limit the borrowing capacity or revenue generation of the District and anticipates the pledge of CID Revenues to District Obligations issued to fund the Project or other purposes of the District as set forth in this Petition.

14. DISTRICT POWERS

There shall be no other limitations on the District's powers, and the District shall have all powers granted under the Act.

This agenda item presents two options to address the recent discussion around pressure-reducing valves (PRVs).

The ordinance requires the City assume responsibility for PRVs at no cost to the customer, with the consequence that the City is now assuming responsibility for pressure. Staff has checked with other municipalities and we can find no other utility which takes on this responsibility. MPR also expressed serious concern at this option. Therefore, staff does NOT recommend approval of this ordinance.

The second option is an update to what was presented at the last discussion. This continues complimentary PRVs through the end of this year or until we run out of PRVs, whichever is longer. This option leaves the ordinance alone, making pressure the homeowner's responsibility, while phasing out the City's involvement in the PRV business. If the ordinance fails, staff will implement this option.

City Attorney Comments:

Per City Code 110.230, Bill 25-30 is in correct form.

City Administrator Comments:

As requested, the amended Ordinance puts into place that the City will install and maintain Pressure Reducing Valves at the City's expense. Caleb has done a lot of research by calling other communities (Lebanon, Branson, Jefferson City, Springfield, Columbia, Lake Ozark, Laclede County, Cole County and Camden County) and has determined that most of them do not have an ordinance regarding regulating pressure. They typically follow DNR regulations on providing the minimum standard of pressure. I do not recommend approval of this Ordinance for the following reasons:

- 1. As our community ages, the replacement of these devices will increase, causing a financial burden to future budgets.
- 2. Commercial PRV's typically must be replaced more frequently than residential which will not be equitable to all citizens.
- 3. This opens the City up to additional insurance claims if a PRV fails and causes damage inside or outside the structure.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF OSAGE BEACH, MISSOURI, AMENDING CHAPTER 705 WATERWORKS, SECTION 705.090. PRESSURE AND CONTINUITY.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE CITY OF OSAGE BEACH, MISSOURI, AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1</u>. That the section entitled Osage Beach amendments as set forth below with new material set out in **RED** and deleted material struck as follows:

- A. The City does not guarantee a sufficient or uniform pressure, or an uninterrupted supply of water, and customers are cautioned to provide sufficient storage of water where an absolutely uninterrupted supply must be ensured, such as for steam boilers, domestic hot water, etc.
- B. In areas where pressure is low, the customer shall, if he/she desires a higher pressure than furnished at the mains of the City, install at his/her own expense a tank or booster pump, of a type approved by the Building Official.
- C. Where the pressure to a customer's premises is greater than he/she wishes, it shall be their responsibility to install the proper regulating device to reduce the pressure to the extent desired the City will install and maintain such devices at the customer's request.
- D. The City shall have the right to require the adjustment, modification, or removal of any quick opening or closing valve or other device installed in a premises, the operation of which results in an unreasonable fluctuation of pressure or damage in the City's water system.

Section 2. That this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect upon date of passage and approval by the Mayor.

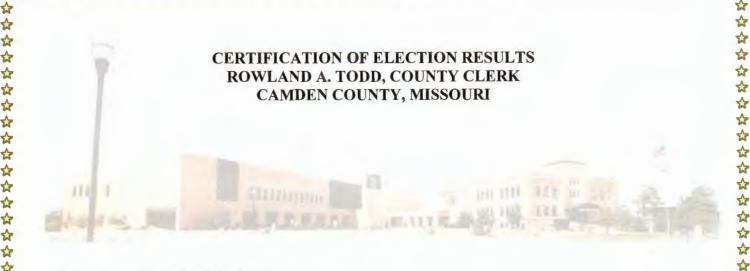

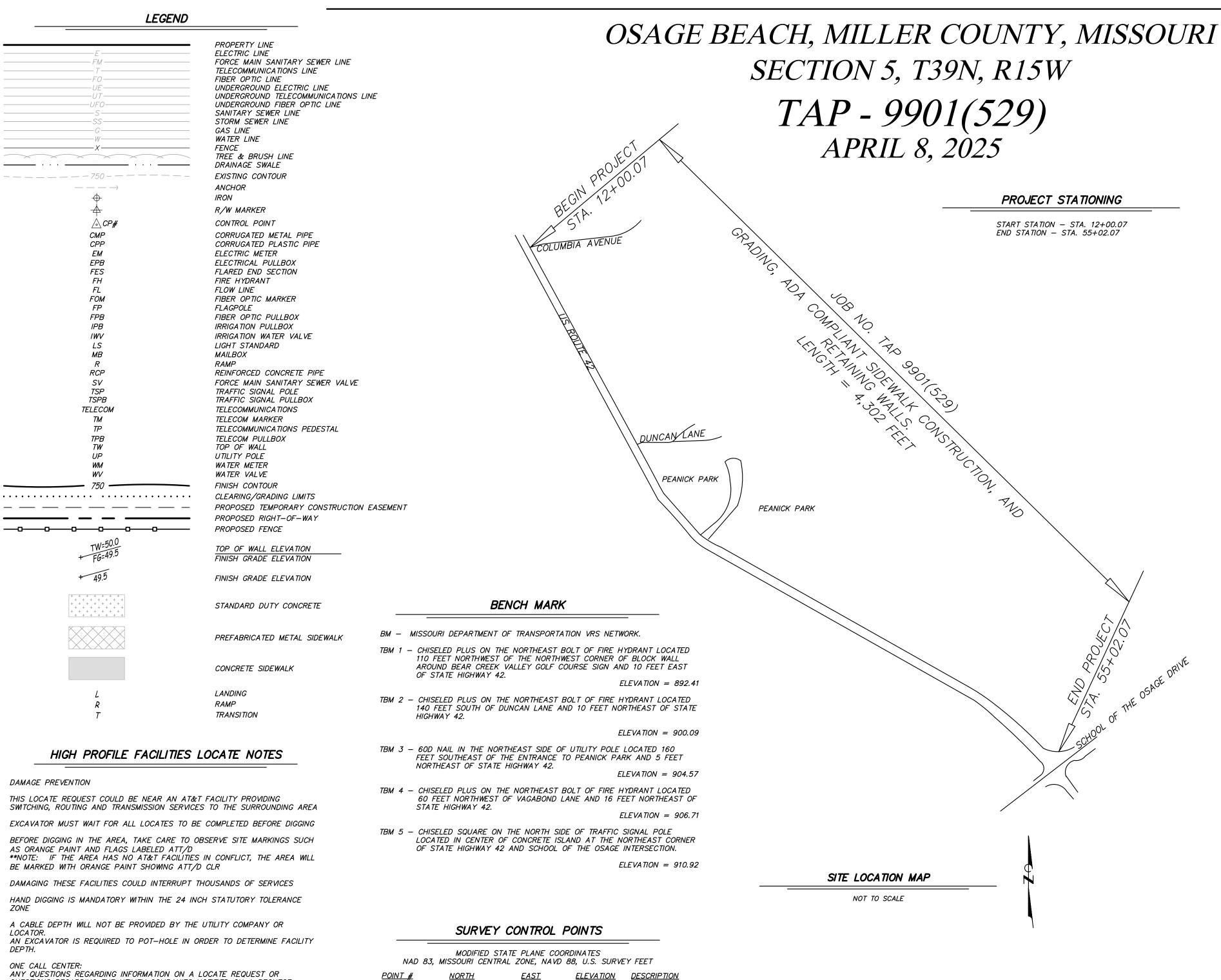

SEQUENCE OF EVENTS

- 1. PRIOR TO CONSTRUCTION, COORDINATE AND HAVE A PRE-CONSTRUCTION MEETING REGARDING SWPPP TRAINING WITH ANYONE INVOLVED IN LAND DISTURBANCE ACTIVITIES FOR THE PROJECT.
- 2. CONTRACTOR SHALL DETERMINE ALL UTILITY FIELD LOCATES AS NECESSARY.
- 3. INSTALL ALL INITIAL PERIMETER EROSION AND SEDIMENT CONTROL PER PLAN.
- 4. STRIP TOPSOIL AND STOCKPILE. IMMEDIATELY PLACE SEDIMENT CONTROL AROUND STOCKPILE.
- 5. UTILIZE ALL EXISTING PAVEMENT AS LONG AS PRACTICAL TO MINIMIZE DISTURBED GROUND EXPOSED TO EROSION.

GRADING AND STORM SEWER CONSTRUCTION NOTES

- 1. ALL STORM SEWER PIPES AND INLETS SHALL MEET HEAVY DUTY TRAFFIC (HS20) LOADING AND BE INSTALLED ACCORDINGLY.
- 2. REINFORCED CONCRETE PIPE (RCP) SHALL BE INSTALLED PER THE "EMBEDMENT OF RCP STORM SEWER PIPE" DETAIL. PIPE CLASS SHALL BE APPROPRIATE TO DEPTH AND BEDDING MATERIAL AS
- 3. ALL RCP PIPE JOINTS SHALL BE SOIL TIGHT PER CURRENT MODOT SPECIFICATIONS SECTION 726.3.1.
- 4. ALL HDPE PIPE SHALL BE ADS N-12 ST SOIL TIGHT, SMOOTH INTERIOR PIPE OR APPROVED EQUAL. INSTALLATION SHALL FOLLOW THE "EMBEDMENT OF PLASTIC STORM SEWER PIPE" DETAIL.
- 5. PVC PIPE MAY BE USED IN LIEU OF HDPE FOR DIAMETERS LESS THAN 15". PVC PIPE SHALL BE SDR 35 OR GREATER, AS REQUIRED BY DEPTH OR AS NOTED IN THESE PLANS.

- 10. PIPE LENGTHS ARE GIVEN FROM CENTER OF STRUCTURE OR DOWNSTREAM END OF FLARED END
- 11. ALL FLARED END SECTIONS FOR CONCRETE PIPE SHALL BE REINFORCED PRECAST CONCRETE. ALL FLARED END SECTIONS FOR PLASTIC PIPE SHALL BE GALVANIZED METAL UNLESS OTHERWISE NOTED.
- 12. ALL SITES USED FOR IMPORTING OR EXPORTING OF FILL MATERIAL SHALL HAVE AN ACTIVE MISSOURI DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES LAND DISTURBANCE PERMIT, AS REQUIRED.
- 13. CONTRACTOR SHALL REMOVE ALL TRASH AND DEBRIS, TREES AND BRUSH, AND OTHER MATERIAL CREATED AS A RESULT OF CONSTRUCTION. MATERIAL SHALL BE DISPOSED OF IN COMPLIANCE WITH ALL APPLICABLE LAWS AND REGULATIONS. BURNING ON SITE SHALL BE ALLOWED BY PERMIT ONLY.

- 16. ENGINEERED FILL SHOULD BE FREE OF FROZEN SOIL, ORGANICS, RUBBISH, LARGE ROCKS, WOOD, OR OTHER DELETERIOUS MATERIAL. PERMIT FOR STORM WATER DISCHARGE ASSOCIATED WITH CONSTRUCTION ACTIVITIES. A COPY OF THIS PLAN, SWPPP, AND ALL PERMITS SHALL REMAIN ON SITE THROUGHOUT CONSTRUCTION.
- 2. CONTRACTORS ARE REQUIRED TO SUBMIT TO CITY INSPECTION STAFF COPIES OF THEIR INSPECTION REPORTS REQUIRED BY THE SWPPP ON A MONTHLY BASIS.
- 3. NO LAND CLEARING OR GRADING SHALL BEGIN UNTIL ALL EROSION CONTROL MEASURES HAVE BEEN INSTALLED AND APPROVAL HAS BEEN RECEIVED FROM ALL GOVERNING AUTHORITIES.

- 9. ADDITIONAL EROSION AND SEDIMENT CONTROL MEASURES SHALL BE INSTALLED IF DEEMED NECESSARY BY ON SITE INSPECTION.
- 10. CONTRACTOR SHALL BE RESPONSIBLE TO TAKE WHATEVER MEANS NECESSARY TO ESTABLISH PERMANENT SOIL STABILIZATION.
- 11. ALL ROLLED EROSION CONTROL MATS. BIONETS. BLANKETS. ETC. SHALL BE INSTALLED PER MANUFACTURER'S REQUIREMENTS. INSTALLATION SHALL RESULT IN A PRODUCT THAT IS TIGHTLY SECURED TO THE GROUND THAT FORCES RUNOFF TO DRAIN OVER, NOT UNDER, THE PRODUCT. GRASS SHALL BE PLANTED PRIOR TO PRODUCT PLACEMENT SO IT WILL GROW THRU THE BLANKET. ALL ASPECTS OF THE PRODUCT SHALL BE FIRMLY SECURED TO THE GROUND SO IT CAN BE MOWED OVER WITHOUT GETTING TANGLED IN THE MOWER.
- 12. CONTRACTOR SHALL REMOVE ALL TRASH. DEBRIS. TREES & BRUSH AND OTHER MATERIAL CREATED AS A RESULT OF THE CONSTRUCTION WORK AND THE SITE SHALL BE RETURNED TO ITS ORIGINAL CONDITION.
- 13. ALL PERIMETER LANDSCAPED AREAS SHALL BE GRASS COVERED.
- 14. IN ORDER TO TERMINATE A MISSOURI DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES (MDNR) STATE OPERATING PERMIT, THE CONTRACTOR SHALL SUBMIT A REQUEST FOR TERMINATION OF OPERATING PERMIT FORM TO MDNR. A PERMIT IS ELIGIBLE FOR TERMINATION WHEN EITHER PERENNIAL VEGETATION, PAVEMENT, BUILDINGS, OR STRUCTURES USING PERMANENT MATERIALS COVER ALL AREAS THAT HAVE BEEN DISTURBED. VEGETATIVE COVER SHOULD BE AT LEAST 70% OF FULLY ESTABLISHED PLANT DENSITY OVER 100% OF THE DISTURBED AREA. Section 4. Repeal of Ordinances not to affect liabilities, etc.

Whenever any part of this ordinance shall be repealed or modified, either expressly or by implication, by a subsequent ordinance, that part of the ordinance thus repealed or modified shall continue in force until the subsequent ordinance repealing or modifying the ordinance shall go into effect unless therein otherwise expressly provided; but no suit, prosecution, proceeding, right, fine or penalty instituted, created, given, secured or accrued under this ordinance previous to its repeal shall not be affected, released or discharged but may be prosecuted, enjoined and recovered as fully as if this ordinance or provisions had continued in force, unless it shall be therein otherwise expressly provided.

<u>Section 5</u>. This Ordinance shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage by the Board of Aldermen and approval by the Mayor.

1. Agreement

In performing their respective obligations under this Agreement, the parties agree to comply with all Applicable Law. For the purpose of this Agreement, "Applicable Law" means all federal, state and local statutes, ordinances, regulations and executive, administrative and judicial orders applicable to this Agreement and Payment Security Standards Council's ("PCI") requirements.

2. Card Acceptance Procedures

- a. Merchant agrees to follow and comply with any operating procedures, Card regulations or specific policies issued and as amended by the Card issuer or association for each Card listed in Schedule 2 (collectively referred to as "Operating Procedures"). Merchant agrees that it is solely responsible for monitoring and complying with all Operating Procedures.
- b. All invoices submitted for processing must contain only those Card transactions for which a valid authorization from the Card issuer was obtained. Any disputes between the cardholder and the Merchant regarding an invoice remain the sole responsibility of the Merchant to address and resolve, before a final invoice can be submitted to World Fuel for processing.
- c. Any amounts representing purchases not made in strict accordance with these terms or the Operating Procedures will be rejected by World Fuel, and if paid to Merchant and subsequently properly rejected by the cardholder, will be deducted from the next regular (or subsequent) payment due to Merchant or collected in another manner as World Fuel may determine. World Fuel may chargeback any Card transaction to a Merchant where the Merchant fails to provide requested supporting documentation within 3 business days in the United States. If the Card association or issuer (e.g. American Express) determines there are excessive chargebacks at a location, Merchant will be solely responsible for any fees, charges or other amounts assessed by the Card association or issuer.
- d. Merchant shall not receive any payments from cardholders with respect to charges made on Cards, and no cash advance shall be paid by the Merchant to the cardholder for any Card transaction. The Merchant will not submit to World Fuel any Card transactions that represent replacement for uncollected funds from other payment methods or that represent bad debt or potential bad debt with regard to the Merchant's own receivable.
- e. Merchant is solely responsible for the quality and accuracy of all data provided to World Fuel.
- f. Invoices must include all details needed to define the products and services purchases and must include a signature or authorization by the cardholder as required by the Card issuer.
- g. All invoices must be submitted to World Fuel within thirty (30) days of the Card transaction.



3. Gateway Use, Copyright and Grant of License

- a. World Fuel has built and maintains highly confidential and proprietary point of sale software and web-based XML interfaces (the "Gateways") and Merchant desires to use the Gateways for Card Processing Services. Merchant and World Fuel will cooperate to facilitate any necessary upgrades or changes to the Gateways, provided that no upgrades or changes to the Gateways may be implemented or made without World Fuel's consent in its sole discretion.
- b. Subject to Merchant's compliance with the terms and conditions of this Agreement, World Fuel grants to Merchant a limited, non-exclusive, non-transferable, and non-sublicensable license during the term of this Agreement to use the Gateways and any documentation provided by World Fuel related to processing requirements, system access or authorization (the "Documentation") exclusively for Card Processing Services with World Fuel. The Gateways and Documentation shall remain the property of World Fuel and no rights, including licenses, are granted with respect thereto other than as expressly set forth in this Section 3.
- c. Merchant hereby acknowledges that World Fuel is the owners of all right, title and interest in the Gateways and Documentation and all intellectual property and proprietary rights therein, regardless of whether a copyright or other notice appears thereon or whether a registration thereof has been obtained with the appropriate government office. Merchant acknowledges the Gateways, Documentation and any other materials or information supplied by World Fuel under or in connection with this Agreement constitute the proprietary information of World Fuel and Merchant shall hold all such information in strict confidence, use such information solely to the extent necessary to perform its obligations under this Agreement, and in no way discuss, disclose or otherwise make available such information to any third parties, including World Fuel's competitors.

4. IT, Data and Cardholder Information Security

- a. Merchant must have proper security measures in place for the protection of cardholder data (including, without limitation, any personally identifiable information or other data that, alone or in combination with other data, can be used to identify a cardholder) and comply with Applicable Law. Merchant must comply with all applicable PCI requirements including, but not limited to, using a PA DSS certified POS/software, ensuring the secure storage and limited access to all records containing cardholder data. Merchant must not retain or store magnetic strip or PIN data after a transaction has been authorized. Merchant is responsible for demonstrating to World Fuel Merchant's compliance with PCI programs and other Applicable Law. Merchants are required to notify World Fuel immediately of any incident that could potentially compromise cardholder data.
- b. Merchant agrees to immediately notify World Fuel of any suspected, alleged or confirmed Compromised Data Event. Merchant agrees that upon Merchant's suspected or actual discovery of a Compromised Data Event, Merchant will not alter or destroy any related records. Merchant will share with World Fuel all information related to any actual or suspected Compromised Data Event, including, but not limited to, forensic reports and system audits; and allow World Fuel access to Merchant and its Merchant's facilities and records for the purpose of performing any inspection, examination and/or copying of books pertaining to the affected transactions. World Fuel may share such information with others as permitted under Applicable Law. In the event of a suspected Compromised Data Event and/or violation of Applicable Law, Merchant must promptly take appropriate corrective action, subject to World Fuel's approval. World Fuel shall be entitled to pass on to Merchant, and Merchant shall be solely responsible for paying, any costs, damages, fees and other liabilities related to any actual or potential loss, unauthorized disclosure, theft or compromise of cardholder data or card transaction



information (each, a "Compromised Data Event"), including without limitation any costs, damages, fees and other liabilities that the Card associations or issuers or government authorities may assess against World Fuel, and/or the costs World Fuel incurs for its investigation of the Compromised Data Event, including those associated with examinations and inspections, except to the extent caused by World Fuel's gross negligence or willful misconduct.

5. Payment and Fees

- a. Merchant agrees to the pricing and settlement terms set forth on Schedule 2.
- b. Merchant and World Fuel shall enter into an Electronic Funds Transfer Authorization Agreement (annexed hereto as Exhibit 1), the effectiveness shall coincide with the term of this Agreement and provide, among other things, that Merchant authorizes World Fuel, to initiate debit and/or credit entries with respect to a certain bank account of Merchant.
- c. Merchant agrees to work with World Fuel and Card issuers to assist with marketing Card products to Merchant's customers.
- d. World Fuel will have the right to offset outstanding amounts owed to Merchant on the Merchant's Cards accounts against any sums payable to the Merchant by World Fuel, or any affiliated companies including its or its parent company subsidiaries and parent company, under any contract, agreement or arrangement.
- e. On or prior to the execution of this Agreement, Merchant shall complete and deliver to World Fuel a fully executed W-9 form (Request for Taxpayers Identification Number and Certification).
- 6. Subrogation: In recognition of the national and international nature of aviation and the necessity for legal certainty, predictability and convenience; upon reimbursement from World Fuel, Merchant irrevocably assigns to World Fuel all rights acquired by Merchant, including lien rights, such as mechanics liens, resulting from transactions for fuel, services and aircraft management for which Merchant has received payment or reimbursement, to allow World Fuel to pursue payment from the account holder.
- 7. Merchandise Responsibility, Warranties, Limitation of Liability
 - a. In no event shall World Fuel be liable to Merchant for any claims for loss of profits, loss of use, interruption of business, or indirect, special, incidental or consequential damages of any kind. Neither party shall be liable to the other for failure to perform this Agreement where such failure to perform is due to any natural disaster, fire, flood, storm, strike, terrorist event, act of war, labor unrest, acts of God, equipment or power interruption (when not due to the negligence of the non-performing party, its employees and contractors) interruptions in the telephone or Internet systems, failures in third party computer software or hardware or any cause beyond the non-performing party's reasonable control.
 - b. World Fuel makes no warranties or representations with respect to the Card Processing Services provided under this Agreement; however, World Fuel will use reasonable efforts to work with Merchant to resolve any issues that arise in connection herewith.
 - c. Merchant acknowledges that the cardholder is the purchaser of all products and services using a Card pursuant to this Agreement and neither World Fuel nor any of its affiliates takes title or risk on any product or service supplied. Any dispute arising under or about such a purchase is a matter between the Merchant and the cardholder.
 - d. Without limiting any other warranties made hereunder, Merchant represents warrants and covenants with World Fuel and with the submission of each Card transaction reaffirms that:
 - Each Card transaction is genuine and arises from a bona fide transactions, permissible under Applicable Law, by the cardholder directly with the Merchant for respective merchandise or services sold; and



- ii. With respect to each Card transaction, Merchant has no knowledge or notice of any fact, circumstance or defense which would indicate that such card transaction is fraudulent or not authorized by the related cardholder or which would otherwise impair the validity or collectability of that cardholder's obligation arising from that Card transaction or relieve that cardholder from liability with respect hereto.
- e. MERCHANT AGREES THAT NEITHER World Fuel, IT'S AFFILIATES, NOR ITS AND THEIR DIRECTORS, OFFICERS, SUBCONTRACTORS, AGENTS AND EMPLOYEES SHALL BE LIABLE TO MERCHANT FOR ANY CLAIMS, LIABILITIES OR EXPENSES RELATING TO THE CARD PROCESSING SERVICES PROVIDED HEREUNDER FOR AN AGGREGATE AMOUNT IN EXCESS OF THE TOTAL FEES PAID BY MERCHANT TO World Fuel FOR SUCH SERVICES DURING THE IMMEDIATELY PRECEDING CONTRACT YEAR.
- 8. Term and Termination: The initial term of this Agreement shall commence on the date hereof and shall be in effect for three (3) years. This Agreement shall automatically renew for successive one (1) year periods unless terminated on sixty (60) days' prior written notice given by either party to the other, provided, that such termination shall not affect any customer transaction entered into prior to termination. In addition, this Agreement may be immediately terminated by World Fuel if Merchant breaches any term of this Agreement and fails to cure such breach within thirty (30) days following written notice by World Fuel. Sections 3c, 4, 7, 8, 9 and 10 shall survive any termination of this Agreement. In addition, this Agreement shall automatically terminate, without any requirement for notice, upon any change in ownership of Merchant or all or substantially all of the Merchant's business.
- 9. Indemnification: Merchant agrees to indemnify and hold harmless World Fuel, its officers, directors, employee, agents and insurers, from and against any and all losses, damages, costs and expenses (including, without limitation, any reasonable attorneys' fees and court costs), liabilities, claims, settlements and judgments arising out (i) the negligence or misconduct of Merchant or its officers, directors, employees or agents, (ii) any breach of Applicable Law or (iii) any breach of or failure to comply with the terms of this Agreement by Merchant or its officers, directors, employees or agents.
- 10. Entire Agreement: This Agreement represents the entire agreement between the parties relating to this subject matter hereof and supersedes any inconsistent terms and conditions contained in any other agreement between the parties. This Agreement may be amended unilaterally from time to time by World Fuel upon notice given to the Merchant at least thirty (30) days prior to the effective date of the amendment, provided however that Merchant shall have the right to reject such amendment by terminating this Agreement, notwithstanding Section 8, prior to the effective date of such amendment. This Agreement may not be assigned by Merchant, by operation of law or otherwise, without the prior written consent of World Fuel. This Agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Florida. Each of the parties hereto agrees to the exclusive the exclusive jurisdiction and forum of the federal and/or local courts located in Miami-Dade County, FL.

This ordinance allows the City Administrator to manage card-processing services for the City. As you can see from the previous agenda item, we have a variety of services depending on department and they change periodically for a variety of reasons. This ordinance also formalizes the City's current procedure of accepting cash, check, and ACH (bank transfer) without any service charge while passing credit card fees on to the customer. The ordinance allows staff to decide whether to impose the charge or not, which may vary by department or context (i.e. sewer rates vs. park concessions).

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF OSAGE BEACH, MISSOURI, CREATING NEW SECTIONS IN CHAPTER 135 BUDGET AND FINANCIAL CONTROL; SECTION 135.021 ACCEPTING PAYMENT AS SET FORTH.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE CITY OF OSAGE BEACH, MISSOURI AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Within the City Code there are hereby enacted a new Section set out as follows:

Section 135.021. Accepting Payment

- A. Wherever a fee, charge, price, or cost is imposed or required in this Code, the department responsible for collecting such payment is authorized to receive payment by credit card or debit card and to recover all administrative costs connected to these transactions and convenience fees imposed by the payment-processing service under contract to process such payments.
- B. The City Administrator is authorized to make, modify, and terminate agreements with payment-processing services. Such services shall be obtained using the informal bidding procedures described in Section 135.040(C)(2).

Section 2. Severability

The chapters, sections, paragraphs, sentences, clauses and phrases of this ordinance are severable, and if any phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph or section of this ordinance shall be declared unconstitutional or otherwise invalid by the valid judgment or degree of any Court of any competent jurisdiction, such unconstitutionality or invalidity shall not affect any of the remaining phrases, clauses, sentences, paragraphs, or sections of this ordinance since the same would have been enacted by the Board of Aldermen without the incorporation in this ordinance of any such unconstitutional or invalid phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph or section.

Section 3. Repeal of Ordinances not to affect liabilities, etc.

Whenever any part of this ordinance shall be repealed or modified, either expressly or by implication, by a subsequent ordinance, that part of the ordinance thus repealed or modified shall continue in force until the subsequent ordinance repealing or modifying the ordinance shall go into effect unless therein otherwise expressly provided; but no suit, prosecution, proceeding, right, fine or penalty instituted, created, given, secured or accrued under this ordinance previous to its repeal shall not be affected, released or discharged but may be prosecuted, enjoined and recovered as fully as if this ordinance or provisions had continued in force, unless it shall be therein otherwise expressly provided.

<u>Section 4</u>. That this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after the date of passage and approval of the Mayor.

Our encoder can accommodate 50 sirens. Currently, we operate eleven (11). Nine (9) of Osage Beach's sirens and two (2) of Lake Ozark's sirens. The Village will be responsible for any costs incurred on the systems so that the Osage Beach 911 Dispatch can activate the Village's sirens. There should be minimum if any additional responsibilities to dispatch staff as the sirens will be activated by the current Rapid Warn System that currently activates our sirens based on information received by the National Weather Service.

WHEREAS, this MOU is intended to establish and clarify the roles and responsibilities of the parties hereto related to the Emergency Outdoor Warning System located within the Village at various locations, (hereinafter, "Sirens"); and

WHEREAS, the City is a political subdivision of the State of Missouri, and the Village is a political subdivision of the State of Missouri; and

WHEREAS, the parties hereto are each responsible for alerting, warning and evacuating residents within their jurisdictions, including oversight and coordination of alert and warning systems, in order to ensure consistent application of alert and warning systems; and

WHEREAS, the City and the Village are each responsible for, and have established, an Emergency Services Program as required by Missouri law and as required by their respective Code of Ordinances, to oversee and coordinate disaster preparedness and response measures; and

WHEREAS, the City and Village have installed, and are authorized to use, an Outdoor Warning System that involves one or more sirens; and the operation and testing of the sirens falls under the respective jurisdiction's responsibility; and

WHEREAS, in the City, outdoor warning sirens are activated by the Osage Beach 911 Dispatch Center to alert residents of severe weather events like tornadoes or high-speed winds, prompting them to seek shelter and information; and

WHEREAS, although the Village owns the Sirens located within its jurisdiction at various locations, the Village lacks a central communications center and agent with which it may operate the Sirens and alert residents of severe weather events like tornadoes or high-speed winds, prompting them to seek shelter and information; and

WHEREAS, the City and Village have agreed on a Memorandum of Understanding that the City will activate the Sirens for the Village.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of their mutual covenants and conditions, the parties hereto agree as follows: The Village owns the -Sirens and all appurtenances now constructed or constructed in the future, and the City - shall not claim, now or in the future, any property right or title to the Sirens, their appurtenances or the property where they are installed and operated. The City understands it does not have authority to activate the Alarms unless the Village, or state or federal agencies have directed it to do so. The Parties further agree to perform their obligations as set forth in this MOU and outlined below.

1. TERM:

This MOU shall become effective as of the date first written above and continue for one (1) calendar year. The parties may renew the MOU annually by written agreement.

2. CITY'S RESPONSIBILITIES:

- a. Operate the Sirens as required for emergency response activities; and
- b. When a potential emergency arises, activate the Sirens to notify people who are outside that they should seek shelter or take other protective measures; and
- c. Coordinate with the Village to test the Sirens monthly, and in accordance with dates established by the National Weather Service and the State of Missouri for statewide tornado drills, to assure the proper and continued operation of the Sirens and appurtenances; and
- d. Provide the Village with reasonable notice of any disrepair or inoperability of the Sirens; and
- e. Provide the Village with reasonable notice of any events or occurrences that may cause the Sirens not to operate, or that may cause the City to not fulfill its obligations herein; and
- f. Provide Village with reasonable notice of any required access, testing, or operation of the Sirens to be performed by the City. In the event that notification cannot be provided, the City shall provide notification as soon as is practicable after the Sirens and all appurtenances are accessed.

3. VILLAGE'S RESPONSIBILITIES:

- a. Pay the annual fee to the City as detailed herein; and
- b. Construct, or cause to be constructed, any upgrades, improvements, or modifications necessary for efficient use of the Sirens and for compliance with City, Federal, State, and local laws and regulations; and
- c. Provide the City with all plans and specifications, including studies performed related to the operation of the Sirens; and
- d. Provide the City with the mechanism to operate the Sirens (i.e., passwords or links to the system, etc.); and
- e. Perform maintenance and inspection of the Sirens and appurtenances as necessary for the continued reliable operation of the Sirens. The Village understands and acknowledges that if the Sirens are not maintained in operable condition, the Village may not be able to utilize it; and
- f. Provide access for testing and operation of the Sirens and appurtenances to the City at all reasonable times; and

g. Provide reasonable notice to the City of any activities or occurrences that impact the maintenance, operation, or access to the Sirens; and

4. TERMINATION:

This MOU may be terminated by either party upon the giving of sixty (60) days' advance written notice of an intention to terminate.

5. NON-ASSIGNMENT:

The parties hereto shall not assign, transfer or sub-contract this MOU nor their rights or duties under this MOU without the prior written consent of the other parties.

6. RECORDS:

All Parties subject to this MOU shall maintain all records related to this MOU, and all parties hereto shall further maintain a record of all services or conduct in compliance with this MOU that shall provide sufficient detail to permit an evaluation or audit of the MOU. All such records shall be made available during normal business hours to authorized representatives of the City, the Village, the State of Missouri, and Federal government during the term of this MOU and during the period of record retention for the purpose of program review and/or fiscal audit.

7. COMPLIANCE WITH LAWS/POLICIES:

The parties hereto shall comply with all applicable rules and regulations and laws as set forth by federal, state or local governments.

8. RELATIONSHIP OF PARTIES:

It is understood that this is a Memorandum of Understanding by and between two (2) separate public agencies and is not intended to and shall not be construed to create a relationship of agent, servant, employee, partnership, joint venture or association.

9. NO THIRD-PARTY BENEFICIARIES:

The parties hereto agree it is their specific intent that no other person or entity shall be a party to or a third-party beneficiary of this MOU.

10. INDEMNIFICATION:

Each party hereto agrees to be responsible and assume liability for its own wrongful or negligent acts or omissions, or those of its officers, agents, or employees to the full extent required by law.

11. NOTICE:

Any and all notices, reports or other communications to be given to the parties hereto shall be given to the persons representing the respective parties at the addresses written herein.

12. PUBLIC RECORDS ACT:

The parties hereto are aware that this MOU and any documents or communications related thereto may be subject to Missouri FOIA Laws and/or the Missouri Sunshine Law and may be disclosed to members of the public upon request. It is the responsibility of the parties hereto to clearly identify information in those documents that they consider to be

confidential pursuant to Missouri law. To the extent possible, confidential information shall be held in confidence. All other information will be considered public.

13. ENTIRE AGREEMENT AND MODIFICATION:

This MOU contains the entire agreement of the parties relating to the subject matter of this MOU and supersedes all prior agreements and representations with respect to the subject matter hereof. This MOU shall only be modified by a written amendment hereto, executed by all parties. If there are exhibits attached hereto, and a conflict exists between the terms of this MOU and any exhibit, the terms of this MOU shall control.

14. ENFORCEABILITY AND SEVERABILITY:

The invalidity or enforceability of any term or provisions of this MOU shall not, unless otherwise specified, affect the validity or enforceability of any other term or provision, which shall remain in full force and effect.

15. LIMITATIONS OF MOU:

This MOU is not intended, and does not, create any right or benefit, substantive, contractual, or procedural, enforceable at law or in equity, by any party against one another, or its officials, employees, or agents. Nothing in this MOU may be construed to obligate the parties to any current or future expenditure of resources. This MOU does not obligate any funds of any of the parties.

16. CAPTIONS:

The captions of this MOU are for convenience in reference only and the words contained therein shall in no way be held to explain, modify, amplify, or aid in the interpretation, construction or meaning of the provisions of this MOU.

17. COUNTERPARTS/ELECTRONIC, FACSIMILE, AND PDF SIGNATURES: This MOU may be executed in any number of counterparts, each of which will be an original, but all of which together will constitute one instrument. Each Party of this MOU agreement agrees to the use of electronic signatures, such as digital signatures that meet the requirements of the Missouri Uniform Electronic Transactions Act for executing this agreement. The parties hereto further agree that the electronic signatures of the parties included in this agreement are intended to authenticate this writing and to have the same force and effect as manual or wet signatures. Electronic signature means an electronic sound, symbol, or process attached to or logically associated with an electronic record and executed or adopted by a person with the intent to sign the electronic record pursuant to the Missouri law as amended from time to time. The Missouri Uniform Electronic Transactions Act authorizes use of an electronic signature for transactions and contracts among parties in Missouri, including a government agency. Digital signature or Electronic signature means an electronic sound, symbol, or process attached to or logically associated with a record and executed or adopted by a person with the intent to sign the record, and said signature is intended by the party using it to have the same force and effect as the use of a manual signature, and shall be reasonably relied upon by the parties. For purposes of this section, a Digital signature or Electronic signature is a type of "electronic signature" as defined in Section 432.205(8) of the Missouri Revised Statutes. Facsimile signatures or signatures transmitted via pdf document shall be treated as originals for all purposes.

18. OTHER DOCUMENTS:

The parties hereto agree that they shall cooperate in good faith to accomplish the objective of this MOU and, to that end, agree to execute and deliver such other and further instruments and documents as may be necessary and convenient to the fulfillment of these purposes.

19. CONTROLLING LAW:

The validity, interpretation and performance of this MOU shall be controlled by and construed under the laws of the State of Missouri.

20. AUTHORITY:

Each party and each party's signatory warrant and represent that each has full authority and capacity to enter into this MOU in accordance with all requirements of state and local law. The parties also warrant that any signed amendment or modification to the MOU shall comply with all requirements of state and local law, including capacity and authority to amend or modify the MOU.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF OSAGE BEACH, MISSOURI, AMENDING CHAPTER 200 POLICE DEPARTMENT; SECTION 200.040 POWERS AND DUTIES OF CHIEF OF POLICE AS SET FORTH.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE CITY OF OSAGE BEACH, MISSOURI AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1.</u> Within the City Code there are hereby enacted amendments as set forth below with new material set out in **RED** follows:

Section 200.040. Powers and Duties of Chief of Police.

- A. The Police Chief shall perform all duties required by law.
- B. The Police Chief shall be a conservator of the peace and shall be active and vigilant in the preservation of good order within the City. He/she shall have power at all times to make or order an arrest, with proper process, for any offense against the laws of the City or of the State, and to keep the offender in the City or County Jail or other proper place to prevent his/her escape until a trial can be had before the Municipal Judge or other proper officer, unless such offender shall give a good and sufficient bond for his/her appearance for trial. The Police Chief shall also have power to make arrests without process, in all cases in which any offense against the laws of the City or of the State shall be committed in his/her presence.
- C. The Police Chief is authorized to cooperate with other law enforcement or public safety agencies (including local, state, and/or federal agencies or multi-agency task forces) to carry out his or her duties. Such cooperation may be memorialized in an appropriate Memorandum of Understanding with such other agencies at the discretion of the Police Chief, provided that such Memorandum not commit the City to any obligation which would: (a) leave the City with inadequate provision for public safety; (b) commit funds or resources of such value that would exceed the Police Chief's budgeted spending authority; or (c) otherwise circumvent the City's budget process or financial controls. Such Memoranda shall be in a form approved by the City Attorney.

Section 2. Severability

The chapters, sections, paragraphs, sentences, clauses and phrases of this ordinance are severable, and if any phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph or section of this ordinance shall be declared unconstitutional or otherwise invalid by the valid judgment or degree of any Court of any competent jurisdiction, such unconstitutionality or invalidity shall not affect any of the remaining phrases, clauses, sentences, paragraphs, or sections of this ordinance since the same would have been enacted by the Board of Aldermen without the incorporation in this ordinance of any such unconstitutional or invalid phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph or section.

Section 3. Repeal of Ordinances not to affect liabilities, etc.

Whenever any part of this ordinance shall be repealed or modified, either expressly or by implication, by a subsequent ordinance, that part of the ordinance thus repealed or modified shall continue in force until the subsequent ordinance repealing or modifying the ordinance shall go into effect unless therein otherwise expressly provided; but no suit, prosecution, proceeding, right, fine or penalty instituted, created, given, secured or accrued under this ordinance previous to its repeal shall not be affected, released or discharged but may be prosecuted, enjoined and recovered as fully as if this ordinance or provisions had continued in force, unless it shall be therein otherwise expressly provided.

<u>Section 4</u>. That this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after the date of passage and approval of the Mayor.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF OSAGE BEACH, MISSOURI, AMENDING CHAPTER 125 HUMAN RESOURCES SYSTEM (PERSONNEL) RULES AND REGULATIONS; SECTION 125.160 SEPARATION FROM SERVICE AS SET FORTH.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE CITY OF OSAGE BEACH, MISSOURI AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1.</u> Within the City Code there are hereby enacted amendments as set forth below with new material set out in **RED** follows:

Section 125.160. Separation From Service. *Termination*. All non-probationary employees in the classified service may be terminated for cause at any time by the City Administrator. An employee who has been terminated shall be furnished a written statement of the reasons for such action and shall be entitled to a hearing if he/she so requests, as provided in these rules.

- 1. Severance Pay and Agreement.
- a. If the City Administrator determines it is in the City's best interests to enter into a severance agreement with a terminated employee, the City Administrator shall document the reasons therefor in the employee's file. Such reasons may include, but need not be limited to: the need for post-employment cooperation or services from the terminated employee, release of liability, and/or confidentiality.
- b. All such agreements shall be in a form acceptable to the City Attorney.
- c. All such agreements with non-appointed employees must be approved by the City Administrator where the total cost to the City of such pay and/or benefits is within the City Administrator's purchasing authority under City Code § 135.040(B). Agreements providing for amounts exceeding that authority shall require Board approval.
- d. All such agreements with appointed officials shall require Board approval.
- B. Reduction In Force And/Or Hours. Under certain circumstances, it may be necessary to eliminate employee positions or reduce hours due to budgetary needs, program reductions, reorganization, changes in needs or technology, or other business needs. The City Administrator may, after appropriate work analysis and assessment, eliminate position(s) through a reduction in force or institute a reduction in hours of a position(s) due to necessity. Reduction in force may impact any employee, and terminations/layoffs of employment may be a result of the decision.
 - 1. Reduction In Force. A "reduction in force (RIF)" is defined as a separation from employment due to the elimination of a position within a unit or department with the expectation that said position(s) are to be eliminated.
 - a. Employee(s) affected may be offered a transfer to an open position, upon

- meeting the qualifications and job requirements of said position offered, to prevent or postpone a termination.
- b. Selection of employee(s) to be laid off shall be based on the needs of the City, job function, and performance.
- c. Notification of the reduction in force and stated layoffs to the employee(s) shall be written and given as far in advance as practical and in no case less than sixty (60) calendar days of the effective date.
- d. Employees eligible for rehire shall be placed on the employment list for up to eighteen (18) months and shall have priority hiring status. Employees shall be recalled in order as they were placed on the employment list and per job qualifications.
- e. Employees reinstated within eighteen (18) months following the notification of said layoff may retain any unused or unpaid benefits accumulated prior to being laid off and waiting periods regarding insurance and retirement benefits, if any, per compliance with contractual agreement and laws at that time. The employment date will be reinstated to the original hire date. No leave benefits or time in grade accrues while in the laid-off status, but vacation and personal accrual rates will be assigned accordingly.
- f. Severance Pay And Agreement. Eligible employees shall receive severance pay based on years of service upon signing a separation agreement within an applicable time frame which shall include the provision for separation, required release of claims, and applicable terms and conditions.
 - Severance pay for employees who are terminated due to a reduction in force shall be paid equivalent to one (1) week of every year of service, not to exceed twelve (12) weeks but no less than two (2) weeks.
 - (1) Additionally, employees shall receive compensation for their accrued vacation hours and comp time hours (non-exempt). In addition, seventy-five percent (75%) of accrued personal hours shall be converted to 401A retirement dollars.
 - (2) Upon termination all severance pay due shall be paid on the next regular payroll.
- 2. Reduction In Hours. A reduction in hours is defined as the reduction in the number of hours worked per week for any position within a unit or department with the expectation that the said reduction is not temporary in nature.
 - a. Employee(s) whose hours are reduced due to a reduction of hours to no less than eighty percent (80%) of their regular hours worked per week shall retain the benefits which they were entitled to prior to the reduction of hours.
- 3. Exclusions. Term-limited positions where the duration of the position is defined at the time of hire does not apply as outlined in this Section 125.160(B).

C. Resignation.

- 1. An employee wishing to leave the classified service in good standing shall file with the City Administrator through his/her department manager a written resignation stating the effective date, at least two (2) weeks before leaving the service, unless such time limit is waived by the City Administrator. Failure to give notice as required by this Section shall be cause for denying future employment by the City.
- 2. If the employee provides two (2) weeks' notice and the City chooses not to use the services of the employee for those two (2) weeks, the employee shall receive compensation for that two (2) week period as per their normal work schedule.
- 3. Additional notice for management team; incentive. Due to the critical position they occupy in the City's management structure, the City requests the following officials provide additional notice prior to resigning. Any covered employee providing the additional notice requested herein shall receive the severance payment described below. If the employee provides the requested notice and the City chooses not to use the services of the employee for that period, the employee shall receive compensation for that period in addition to the severance payment.
 - a. The City Administrator is requested to provide six months' notice in exchange for a severance payment of four weeks' salary.
 - b. Appointed Officials and the Assistant City Administrator are requested to provide three months' notice in exchange for a severance payment of two weeks' salary.
 - c. Other department managers (Human Resources, Information Technology, Parks, Airports) are requested to provide one month's notice in exchange for a severance payment of one week's salary.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF OSAGE BEACH, MISSOURI, AMENDING CHAPTER 125 HUMAN RESOURCES SYSTEM (PERSONNEL) RULES AND REGULATIONS; SECTION 125.220 ALCOHOL, DRUG AND CONTROLLED SUBSTANCE ABUSE AND SECTION 125.230 SUPPLEMENTAL POLICIES AS SET FORTH.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE CITY OF OSAGE BEACH. MISSOURI AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1</u>. That the section entitled Osage Beach amendments as set forth below with new material set out in **RED** and deleted material struck as follows:

Section 125.220. Alcohol, Drug and Controlled Substance Abuse.

The City of Osage Beach has an obligation to its employees to take reasonable steps to assure a drug-free and safe place to work. The City of Osage Beach also has an obligation to the citizens and to the public at large to provide quality and safe services through a policy and program prohibiting the use of illegal and controlled substances and the misuse of alcohol by City employees.

- A. The City will not tolerate the use, abuse, possession or sale of illegal and controlled substances or misuse of alcohol by any of its employees, including part-time and seasonal employees. Drug and alcohol testing will be an integral part of the City's program in order to meet the goals of providing a safe and efficient service and a safe and healthy workplace.
- B. The purpose of this policy is to assure worker fitness for duty and to protect employees and the public from the risks posed by the use of alcohol, illegal, and controlled substances. This policy is also intended to comply with all applicable Federal and State regulations governing workplace alcohol, illegal, and controlled substance abuse programs. The United States Department of Transportation (DOT) 49 CFR Part 29 the "Drug Free Work Place Act of 1988," the "Omnibus Transportation Act of 1991," and the DOT 49 CFR Part 40 requires certain reporting of certain drug-related offenses, mandates urine drug testing and breathalyzer alcohol tests for safety-sensitive positions, and other positions when so noted, and prevents performance of their functions when there is a positive test result.
- C. It is the City's policy to give in detail the prohibitions against the use of alcohol and controlled substances in the workplace; however, the City will make every effort to encourage employees to seek professional assistance when personal problems, including alcohol, illegal, and controlled substance dependency, adversely affect their ability to perform assigned duties. Refer to the Drug Free Workplace Policy dated 8/21/2014.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE CITY OF OSAGE BEACH, MISSOURI AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1.</u> Within the City Code there are hereby enacted amendments as set forth below with new material set out in **RED** follows:

Section 125.040. Human Resources Commission members:

- 1. Chairperson shall be the City Administrator or in the absence of the City Administrator, the Assistant City Administrator who shall vote only in case of a tie.
- 2. Four (4) department managers, excluding the Human Resources Director, who shall serve rotating two (2) year terms appointed by the City Administrator.
- 3. Four (4) employees with at least one (1) year of service who will be elected by the non-management employees and which will consist of one (1) employee from either the Police, Dispatch, or Ambulance departments, one (1) employee from the Public Works, one (1) employee from either the Airports or Parks and Recreation Departments, and one (1) employee from Administration (all departments not mentioned above) to serve for two (2) years. No person shall serve successive terms.
- 4. The Human Resources Director shall attend all Commission special meetings as a subject matter expert to be available for questions or clarifications.
- 5. The City Clerk shall be the Secretary.

B. Duties Of The Commission.

- 1. The Commission shall serve as a sample group of the employee population to hear and make recommendations for rules governing the conduct of their business and submit them to the City Administrator for approval. Any future rules, regulations, or amendments shall be either submitted to the Board for approval or, as is the case with all supplemental policies, be implemented at the discretion of the City Administrator in accordance with Section 125.230. Supplemental Policies.
- 2. The Commission shall hear all appeals as specified in Section 125.180.
- C. *Meetings*. The Commission may hold special meetings upon the call of the Chairman. A majority of the members shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business. Meetings shall be conducted informally in accordance with such rules as may be adopted by the Board. All members of the Commission shall be notified at least twenty-four (24) hours before the special meeting.

Section 605.070. Fee

Unless otherwise specified, the fee for such license shall be fifty dollars (\$50.00) sixty-five dollars (\$65.00).

Concrete or cement mixing, manufacturing or distributing plant; Confectionery store; Contractor; Dairy truck (if milk or other dairy products are sold and delivered); Dance house; Delicatessen; Doctor or dentist, no fee; Druggist, retail; Electronic supply store; Excavating Contractor; Exterminator: Florist: Grocery, retail; Hardware, retail; Hatchery; Heavy equipment sales and service; Hospital; Hotel; Ice cream parlor; Ice cream truck (if merchandise is sold and delivered); Ice dealer; Installment agency (an installment agency is defined to be any person who conducts or carries on the business of selling goods, wares, merchandise on weekly or monthly payments); Insurance agency maintaining an office in the City; Junk dealer; Kennel; Landscaping service; Laundromat; Light industry; Liquor store or tavern; Lumber dealer; Lunch stand or counter; Manufacturer; Massage establishment; Masseuse or massage therapist; Medical Marijuana Cultivation Facilities Medical Marijuana Dispensary Facilities Medical Marijuana -Infused Products Manufacturing Facilities Medical Marijuana Testing Merchant, retail; Miniature golf course; Motel or motor hotel (where merchandise of any kind is sold);

Moving picture show or drive in theater;

Nursery stock, retail;

Oil station, retail;

Optical, retail;

In consideration for the rights, privileges and permit hereby granted, and as compensation to the City for the use of its public ways and placed by cable TV, and in lieu of all occupation and license taxes, cable TV shall, on or before the last day of January in each year in which this permit is effective, pay to the City a sum equal to two percent (2%) of the gross subscriber receipts from the sale of community antenna television service within the then existing corporation limits and the City from all consumption for the preceding twelve (12) month period ending on the last day of December. After reviewing the current processes for parks sponsorship and advertising, staff determined this ordinance was not up to date – Parks had both "advertising" and "sponsorship" opportunities, but only "advertising" was covered in the ordinance. After discussing options, Parks and the City Attorney agreed on a single "sponsorship" model which is easier to understand (for the public) and operate (for staff). It also makes the ordinance more consistent with recent First Amendment rulings. Staff recommends approval.

BILL NO. 25-41 ORDINANCE NO. 25.41

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF OSAGE BEACH, MISSOURI AMENDING CHAPTER 245 PARKS AND RECREATION SECTION 245.060 PARKS SPONSORSHIPS ADVERTISING FEES AS SET FORTH.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE CITY OF OSAGE BEACH, MISSOURI, AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1</u>. That the section entitled Osage Beach Design amendments as set forth below with new material set out in **RED** and deleted material struck as follows:

Section 245.060. Park Sponsorships Advertising

Event Sponsorship Advertising And Signage. Only banners and signs for permitted events shall be allowed within the City's parks or on City property and must be approved by the Parks and Recreation Department. Approval shall be done through the park use application for permit process.

- 1. Banners and signs for permitted events shall only be temporary in use and not permanently constructed, installed or built on City property.
- 2. Applicant agrees to comply with all City codes, applicable laws and regulations.
- 3. The City reserves the right to edit advertising for content. All advertising shall be approved by the Parks and Recreation Department.
- B. Park Sponsorship Advertising. The City Administrator or his/her designee is authorized to accept sponsorships for the Parks and Recreation Department's programs, facilities, and events, and to recognize sponsors appropriately using signage or other City media. The City's advertising program will allow businesses various opportunities to advertise at either Osage Beach City Park or Peanick Park.
 - 1. Sponsorships shall be generally available to individuals and businesses provided that no recognition of a sponsor shall violate state and/or federal laws or regulations.
 - 2. Sponsorships for youth-specific or youth-focused programs, facilities, or events (including but not limited to youth sports, playgrounds, Easter egg hunts, youth fishing derbies, etc.) shall not be accepted from sponsors which derive more than 60% of their gross revenues from the sale of products which cannot be consumed or purchased lawfully by minors (including but not limited to alcohol, marijuana, and tobacco/vape products).
 - 3. The purpose of sponsor recognition shall be to express the City's gratitude for the sponsor's support. Recognition shall identify the sponsor only and shall not open a forum for a sponsor's message or other speech. Acceptance and recognition of a sponsorship shall not constitute an endorsement of the sponsor.
 - 1. Terms of agreement.
 - a. Businesses shall contract with the City for advertising space and will be reserved on a first-come, first-serve basis and shall be subject to the terms of the contract.
 - b. Minimum term of advertising shall be for at least one (1) year and shall include first

- right of refusal or opportunity to enter into a new contract.
- e. Rates are non-exclusive, allowing competing products or services to purchase advertising.
- d. Rates are due and payable upon receipt of invoice by the City. Annual fees are due on or before January 1 of each calendar year.
- e. If the City has, or will acquire, naming rights to a City facility, such naming rights may impact the ability of a competitive advertiser in that City facility and/or in the areas associated directly with that facility.
- f. Advertising contracts shall be based on available advertising space, advertising product, ad copy and graphics.
- g. The City reserves the right to edit advertising for content. All advertising shall be approved by the Parks and Recreation Department.
- h. The City Administrator or his/her designee shall have the authority to enter into a one (1) year sports board, location sign or scoreboard advertising contract pursuant to the terms and conditions set out in this Code. The City Administrator shall notify the Board of Aldermen of each contract executed under this authority and provide to the Board, the advertising copy, artwork and content approved for each advertiser. This Section shall not obligate or compel the City Administrator to execute any contract.

Section 2. Severability

The chapters, sections, paragraphs, sentences, clauses and phrases of this ordinance are severable, and if any phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph or section of this ordinance shall be declared unconstitutional or otherwise invalid by the valid judgement or degree of any Court of any competent jurisdiction, such unconstitutionality or invalidity shall not affect any of the remaining phrases, clauses, sentences, paragraphs, or sections of this ordinance since the same would have been enacted by the Board of Aldermen without the incorporation in this ordinance of any such unconstitutional or invalid phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph or section.

Section 3. Repeal of Ordinances not to affect liabilities, etc.

Whenever any part of this ordinance shall be repealed or modified, either expressly or by implication, by a subsequent ordinance, that part of the ordinance thus repealed or modified shall continue in force until the subsequent ordinance repealing or modifying the ordinance shall go into effect unless therein otherwise expressly provided; but no suit, prosecution, proceeding, right, fine or penalty instituted, created, given, secured or accrued under this ordinance previous to its repeal shall not be affected, released or discharged but may be prosecuted, enjoined and recovered as fully as if this ordinance or provisions had continued in force, unless it shall be therein otherwise expressly provided.

<u>Section 4</u>. That this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after the date of passage and approval by the Mayor.
