## ORDINANCE NO. 25.74 **FLOOR SUBSTITUE**

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF OSAGE BEACH, MISSOURI, AMENDING CHAPTER 100 GENERAL PROVISION; SECTION 100.220 DESIGN GUIDELINES, SECTION 100.230 FEE SCHEDULE AS SET FORTH.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE CITY OF OSAGE BEACH, MISSOURI AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1.</u> Within the City Code there are hereby enacted new Sections with material repealed and replacing them set forth below with new material set out in **RED** and deleted material struck as follows:

#### ARTICLE V

#### **Design** Guidelines and Schedules

#### Section 100.220. Design Guidelines.

A certain document, one (1) copy of which is on file in the office of the City Clerk, being marked and designated as the Osage Beach Design Guidelines, is hereby adopted as the code of the City of Osage Beach, Missouri, for regulating the design, construction, quality of materials, erection, installation, alteration, repair, location, relocation, replacement, addition to, use or maintenance of various systems and improvements in the City of Osage Beach; and each and all of the regulations, provisions, conditions and terms of such document on file in the office of the City Clerk are hereby referred to, adopted and made a part hereof as if fully set out in the Article.

#### Section 100.230. Fee Schedule.

- A. A certain document, one (1) copy of which is on file in the office of the City Clerk, being marked and designated as the Osage Beach Fee Schedule, is hereby adopted by the City of Osage Beach, Missouri, for the purpose of setting, regulating, and restating various fees and costs assessed in and by the City of Osage Beach; and each and all of the fees, costs, charges, and assessments in such document are hereby authorized to be so assessed as set forth therein and as amended from time to time.
- B. Where any provision of this Code permits any cost, fee, charge, or assessment to be set by the City Administrator, other staff, or any designee thereof, the City Administrator or other duly authorized person shall provide copies of such change(s) to the Fee Schedule to the Board and Mayor at least twenty (20) business days prior to implementing such changes.
- C. Where any such cost, fee, charge, or assessment is set by ordinance, such amounts shall only be changed by duly authorized amendment to such ordinance. Where any fee contained in the Fee Schedule is inconsistent with an ordinance, the ordinance shall control.

#### Section 2. Severability

The chapters, sections, paragraphs, sentences, clauses and phrases of this ordinance are severable, and if any phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph or section of this ordinance shall be declared unconstitutional or otherwise invalid by the valid judgment or degree of any Court of any competent jurisdiction, such

unconstitutionality or invalidity shall not affect any of the remaining phrases, clauses, sentences, paragraphs, or sections of this ordinance since the same would have been enacted by the Board of Aldermen without the incorporation in this ordinance of any such unconstitutional or invalid phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph or section.

#### <u>Section 3</u>. Repeal of Ordinances not to affect liabilities, etc.

Whenever any part of this ordinance shall be repealed or modified, either expressly or by implication, by a subsequent ordinance, that part of the ordinance thus repealed or modified shall continue in force until the subsequent ordinance repealing or modifying the ordinance shall go into effect unless therein otherwise expressly provided; but no suit, prosecution, proceeding, right, fine or penalty instituted, created, given, secured or accrued under this ordinance previous to its repeal shall not be affected, released or discharged but may be prosecuted, enjoined and recovered as fully as if this ordinance or provisions had continued in force, unless it shall be therein otherwise expressly provided.

<u>Section 4</u>. That this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after the date of passage and approval of the Mayor.

# ORDINANCE NO. 25.75 **FLOOR SUBSITITUE**

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF OSAGE BEACH, MISSOURI, AMENDING CHAPTER 245 PARKS RESERVATION AND USER FEES; SECTION 210.2250 PERMIT TO DISCHARGE, SECTION 245.040 PARKS RESERVATIONS AND USER FEES, SECTION 245.050 VENDING AND CONCESSIONS AS SET FORTH.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE CITY OF OSAGE BEACH, MISSOURI AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1.</u> Within the City Code there are hereby enacted new Sections with material repealed and replacing set forth below with new material set out in **RED** and deleted material struck as follows:

#### ARTICLE II

#### Section 210.2250. Permit To Discharge.

- A. A permit shall be obtained from the City for the discharge of fireworks. Each permit shall specify the date, time, location, property owner, and party responsible conducting the display. No permit shall be issued for any display earlier in the day than 6:00 P.M. or later in the day than 10:00 P.M. Permits may also be issued under this Chapter for a display from December thirty-first (31st) beginning at 11:50 P.M. to January first (1st) at 12:10 A.M.
- B. Applications for permits shall be made in writing at least seven (7) working days in advance of the date of the display or discharge of fireworks and shall be accompanied by an application fee of twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) set by the City Clerk. The sale, possession, use and distribution of fireworks for such display shall be lawful under the terms and conditions approved with the permit and for that purpose only. A permit granted hereunder shall not be transferable, nor shall any such permit be extended beyond the dates set out therein.
- C. Applications for display of fireworks shall be approved by the Chief of Police and issued by the City Clerk. Applicants must first obtain a permit from either the State Fire Marshal or the Osage Beach Fire Protection District and provide a copy of said permit with the application.

#### Park Reservations and User Fees

#### Section 245.040. Park Reservations and User Fees.

The City of Osage Beach's sports fields, courts, pavilions, and other park facilities (pavilions and softball/ baseball and soccer fields) at all City Parks both Peanick Park and the Osage Beach City Park are available for reservation by the public when not otherwise scheduled.

- (1) Reservations.
  - a. Reservation procedures.
    - (1) Reservations for park facilities may be made throughout the year based on availability. The Parks and Recreation Department must approve all reservations.
    - (2) Reservations shall be made online through the City's website or by

contacting the Parks and Recreation Department. by submitting a park use application for permit prior to the event by fax, e-mail, postal mail, or in person at the City of Osage Beach—City Hall, Parks and Recreation Department, 1000 City Parkway, Osage Beach, Missouri, 65065, during normal business hours, excluding legal holidays.

- (3) Reservations requested the day of the event may be taken at the discretion of the Parks and Recreation Department.
- (4) Basic Field reservations do not include field preparation or and field lights but are available for an additional fee as needed.
- b. *Inclement weather*. The City's Parks and Recreation Department will determine field playability. In the event inclement weather occurs after the Parks and Recreation Department's business hours, the applicant will be responsible for determining if the event occurs or is canceled.
  - (1) If an event is canceled prior to starting due to inclement weather, user fees will be reimbursed in full.
  - (2) If an event is shortened due to inclement weather, user fees will be charged based on time used.
- c. *Maintenance schedule.* 
  - (1) All sports fields may be closed for maintenance starting December February and periodically throughout the year for routine maintenance.
  - (2) The Parks and Recreation Department shall make available to the public dates and times of park closings. However, if determined by the Parks and Recreation Department, dates and times of scheduled park closings change, reservations shall resume and shall be made on a first come, first serve basis.

#### 2. User fees.

a. Fee schedule — All City Parks Peanick Park and Osage Beach City Park. Fees for park services shall be contained in the Osage Beach Parks Fee Schedule, a copy of which shall be maintained by the City Clerk. This schedule may be updated from time to time with the approval of the City Administrator. The City Administrator shall provide copies of all changes to the Fee Schedule to the Board and Mayor at least twenty (20) business days prior to implementing such changes.

# b. Payments and deposits.

- (1) Park user fees shall be paid upon reservation of the prior to event. The City reserves the right to request a non-refundable security deposit if deemed necessary by the City.
- (2) A minimum vendor fee of fifteen dollars (\$15.00) shall be paid prior to the event.
- (3) Other applicable fees determined to be owed by the applicant at the conclusion of the event may be invoiced and paid within ten (10) days from the event date, if agreed to by the City.
- c. *Modifications and refunds.* 
  - (1) Applicants may cancel reservations no less than forty-eight (48) hours prior to reserved date to receive full refund, otherwise no refund or credit will be given.
  - (2) Applicants may modify reservations forty-eight (48) hours prior to reserved date to receive any refund or credit due. Any additional user fees due to the City shall be paid at the time of modification. The Parks and Recreation Department must approve all modifications.
  - (3) Cancellations and modifications shall be made by phone, email, postal mail or in person at the City of Osage Beach City Hall, Parks and Recreation Department, 1000 City Parkway, Osage Beach, Missouri, 65065, during normal business hours, excluding legal holidays.
  - (4) The City reserves the right to postpone, cancel or delay any activity on City property.

- d. Use terms of agreement.
  - (1) Reservations are only for designated area/facility requested permitted and limited to activity listed. Use of other areas/facilities not listed on the reservation permit may result in user fees assessed and may be grounds for immediate removal from City property.
  - (2) Reservations requiring the use of scoreboards and/or locked facilities after business hours may require a deposit by the permitted applicant. The permitted applicant shall be responsible for turning on and turning off all scoreboards and unlocking and locking the appropriate facilities under their care.
  - (3) Admission fees shall not be charged to the general public to any City facility for any event without prior approval from the City. Vendor fees apply as set forth in 245.040(A)(2).
  - (4) It is unlawful for any material such as sand, dirt or other substances to be added or taken off any sports fields at any time. All sports field preparation shall be done by the Parks and Recreation Department. The Parks and Recreation Department may authorize field preparation by permitted event applicants.
  - (5) Large tTents, awnings, canopies and temporary structures or fences are not allowed without prior approval in writing by the Parks and Recreation Department. Small shade tents are permitted during sports games in non-prohibited areas.
  - (6) Applicant shall be is responsible for cleaning, trash disposal and any repairs necessary as a result of the event.
  - (7) The City reserves the right to cancel or revoke any reservations permit at its discretion.
  - (8) Applicant shall agrees to indemnify and hold harmless the City of Osage Beach, its employees and agents for all liability claims arising out of the event.
  - (9) The City reserves the right to request a certificate of insurance showing the City as additional insured with specific liability coverage as deemed necessary by the City.
  - (10) Applicant shall agrees to comply with all City codes, applicable laws, regulations and orders of the City Administrator.

## Section 245.050. Vending and Concessions.

A. No business or individual shall sell or offer for sale, any food or beverage in any City park unless permitted by the City. No business or individual shall sell or offer for sale, merchandise or service, including admissions or other like service, in any City park or on any City property without an approved vendor permit from the City.

1. The City shall manage park concessions and has the first right to sell or offer for sale, any food or beverage in any City facility, area/location, at various dates and times, and may provide vending services within the City parks. Event organizers/individuals may request authorization from the City for vendor rights to sell or offer for sale, any

merchandise, admission fees, food, beverage or service, in any City park facility, arealocation, at various dates and times within the parks.

#### 2. Vendors.

- a. Permitted events requesting vendor rights within the City parks, included, but not limited to, merchandise, food and beverage items, and admissions, must submit a vendor application, for prior approval by the City.
  - b. Permitted events with authorized vendor concession rights shall obtain all necessary licenses, permits and insurance and shall comply with all City codes, applicable laws and regulations by Federal, State or local governmental agencies and the park rules and regulations of the City.
- c. A minimum vendor fee of fifteen dollars (\$15.00) shall be paid prior to the event. A total vendor fee of fifteen dollars (\$15.00) or three percent (3%) of gross sales (whichever is greater) shall be charged to each applicant for each permitted event with authorized vendor use. Vendor fees determined to be owed by the applicant at the conclusion of the event may be invoiced and paid within ten (10) days from the event date.

# Section 2. Severability

The chapters, sections, paragraphs, sentences, clauses and phrases of this ordinance are severable, and if any phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph or section of this ordinance shall be declared unconstitutional or otherwise invalid by the valid judgment or degree of any Court of any competent jurisdiction, such unconstitutionality or invalidity shall not affect any of the remaining phrases, clauses, sentences, paragraphs, or sections of this ordinance since the same would have been enacted by the Board of Aldermen without the incorporation in this ordinance of any such unconstitutional or invalid phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph or section.

# Section 3. Repeal of Ordinances not to affect liabilities, etc.

Whenever any part of this ordinance shall be repealed or modified, either expressly or by implication, by a subsequent ordinance, that part of the ordinance thus repealed or modified shall continue in force until the subsequent ordinance repealing or modifying the ordinance shall go into effect unless therein otherwise expressly provided; but no suit, prosecution, proceeding, right, fine or penalty instituted, created, given, secured or accrued under this ordinance previous to its repeal shall not be affected, released or discharged but may be prosecuted, enjoined and recovered as fully as if this ordinance or provisions had continued in force, unless it shall be therein otherwise expressly provided.

<u>Section 4</u>. That this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after the date of passage and approval of the Mayor.



AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF OSAGE BEACH, MISSOURI, REPEALING CHAPTER 625 MASSGAE ESTABLISHMENTS ARTICLE I IN GENERAL, ARTICLE II BUSINESS LICENSES, ARTICLE III MASSAGE THERAPIST PERMIT AS SET FORTH.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE CITY OF OSAGE BEACH, MISSOURI AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1.</u> Within the City Code there are hereby enacted new Sections with material repealed by deleted material struck as follows:

#### In General

#### Section 625.010. Definitions.

The following words, terms and phrases, when used in this Chapter, shall have the meanings ascribed to them in this Section, except where the context clearly indicates a different meaning:

EMPLOYEE — Any and all persons, other than the massage therapists, who render any service to the permittee, who received compensation directly from the permittee, and who have no physical contact with the customers or clients

MASSAGE ESTABLISHMENT — Any establishment having a fixed place of business where any person, firm, association or corporation engages in or carries on or permits to be engaged in or carried on any of the activities mentioned in this Chapter.

MASSAGE THERAPIST — Any person licensed by the State of Missouri as a massage therapist who, for any consideration whatsoever, engages in the practice of massage

RECOGNIZED SCHOOL — Any school or educational institution licensed to do business as a school or educational institution and which is accredited by the American Massage and Therapy Association, Inc., and which has for its purpose the teaching of the theory, method, profession, or work of massage, which school requires a resident course of study not less than three (3) months before the student shall be furnished with a diploma or certificate of graduation from such school or institution of learning following the successful completion of such course of study of learning.

Section 625.020. Exceptions.

This Chapter shall not apply to physical therapists or athletic trainers regulated under Chapter 334, RSMo., Missouri State licensed massage therapists and those professions who perform duties with licensed massage therapists as regulated by Chapter 324, RSMo., hospitals, nursing homes, sanitariums, or persons holding an unrevoked certificate to practice their healing arts under State law, or to persons working under the direction of any such persons or in any such establishments.

#### Section 625.030. Rules Authorized.

The Police Chief or the Building Official or their designee may, after a public hearing, make and enforce reasonable rules and regulations not in conflict with, but to carry out, the intent of this Chapter.

#### Section 625.040. Inspections.

The Police Chief or the Building Official or their designee shall from time to time and at least once a year make an inspection of each massage establishment in the City for the purposes of determining that the provisions of this Chapter are complied with. Such inspections shall be made at reasonable times and in a reasonable manner. It shall be unlawful for any permittee to fail to allow such inspection officer access to the premises or to hinder such officer in any manner.

#### Section 625.050. Facilities Necessary.

No license to operate a massage establishment shall be issued unless an inspection by the building official reveals that the establishment complies with each of the following minimum requirements:

- 1. Construction of rooms for toilets, tubs, steam baths and showers. Construction of rooms used for toilets, tubs, steam baths and showers shall be made waterproof with approved waterproofed materials and shall be installed in accordance with the City Plumbing Code:
  - a. Steam rooms and shower compartments shall have waterproof floors, walls and ceilings and shall be provided with ventilation/exhaust as per the adopted International Mechanical Code.
  - b. Floors of wet and dry heat rooms shall be adequately pitched to one (1) or more floor drains properly connected to the sewer. Dry heat rooms with wooden floors need not be provided with pitched floors and floor drains.
  - c. A source of hot water must be available within the immediate vicinity of dry and wet heat rooms to facilitate cleaning.
- Disinfecting and sterilizing equipment. The premises shall have adequate equipment for disinfecting and sterilizing non-disposable instruments and materials used in administering massages. Such non-disposable instruments and materials shall be disinfected after use on each patron.
- 3. Closed storage areas. Closed cabinets shall be provided and used for the storage of clean linen, towels and other materials used in connection with administering massages. All soiled linens, towels and other materials shall be kept in properly covered containers or cabinets, which containers or cabinets shall be kept separate from the clean storage areas.
- 4. Toilet facilities. Toilet facilities shall be provided in convenient locations. When employees and patrons of different sexes are on the premises at the same time separate toilet facilities shall be provided for each sex. A single water closet per sex shall be provided when the total occupant load for the establishment exceeds fifteen (15) occupants, as per the adopted International Plumbing Code.
- 5. Lavatories or washbasins. Lavatories or washbasins provided with both hot and cold running water shall be installed in either the toilet room or a vestibule. Lavatories or washbasins shall be provided with soap and a dispenser and with sanitary towels.
- 6. *Electrical equipment*. All electrical equipment shall be installed in accordance with the requirements of the National Electrical Code.

The Building Official or his/her designee shall certify whether a proposed massage establishment complies with this Section and shall forward such certification to the Police Chief.

Section 625.060. General Operating Requirements.

- A. Every portion of a massage establishment, including appliances, apparatus, and personnel shall be kept clean and operated in a sanitary condition.
- B. All employees shall be clean and wear clean outer garments whose use is restricted to the massage establishment. Provisions for a separate dressing room for each sex must be available on the premises with individual lockers for each employee. Doors to such dressing rooms shall open inward and shall be self-closing.
- C. All employees must be modestly attired.
- D. Towels, cloths, or undergarments must cover the private parts of patrons, when in the presence of an employee. Any contact with a patron's genital area is prohibited.
- E. All massage establishments shall be provided with clean, laundered sheets and towels in sufficient quantity and the sheets and towels shall be laundered after each use thereof and stored in approved, sanitary manner.
- F. Wet and dry heat rooms, shower compartments, and toilet rooms shall be thoroughly cleaned each day the business is in operation. Bathtubs shall be thoroughly cleaned after each use.
- G. Advertising. No massage establishment granted a permit under provisions of this Chapter shall place, publish, or distribute or cause to be placed, published, or distributed any advertising matter that depicts any portion of the human body that would reasonably suggest to prospective patrons that any service is available other than massage services, nor shall any massage establishment indicate in the text of such advertising that any service is available other than massage services.
- H. All massage services must be carried on in one (1) cubicle, room, booth, or area within the massage establishment. No massage service shall be carried on in any other cubicle, room, booth, or area except where such cubicle, room, booth, or area has transparent doors or walls, such that all activity within the cubicle, room, booth, or area is visible from outside the same.
- I. The facility shall be closed and operations shall cease between the hours of 12:00 Midnight and 6:00 A.M. each day.

#### **ARTICLE II**

Business Licenses<sup>1</sup>

# Section 625.070. Required.

It shall be unlawful for any person to engage in, conduct or carry on or to permit to be engaged in, conducted or carried on, in or upon any premises in the City, the operation of a massage establishment without first having obtained a business license from the City Clerk.

Section 625.080. Application. The application for a business license to operate a massage establishment shall set forth the exact nature of the massage to be administered, the proposed place of business and facilities therein and the name and address of each applicant. In addition to the foregoing, each applicant for a permit shall furnish the following information:

- 1. Written proof that the applicant is at least eighteen (18) years of age.
- 2. Two (2) portrait photographs at least two (2) inches by two (2) inches, and fingerprints.
- 3. Business, occupation, or employment of the applicant for the three (3) years immediately proceeding the date of application.
- 4. The massage or similar business license history of the applicant; whether such person, in previously operating in this or another City or State under license, has had such license revoked or suspended, the reason therefor, and the business activity or occupation subsequent to such action of suspension or revocation.
- 5. Any criminal convictions, except minor traffic violations.
- 6. Criminal background performed by Missouri Highway Patrol.
- B. A non-refundable filing fee of fifteen dollars (\$15.00) shall accompany the application.

#### Section 625.090. Notice of Hearing

When an application is filed for a business license for a massage establishment the Police Chief shall fix a time and place for a public hearing when applicant may present evidence upon the question of his/her application. Not less than ten (10) days before the date of such hearing, the Police Chief shall cause to be posted a notice of such hearing in a conspicuous place on the property in which or on which the proposed massage establishment is to be operated. The applicant shall maintain the notice as posted for a required number of days.

#### Section 625.100. Issuance.

1. Cross Reference — Occupational license taxes, §605.010 et seq.

- A. The City Clerk shall not issue a business license to a massage establishment without the approval of the Police Chief.
- B. The Police Chief shall approve the issuance of the license within fourteen (14) days following a hearing if all requirements for a massage establishment described in this Chapter are met unless he/she finds:
  - 1. The operation as proposed by the application if permitted will not have complied with all applicable laws and ordinances.
  - 2. The applicant and any other person who will be directly engaged in the management and operation of a massage establishment has been convicted of:
    - a. A felony; or
    - b. Any offense involving sexual misconduct.

The Police Chief may approve the issuance of a business license to any person convicted of any of the above crimes if he/she finds that such conviction occurred at least three (3) years prior to the date of the application and the applicant has had no subsequent convictions.

3. The issuance is contrary to the public health, safety, and welfare.

Section 625.110. Fee Term.

The City Clerk shall not issue a business license for a massage establishment until a license fee of three hundred dollars (\$300.00) is paid to the City.

A. Massage establishment business licenses shall expire on June thirtieth (30th) of each year.

Section 625.120. Revocation or Suspension.

A massage establishment business license may be revoked or suspended by the Police Chief if:

- 1. The licensee violates any of the provisions of this Chapter;
- 2. The licensee is convicted of an offense enumerated in Section 625.100(B);
- 3. A massage therapist working in the establishment is convicted of an offense enumerated in Section 625.100(B) and the licensee has actual or constructive knowledge of the violation or conviction; or
- 4. Where the licensee or a person in his/her employ refuses to permit any duly authorized City officer or employee to inspect the licensed premises.
- B. Before revoking or suspending a license the Police Chief shall give the licensee at least ten (10) days' written notice of the charges against him/her and an opportunity for a public hearing before the Police Chief, at which hearing the licensee may present evidence on his/her own behalf. All charges shall be specific and in writing.

Section 625.130. Transfer.

No massage establishment business license shall be transferable without the written consent of the Police Chief and the approval of the Building Official; provided, however, that upon the death or incapacity of the licensee the massage establishment may continue in business for a reasonable period of time to allow for an orderly transfer of the license.

### ARTICLE III

Massage Therapist Permit<sup>2</sup>

Section 625.140. Required.

No person shall act as massage therapist without valid massage therapy license issued by the State of Missouri.

Section 625.150. Application.

An application for the permit required by this Article shall be made to the Police Chief upon a form provided by the City Clerk.

- A. The application for a permit shall contain the following:
  - 1. The applicant's name and residence address.
  - 2. The applicant's social security number.
  - 3. The applicant's weight, height, color of hair and eyes, and fingerprints.
  - 4. Written evidence that the applicant is at least eighteen (18) years of age.
  - 5. The business, occupation, or employment of the applicant for three (3) years immediately proceeding the date of application.
  - 6. Whether such person has ever been convicted of any crime except minor traffic violations. If such person has been so convicted, a statement must be made giving the place and court in which the conviction was obtained and the sentence imposed as a result of such conviction.
- B. Applicants for a massage therapist permit may substitute one (1) year's continuous experience as a massage therapist in lieu of the requirement of a diploma or certificate of graduation from a recognized school or other institution of learning wherein the method and work of massage is taught. Such massage therapist must obtain an affidavit attesting to such experience occurred. If after diligent effort the massage therapist is unable to obtain an affidavit from the owner, such massage therapist may submit an affidavit from a person who had firsthand knowledge of his/her continuous year of experience. Said affidavit subject to approval and acceptance of the proper authority of the City of Osage Beach.
- C. Applicant for massage therapist permit may substitute a certificate from the American Massage and Therapy Association in lieu of the requirements of Subsection (C).

Section 625.160. Fee.

A fee of twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) shall be paid to the City at the time of making application

for the permit required by the provisions of the Article. The permit shall not be issued unless the fee is paid, and the fee shall not be refunded if the permit is denied.

### Section 625.170. Issuance.

- A. The Police Chief may instruct the City Clerk to issue a permit within twenty-one (21) days following application, unless he/she finds that:
  - 1. The applicant under this Article has been convicted of a felony or any offense involving sexual misconduct. The Police Chief may instruct the City Clerk to issue a permit to a person convicted of any of these crimes if he/she finds that such conviction occurred at least five (5) years prior to the date of the application and the applicant has not had subsequent convictions.
  - 2. The issuance of the permit would be contrary to the public health, safety or welfare.

### Section 625.180. Revocation or Suspension.

- A. A permit issued under this Article by the Police Chief shall be revoked or suspended after a public hearing before the Police Chief where it appears that the massage therapist has been convicted of any offenses enumerated in Section 625.100(B).
- B. The Police Chief, before revoking or suspending any massage therapist permit, shall give the massage therapist at least ten (10) days' written notice of the examination into his/her conviction record and the opportunity for a public hearing before the Police Chief, at which hearing the Police Chief shall determine the relevant facts regarding the occurrence of the conviction.

<u>Section 1</u>. That the section entitled Osage Beach amendments as set forth below with new material set out in **RED** and deleted material struck as follows:

### Section 610.170. Additional Requirements For Food Trucks.

- A. Any person operating a food truck:
  - 1. Shall not operate within City limits without a merchant's license as required by Section 605.020 of this Code.
  - 2. Shall not set up and remain in a fixed location unless all requirements of the Zoning Code of the City have been met.
  - 3. Shall not operate within two hundred (200) feet of any bar, restaurant, or outdoor dining area as those terms are defined in Section 405.020 of this Code, without the written consent of such bar, restaurant, or outdoor dining area, unless operating on the property of an existing bar or restaurant with the permission of the owner or other person in rightful control of the property (such as a lessee). Such distance shall be measured between the food truck and the nearest edge of the other structure (including walls, awnings, patios, decks, stairs, or any like improvements).
  - 3 Shall not stand, walk or loiter on the roadway or in any other manner stall, delay or obstruct the normal flow of traffic.
  - 4. Shall not operate in such a manner as to cause grease or other waste to flow into private or public sewers, or otherwise violate the requirements of Section 710.280 of this Code regarding prohibited discharges.
  - 5. Shall not fail to provide means for the food truck and its customers to dispose of trash and other solid waste in a sanitary and safe manner, or to fail to collect and dispose of solid waste attributable to the food truck, or to otherwise violate Section 215.060 of this Code.
  - 6. Shall comply with all applicable Federal, State, and local laws regarding food service and food safety, including, but not limited to, the Missouri Food Code as stated in 19 C.S.R. § 20-1.025 Sanitation of Food Establishments.
  - 7. Shall comply with all requirements and instructions of the Health Departments of Camden and/or Miller Counties (as appropriate).

<u>Section 1.</u> Within the City Code there are hereby enacted new Sections with material repealed and replacing set forth below with new material set out in **RED** and deleted material struck as follows:

### Section 125.240. Other Employee Benefits.

### A. Insurance.

- 1. The City provides the following insurance benefits to the Mayor, Board of Aldermen, and full-time employees without cost: health (covers the cost of enrollment in the lowest cost plan offered or the equivalent of its value applied toward a higher level plan), short-term disability, and group life. Health, dental, and life insurance coverage for dependents of full-time employees is optional to the employee. The City will provide a portion of the cost of dependent coverage. Dental and vision insurance coverage is offered to employees and dependents.
- 2. Full-time Health benefit eligible employees who can provide proof of coverage from another health insurance program may opt out of participating in the City's health insurance program. The City will provide an incentive in the amount of forty percent (40%) of the cost of single employee-only coverage in the lowest cost health plan plus the amount of City funded, employee-only HSA contributions to employees who qualify for the opt-out program. Payments shall be spread evenly over the pay periods in a calendar year. If an employee is no longer an employee of the City, payments cease and the employee has no right to any amounts not paid in the calendar year.
- B. Cafeteria Plan. Employees may take advantage of reducing their taxable income through utilization of the cafeteria plan. Additional supplemental insurance policies, such as cancer, accident, and intensive care are available and premium amounts for these and dependent medical are deducted from gross income prior to income tax deductions.

### C. Retirement Plans.

- 1. Effective January 1, 2025, The City will provide the Mayor, Board of Aldermen, and full-time employees six seven percent (67%) of gross wages under Section 401A of the Internal Revenue Service Code into the employee's account. The City will provide up to an additional three percent (3%) match contribution of gross wages under Section 401A of the Internal Revenue Service Code into the employee's account upon the employee's contribution of up to three percent (3%), which may be in one-half percent (0.5%) increments. There is a five-year vesting period. Employees should contact the Human Resources Generalist for detailed information.
- 2. *Deferred compensation*. All employees and elected officials may elect to participate in a deferred compensation program offered by the City. The City will not participate monetarily in this program.
